

Following LCRA Increase —

Council Ups Electric Rate \$1.25 Monthly

The City Council of Goldthwaite voted unanimously to increase the minimum charge for electricity from \$1.25 to \$2.50. City Manager Dale Allen was instructed to draw an ordinance which will effect the increase. It was pointed out that very few minimum users of electricity are billed. Most all use over the 15 kilowatt hour minimum.

The increase, made necessary because of a slight increase in the wholesale rate charged the city by the Lower Colorado River Authority (LCRA), will probably be into effect next month. The Public Utilities Commission of Texas granted LCRA the increase of some \$1 million over the whole system. LCRA had originally asked for over \$14 in increases. The LCRA increase will average some \$1000 per month.

The new rate from LCRA, and the increase as passed on to customers by the City, will in no way affect the amount of the fuel charge that is levied monthly.

M. A. Campbell spoke to council regarding this matter, and indicated that he felt many of the citizens did not realize that the fuel charge was a direct-pass through from LCRA which does not benefit the City of Goldthwaite in any way. Campbell asked the council to attempt to project the increase together with fuel charges and determine a city-wide rate that would be consistent for the next year. This would allow citizens to better plan their budgets at home, and, to some degree, maintain a better balance between use and cost. Mayor J. D. Harper explained that the base electricity rate charged by the city has not changed since 1973, and that the fuel charge which is collected by the City Utilities is forwarded directly to LCRA to pay the assessment for additional electricity cost due to added fuel charges that LCRA has had to pay.

It was the consensus of the council that this "pass through fuel charge" was the most fair to the citizens of Goldthwaite, because it represents the actual charge the city pays for that particular commodity each month. Furthermore, any projection to the fuel charge from LCRA would require the highest anticipated average cost to the citizen because there is no means of contracting the fuel charge with the electrical rate.

The fuel charge is too variable to provide a manageable average. The Council felt that the result would be an overpayment of fuel charge or an additional assessment to the user

because the estimate was below actual cost to the city.

RECORD BILLING

City Manager Allen reported that the July billing of the City was a record figure. Paced by \$61,134.18 in the electrical department, the billing far out-distanced any previous month's total.

Water charges to customers was \$18,665, sewer was \$2,256 and garbage was \$1,820. The total was \$83,877.

The more than twenty days of 100 plus degree temperatures, coupled with the acute drought conditions were the primary reasons for the increase. The city has, however, added quite a few new customers in the past year.

The council discussed the water supply and the need for additional wells to supplement the river system. It was noted that a malfunction of the river pump had caused concern of low water supply in the reservoir and lack of a back-up pump.

Back up systems at both the reservoirs and at the filter plant were discussed and the CM was asked to get prices for the back up pumps and motors.

The two wells recently placed in operation are providing 115 gallons per minute of water to the system. After further discussion, Councilman Frank Bridges moved that the council authorize a test drilling for well number 4 and proceed with the casing of well number 3. The motion carried unanimously.

NEW GARBAGE TRUCK

The city's new garbage truck is in full operation and is delivering adequate service. The new \$20,000 facility can handle loads of approximately two times as great as before.

The plastic bag system has not been okayed as yet, because of insufficient information on their price and availability.

The Texas Air Control Board has stated that the time is approaching when burning at the land fill area will not be permitted, and, even now, is highly restricted and the council authorized CM Allen to seek an extension to the current permit for the use of the land fill. Trash burn and coverage procedures will be outlined in the extension order.

Dee Harris and Dorothy Shelton were in attendance at the meeting regarding a memorial fund for Samantha Luce. Mrs. Harris stated that a memorial fund had been established for the purchase

of playground equipment for the Mills County Park. Funds are to be collected at the (See CITY, Page 8)

Lake Brownwood nearly reached its spillway level also.

Central Texas areas made national news daily for a week because of flooding conditions. They have caused much property damage and approximately 25 deaths

have been attributed to the high waters.

The onslaught of rain was the result of hurricane Amelia on the Gulf Coast.

going on near the nest. Pastures which have been mowed or grazed short won't be suitable for nesting. Fencing, which provides protection from overgrazing, will rejuvenate cover and increase nesting.

Though hunting season may seem far away, it's not too soon to begin planning for quail. And summer is a good time to increase your chances with birds by improving their cover.

As most quail hunters know, quail are found in areas with a good mixture of grass, weeds and woody vegetation. This cover is frequently provided by clumps of blackberry, wild rose, yaupon, cedar, plum, young pine, privet, sassafras and sumac.

But when such cover isn't found naturally, it can be constructed. A brush shelter can be built by half-cutting a tree about 12 ft. tall and bending it until the top rests on the ground. Then brush and logs are piled on the half-cut trunk until a thick covering is provided.

Trees covered with grapevine or greenbrier can be half-cut so they will continue to live, and pushed over similar to the brush shelters. The purpose in half-cutting trees is to put the tops close to the ground, yet encourage continued growth.

Covey like to loaf, dust, and move about freely under woody cover which protects them from above. Locate the cover on well-drained ground. Although live vegetation is more durable, artificial cover can be used in grassland devoid of suitable wood plants. Construct shelters of poles, boards, or heavy brush so that the roof is about eight inches above the ground. Space poles or boards in the roof about two to three inches apart. Overall size of the structure should be about 6 to 8 feet square.

Nesting area for quail should be well drained with six to eight inch high grass for their nests, which are constructed on the ground. Quail seem to want a place where they can see what is

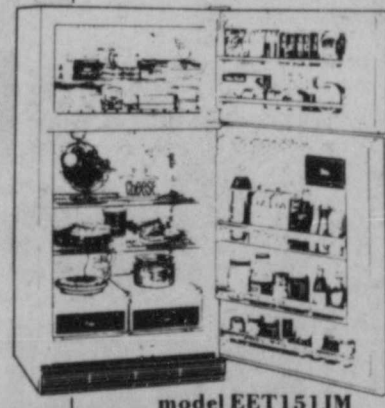

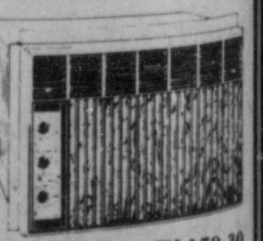
