## Goldthwaite ISD Board Amends Policy For Students

The Goldthwaite Independent School Board met Monday, August 6, 1979, at 6:30 p.m., with the following members present - Elam Miles, president, Dr. Douglas Dennis, James Reese, Carroll Berry, Wendell Tucker, Bobby Wilcox, and Gary Holcomb.

The policy concerning students traveling to and from school activities was amended by the Board. Students must still ride the bus unless they are with a parent, or unless the parent gives verbal confirmation to the sponsor (before the event) for the student to ride with some other responsible adult.

The Board acted on the following items on the agenda.

- Voted to join the Texas School Board Association.
- Voted to accept the bid of Lydick Roofing Co. to repair hail damaged roofs.
- Voted to accept the resignation of Mrs. Tomlinson as a cook. They hired Mrs. Hesley to replace Mrs.

Tomlinson.

- The Board accepted the resignation of Mary Coffman as a teacher. And after considering all the applications of teachers heretofore turned in, the Board employed Mrs. Sue Schriver. Mrs. Sarah Rudd was hired as a Title I Aide.
- The bid of Mrs. Pat Winchell for laundry services was accepted by the board.
- Accepted Foremost, James B. Harkey dealer, for milk for the next year.
- The bid of National Linen Service was accepted

for the mop service for the next year.

- The Board approved the 1979-1980 School Budget, and amended the 1978-79 Budget.
- Accepted Frazier Bros. bid for gasoline for the coming year.

It was also discussed and decided that the football tickets for the upcoming season will be \$2.50 per game for adults. Reserve seats for five (5) home games will be \$12.50. Student tickets will remain unchanged.

## Four Face Theft Charges Here

Two San Antonio couples were charged with Class A theft, a misdemeanor, here last Thursday following the taking of bed clothing from Hereford Motel of Goldthwaite.

The four were registered at the motel Wednesday night, and the merchandise was noticed missing during the morning cleanup. Taken were sheets, pillow cases, and blankets. The bedspreads were neatly replaced over the mattress and pillows, in an apparent attempt to camouflage the robbery.

The value of the items was less than \$200, hence the misdemeanor charges.

# Lone Star Requests New City Gate Rate

Lone Star Gas Co. filed an application with the Texas Railroad Commission Wednesday seeking to increase its authorized city gate rate to \$2.21 per Mcf (thousand cubic feet) of gas—a 15% increase in the city gate rate in effect December 1978. If the request is granted, the company would realize an additional \$40.9 million in revenue annually.

"The increase is necessary," says Douglas W. Williams, senior vice president of Lone Star, "because of the sharply higher costs of buying gas in the field and the increase in the general costs associated with operating any business." The city gate rate is the amount Lone Star Transmission Division charges the company's Distribution Divi-

sion for gas delivered to residential and commercial customers and for distribution company-used and unaccounted-for gas. Transmission is the segment of the company that buys, cleans, stores and delivers gas to the cities. The increase, based on the city gate rate in effect last December, is 29 cents per Mcf. The average residential customer's bill

would increase approximately \$28 per year. Lone Star's current city gate rate, established by the Railroad Commission in 1977 and based on a test year ending December 1975, allows Lone Star to recover only 85% of the increase in gas costs above \$1.1802. As part of the application filed Wednesday, Lone Star is again requesting a 100% flow-through of gas purchase

expense consistent with the rule-making request presently pending before the Railroad Commission. "As a result of the 85% flow-through restriction, Lone Star absorbed approximately \$1.3 million in gas costs in 1978 alone," Williams says. The proposed rate increase will only affect residential and commercial customers.

**Scott Thompson, Goldthwaite**  
**Pioneer, Buried Here**

Scott Thompson, one of Goldthwaite's earliest settlers, passed away August 2, 1979 at the age of 97 years, 21 days.

Garrett Lane Scott Thompson was born in Grimes County, Texas, July 12, 1882, the third son of William H. and Mary Lacy Thompson.

In the fall of 1885, when Goldthwaite was first being laid out as a town, Scott's father, W. H. Thompson, came to Goldthwaite and purchased property. In February 1886, Mr. W. H. Thompson moved his family to Goldthwaite, which included Eugene, Lacy, Scott and their mother. He later established the first newspaper, "The Mountaineer", forerunner of the Goldthwaite Eagle.

In addition to the three boys, Mr. and Mrs. Thompson had four girls after moving to Goldthwaite - Lida, Annie, Maidee and Willie - all were reared in Goldthwaite.

Scott Thompson married Mayme Campbell October 9, 1909 and from this union, three children were born - Helen, Campbell and Lacy. Scott and his family farmed in the Big Valley community from 1918 to 1942. In addition, Scott was active in the grocery business most

of his life. A host of friends remember him best for his grocery work. He was always helpful, had a cheerful word for everyone. (all friends and no enemies).

Scott was preceded in death by his wife Mayme in 1952.

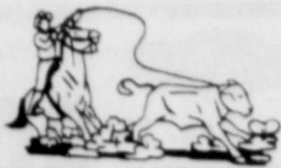

Beef Supplies Offset By Pork, Poultry

AUSTIN—Smaller supplies of choice beef expected in the coming months will likely be accompanied by a decrease in retail prices, according to Agriculture Commissioner Reagan V. Brown.

"In fact, beef prices are expected to remain steady or even decline throughout the fall, as normal market forces take their course," he said. "It

"The latest report shows that the number of cattle being fattened for slaughter in Texas during July was down six percent from a year ago, and this will mean fewer animals moving to market in the months ahead," Brown said. "But higher pork and poultry production has taken up some of the slack and will help temper any price increases that might be expected due to the reduced

### Bureau Of Census Survey Here Aug. 20-24

Local representatives of the Bureau of the Census will conduct a survey of employment in Mills County during the work week of August 20 - 24, 1979. Percy R. Millard, Director of the Bureau's Regional Office in Dallas, announced today.

The survey is conducted for the U. S. Department of Labor in a scientifically designed sample of approximately 76,000 households throughout the United States. For example, in June the survey indicated that the 102.5 million men and women in the civilian labor force, 96.8 million were employed. The Nation's unemployment rate was 5.6 percent; it has been in the
