The pores of both kinds of smut te arried by the eed, but the pores of loose smut may also arried in he soil from one of prevents stioking smat. at losese mats requira that the atd be treated and that the round on miich it greer be anted to ynother crop the
Wlowing year. The sinking thall smut is the kind most he kernels only, while the ose smut destroys the grain nd chaff entirely, and the ooty mass of spores remain. The stinking smut gives off a Thensive odor when broken. Treatment" will prevent stinking smut in wheat, also the
muts which commonly affect varley and oats:
Formalin Treatment-There are several methods of treatment; hot water treatment, malin Treatment, the last which is safest, most reliable sod cheapest.
Secure a 40 per cent solution ff formalin at a reliable drug store. One pound of formalin is sufficient to treat from 2000 2500 pounds of seed. Beore mixing the solution, get slution is made by carefully wixing a one pound bottle of the formalin with 40 gallons ot *ater.
The seed may be treated by dipping or sprinkling. To dip, the seed may be placed in guany sack and the solution in should be immersed in this for at least ter minutes and then
taken out and sllowed to drain ack into the barrel for s sho time. The seed should then be mptied into a pile in a clean lace and covered with sacks or blankets for two hours, after which it should be thoroughly dried before sowing.
To sprinkle, prepare a clean place on a canvas or smooth loor. Thoroughly sprinkle the place with the solution befors thoroughly sprinkle the spreadut seed and at the same time sprinkle and shovel over the priak until it is thoroughly seed until it is thoroughly moistened. Next, shovel the seed into a pile and cover with acks or blankets for two hours, after which it should be thorughly dried before sowing. Do not allow the seed ing, wet too long atter trea ing, as the germinating qualiies may be injured.
Place the dried seed in sack which have been dipped in the solution. It is also advisable to sprinkle the grain drill with
the solution before asing it.
