



Researchers say about three of every four shoppers use the simple "cents-off" coupons for savings at retail grocery markets.

They use coupons mostly with processed foods, household products and beauty

COUPON SOURCES More than half of all coupons appear in news-

Another 17 percent are in Sunday newspaper supplements, and 15 percent are in magazines.

Those most used come from inside packages and from direct mail.

REFUNDS Manufacturers say that only 27 percent of all households send in for refunds -- with such "nuisances" as saving packages or filling out forms.

However, some people call themselves 'refunders' and they make a hobby of this activity-the receiving of money for their "trouble"

> GUIDELINES FOR REFUNDS

For consumers who want to "try their hands" at

mail refunds, here are two guidelines:

-Save every label you can scrounge up--then be careful to send in the correct portion






