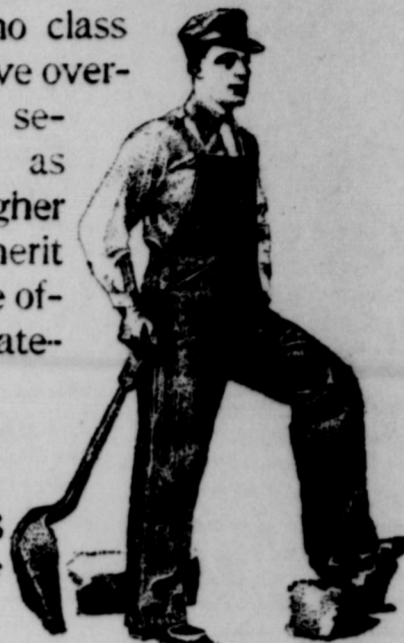

To Weigh the Earth.

Twentieth century science in dissatisfaction with the accepted figures of the earth's weight, and the Americans are planning to weigh it again.

The last time it was done was more than half a century ago, when, under Airy's direction, pendulums were swung at the top and bottom of an English coal pit.

The same experiment is to be repeated by a scientific expedition from the survey department at Washington. Pendulums are to be swung at the apex of the great pyramid of Egypt and in the chambers at its center and base.

From the swing of these pendulums the comparative weights of the earth and of the pyramid can be learned; and the weight of the pyramid having been estimated, the weight of the earth will again be a mere matter of multiplication.—Ex.

Forest Bowers died at the home of his brother, Newt Bowers, at Mobeetie Monday, Rev. S. B. Sawyers preached the funeral sermon Tuesday afternoon, after which the burial services were conducted according to the rites of the Knights of Pythias, of which the deceased was a member. Interment took place in the Mobeetie cemetery. Seven K. P.'s of the Miami lodge, Dan Kivlen, D. K. Hickman, J. E. Kinney, Lute Seiber, Geo. Black, Jack Mead and H. G. Hendricks, attended the services and they report an unusually long funeral procession. Forest Bowers was reared in the Panhandle and had a large circle of friends and acquaintances. However, we learn that a couple of years ago, he became converted, joined the church, and his better qualities predominated.

His death brings forth a touching story of love and fad devotion. When working in Miami an attachment grew up between him and his employer's daughter. This soon ripened into most ardent love. The objections of parents of the girl was a stay to the marriage for a while. They continued to correspond and he would visit her occasionally.

Finally it was decided they would not let anything interfere with the marriage. They reckoned not with death. Sickness came on and the devoted lover from time to time postponed the date in the hope that he would be restored to health, and at last death claimed him. At the grave, at the request of the betrothed, the casket lid was opened and with her own hands she placed a floral offering upon the breast of her dead lover as a token of love and devotion. This act was intensely pathetic and brought tears to the eyes of those hardest of heart among the great throng of mourners who in recent silence observed this expression of as pure a love, a loyalty sublime as ever flowered in the human heart.

Town-Building Needs.

It takes the same qualities and the application of the same principles to build up a town that it does to build up a private business. Say that the stockholders in some McKinney enterprise should each conclude to let the other fellow shoulder all the responsibility, neglect the business and let it run any old way. How long would such an enterprise continue to prosper? The same rule applies to a municipality. The different citizens of McKinney are stockholders in the town. They pay the municipal expenses in the way of taxes and they receive dividends in the way of public improvements and services. Each citizen therefore has a responsibility, the same as a stockholder in a private business concern.
