### **IRS** Information

Employers must now file ted we still have books. Forms W-2 and W-2P with tration, and NOT with the Internal Revenue Service, the IRS said. Deadline for filing these forms is February 28, 1979.

The 1978 W-2 and W-2P forms are different from the 1977 forms. It is important that the proper tax year W-2 and W-2P are used.

Under the new procedure. the forms will be processed by the SSA, which will then man - Mrs. Woodrow furnish the IRS with all data (including income tax data) on the forms.

For reporting to SSA. employers must remember to attach Form W-3. "Transmittal of Income and Tax Statements", with Copies A of Forms W-2 and W-2P.

Employers are ugred to use the pre-addressed labels sent to them with the mailout of Publication 393, "Federal Employment Tax Forms.'

For additional information, IRS Publication 15, "Circular E -- Employer's Tax Guide" is available free from local IRS offices.

Ford thoroughbred horse shied and fell off the dam on the deep side.

Boy it was a rough ride, I got in a heck of a shape. My spurs hung up in the safety belts, I was sitting on my hot shot buzzer which was on. Man that was rough. I finally got the door open, got my spurs loose, slid off the hot shot by the help of safety belts and slid out of the pickup. I finally figured out what them belts was for. Slid out bottom door, the ice was cold and slippery; I couldn't climb out of the creek. Reached and got my deer rifle which had fallen out. Used it for a crutch and finally got out of the creek.

I looked back at my ole Ford thoroughbred horse. Just couldn't shoot the old horse. His eyes was looking down on them rocks, his mouth was pulled way over to the left and he looked dead already.
