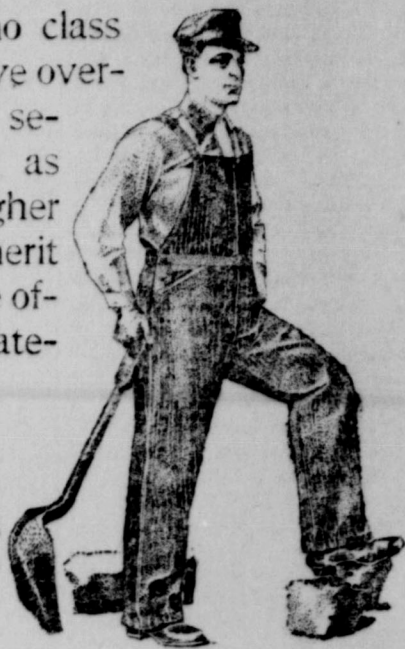

Should Be a Panhandle Industry.

The raising of hogs for market in Texas continues to be an attractive proposition. Two years ago packing hogs of the better class were selling on the Fort Worth market at \$4.70 to \$4.80; one year ago from \$5.20 to \$5.30; the last week the price of top hogs ranged from \$6.32 to \$6.45. A market showing a betterment of 50 per cent in two years is worth considering by every Texas man whose interests and inclinations lie in the direction of raising livestock as a commercial proposition. It may be said that present prices cannot prevail for long; that the market may take a fall, but market indications do not favor this view. Two years ago hogs advanced from \$4.70 in May to \$5.80 in September and October. One year ago the May price was well maintained and somewhat strengthened by the markets in September and October following, so that there is reason to believe that under normal conditions the course of the hog market will be upward instead of downward for the next five months.—Fort Worth Record.

President Roosevelt Pays Homage to Memory of Valiant Dead.

No Other Men Deserve so Well of This Country as Those to Whom We Owe Its Existence. Portsmouth, Va.—The Decoration day ceremonies here were conducted by the Army and Navy union and were the most elaborate and impressive held in recent years.

This day is hallowed and sacred in our history, for on this day throughout the land we meet to pay homage to the memory of the valiant dead who fell in the great civil war. No other men deserve so well of this country as those to whom we owe it that we now have a country.

Rate Bill Conference Meets Promptly.

Washington, D. C.—Ten minutes after the senate conference on the rate bill were appointed Monday Chairman Ellinger called a meeting of the joint conference and the memory of the great deeds and the self-devotion alike of the men who wore the blue and of the men who wore the gray in the contest where brother fought brother with equal courage, with equal sincerity of conviction, with equal fidelity to a high ideal, as it was given to each to see that ideal.

Providing Penalty for Leaks.

Washington, D. C.—Senator Culbertson was Monday authorized by the committee on the judiciary to report favorably his bill making it a felony for an officer or employee of the government to impart any information in advance of the time fixed by law or department rules which might affect the market value of any product of the soil. Such an offense is made punishable by imprisonment for not more than ten years and fine not exceeding \$10,000.

Avoiding the "Immunity Bath."

Washington, D. C.—During the course of a speech which Mr. Stanley made in the house Monday he said that he would not press his resolution which calls on the president for any information in the possession of the department of commerce and labor as to the illegal combination of the tobacco companies named. It might result in an "immunity bath" and have another decision of the same character as that of Judge Humphrey. He prayed to God that presidents in future would spare the American people from his like.

Snow 15 Feet Deep in California.

Orville, Calif.—Reports from the adjacent mountains state that one of the worst snow storms known in years is raging, the snow in places being 15 feet deep. The streams are frozen over and the miners are unable to obtain running water for their operations.

For Jamestown Celebration.

Washington, D. C.—Senator Daniel Tuesday reported from the senate committee on industrial exhibitions his bill appropriating \$75,000 for the Jamestown tercentenary exposition to be held on the shores of Hampton roads.

Playing With Smoot Case.

Washington, D. C.—The senate committee on privileges and elections Friday adjourned until Friday next without taking action on the Smoot case. So many members of the committee were absent that no vote was had.

CONFESSED A KANSAS MURDER.

After an Attempt at Suicide in California Thomas Condon Told of Crime at Osage.

Los Angeles, Calif.—After he had shot himself twice in the head with a revolver Monday evening, with a suicidal intent, Thos. Condon, a restaurant employe, 28 years of age, lying on the ground where he fell, wrote an explanation of his deed in a small memorandum book before he lapsed into unconsciousness, in which he confessed to an alleged murder. The memorandum stated that with the same weapon with which he had attempted suicide he had some time ago shot and killed a man named Finlay, at Osage, Kan., in some difficulty over the latter's wife. Condon was found some time after he had shot himself, and removed to the receiving hospital. His wounds are serious and may prove fatal. At the hospital he begged the surgeons to give him his pistol again that he might finish the deed.

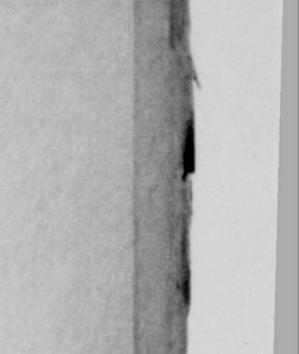
