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

### Postoffice in Private Hands.

W. D. Boyce, a business man of Chicago, has made, on behalf of a syndicate, a proposition to take over the postoffice department and operate the same as a "private affair for bublic benefit." Boyce agrees to pay the government rental for the postoffice buildings and to pay to the government, also, all of the profits above seven per cent on the investment. He guarantees that he will reduce the present price of postage by one-half, that he will extend vantage of that service, and that be The government established a tariff will add a postal express department so that the packages may bedistributed by the rural carriers outside the mail.

Here is an opportunity for those republican leaders who insist that the government should "keep out of business." Under present conditions there is a deficit in the postal department. The two-cent postal rate is regarded by many as excessive, and it is not possible to respond to the requests for extension of the rural free delivery. But here is a man who proposes to cut the postal rates in two and then pay the government all net profits above seven per cent on his investment after paying rental on postoffice buildings!







London, England .- The Daily Mail' correspondent at Teheran, in a tele gram sent Tuesday night at 11.59 o' clock says.

"The shah of Persia died this even ing, though no public announces of the fact will be made until eWd nesday.

It was evident Monday that the end was rapidly approaching and the women of the palace also began prepara tions for mourning. Soon after sunset, the doors of the harem were closed. This was the sign that all "The news of the shah's death

reached the foreign ministers late Tuesday evening, but the public was still unaware of his majesty's end." The death of the shah removes a

picturesque ruler who was well known to western Europe owing to his frequent visits, particularly to France where he took cures at Contrexville and enjoyed the pleasures of Parisian life. During the visit of 1905 the shah and his suite made a dazzling appearance on the boulevards and in the music halls of Paris. They were treated as national guests and given a truly reyal welcome, while popular enthusiasm was marked, owing to the shah's good nature and lavish charity. At that ime he looked old and feeble, his face was pale and flabby and had a waxen pallor.

BROKE ALL RECORDS.

Number of Aliens Entering This Country Last Year Greater Than

Ever Before. Washington. - The fiscal year ended June 30, 1906, produced a record eclipsing all former figures on the subject of immlgration according to the annual report of Frank Sargent, commissioner general of immigration. During that period, the report says, the population of the United States was increased by the admission of 1,100,735 immigrant aliens, and 65,-618 non-immigrant aliens entered at its ports, making the total admission 1,166,352. The increase over last

year's record of 1,659,755 was 106,598. During the fiscal year 1905 the department rejected 11.480 aliens and during the past year 12,452 of the immigrant allers, that is those who intended settling in the United States.

"Without exception," the report says, "the countries from which we formerly obtained the greater part of our foreign population and which are inhabited by races nearly akin to our own, have supplied us with smaller numbers during the past year than during 1905.






