commercial flights, and this explains why you hear about more crashes involving small planes.
But, according to the latest trave But, according to the latest travel
statistics, flying commercially is still ten times as safe as driving,
based on deaths per miles of travel. However, compared to trains and
buses, flying is a bit more risky, the figures show.
The two jumbo jets which crashed
in the Canary Islands on March 27 and claimed more than 575 lives,
