



### Eastland Minister Chosen To Preach At Sunrise Service

Dr. L. B. Gray, chairman of the Ranger Ministerial Alliance, announced Saturday that the alliance had voted unanimously to invite Rev. P. W. Walker, pastor of the First Methodist Church of Eastland, to preach at the annual Sunrise Service at Seenic Point, eight miles east of Ranger, on Easter Sunday.

The sunrise services, which are more than county-wide, as churches from outside Eastland County also participate, were

started several years ago at the instigation of Dr. Gray, who has had a big part in planning each service.

A committee on arrangements, who will have complete charge, has been appointed. It consists of Rev. Charles T. Tally, Jr., pastor of the First Baptist Church of Ranger; Rev. H. O. Bennett, associate pastor of the First Methodist Church of Ranger, and Hall Walker, Mayor of Ranger. The arrangements committee was named of Ranger church and civic leaders because of the town's nearness to the site of the service.

Each minister of the Ranger Ministerial Alliance has agreed to notify pastors of his denomination throughout this section, of the services and to invite all churches in nearby towns to participate in the services.

Seenic Point, because of its natural beauty, especially in the

early morning hours as the sun rises over the hills, was chosen for the annual services several years ago.

Towns which have taken part in the non-denominational services, include Eastland, Cisco, Carbon, Gorman and Strawn, and many of the smaller community churches have also had a part. All are being invited to attend again this Easter Sunday.

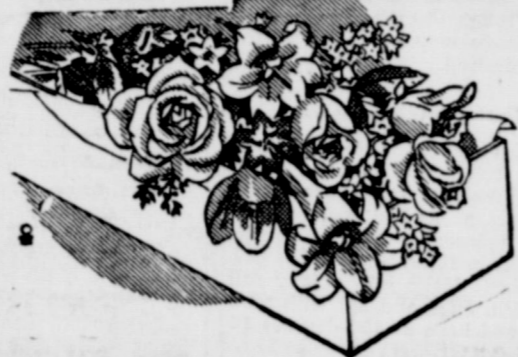

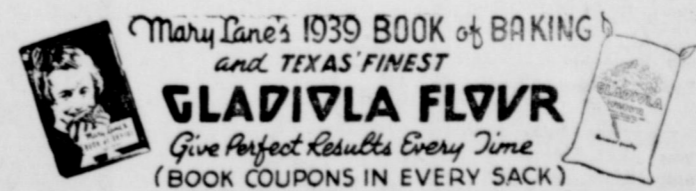

**Liver and Sausage Loaf**  
1-2 pounds liver, 1-2 pound bacon, 1-2 cup sausage, 1 cup crumbs, 1-2 lemon (juice), 2 tablespoons tomato ketchup, onion grated, 1 egg, 1 teaspoon salt, 1-4 lespoons tomato ketchup, onion paprika.

**Cook liver** 15 minutes, chop; add other ingredients. Add milk last. Line baking dish with bacon (press hard). Turn in loaf, cover with rest of bacon and bake in 350 degrees 45 minutes.

**Standing Rib of Beef**  
Six pounds. Trim and wipe dry with clean cloth. Sprinkle with salt. Place in open pan (fat side up). Add under roast 3 table-

spoons Gladiola Flour that will brown during cooking. After removing roast, add water to flour and fat to make your brown gravy (also seasoning). 350 degrees F. Rare 18-20 minutes per pound. Medium 22-25 minutes per pound. Well done 30-35 minutes per pound.

#### Saratoga Onions

Peel and cut onions in 1-4 inch slices and separate into circles. Salt and pepper, dip into milk, then into Gladiola Flour or bread crumbs. Fry in pre-heated fat. 390 degrees until a golden brown (4 to 6 minutes). Shake onto a sheet of paper to absorb any fat. Variation: Asparagus, cauliflower green pepper, egg plant or celery. These vegetables should be pre-cooked for a few minutes and thoroughly drained.

#### Sour Dough Bread

1 quart lukewarm water, enough Gladiola Flour to make a stiff dough, let stand 3 days to sour. To force in cold weather add 2 small Irish potatoes added to lukewarm water and flour. Pour sponge into flour until consistency of biscuits. Add to flour 2 1-2 teaspoons K C baking powder, 1-2 teaspoon soda. Squeeze out and

set close together in a well greased pan. Bake.

#### Potato Doughnuts

1 cup sugar, 1 cup milk, 2 eggs, 1 teaspoon vanilla, 4 tblsp. Mrs. Tucker's shortening, 3 tsp. K C Baking Powder, 1 tsp. lemon extract, 1 cup mashed potatoes, 1 teaspoon salt.

**Method:** Cream the shortening, add sugar, mix well, then add eggs well beaten; potatoes, milk and dry ingredients sifted together, using just enough flour to roll and cut into oblong strips about 3 inches long, 1-2 inch wide and then cut a short slit in the center of each one and pull one end through the slit. Fry in deep fat. Cloves may be added to the fat if desired.

#### Butterscotch Cookies

1 cup melted butter poured over 1 box brown sugar, 2 eggs well beaten, 2 tablespoons milk, 3 1-2 teaspoons K C baking powder, 1 teaspoon vanilla, 5 cups Gold Chain flour.

**Method:** Make into a long roll and chill. Slice and dot with gum drops and bake at 400 degrees 10 minutes.

**French Colonial Apple Pie**  
8 medium tart apples, 2 table-

spoons Gladiola Flour, 1-8 teaspoon salt, 2 tablespoons water, 1-8 teaspoon cake coloring (red), 1 cup pineapple juice, 1 cup sugar, 1-2 tsp. vanilla, 1 tblsp. butter.

**Method:** Combine sugar, coloring and pineapple juice. Add apples which have been peeled and cut into sixths. Cook gently until fruit is tender. Lift out and allow to cool. Add butter and vanilla to juice. Mix water with flour and thicken juice. Cool apples and juice then place into unbaked pastry shell, strip top or place 6 sections of crust on top leaving small openings to show colored apples. Bake at 450 degrees F. 10 minutes. Reduce to 350 degrees F. for 30 minutes.

### Cherry-Nut Cake

1-2 cup Mrs. Tucker's shortening, 1 1-4 cups sugar, 2 cups, 6 tblsp. Gladiola Flour, 1-2 cup

nuts, 10 cherries (cut coarsely), 4 egg whites, 3 tsp. K C baking powder, 1-4 teaspoon salt, 3-4 cup liquid (1-4 cup cherry juice and sweet milk to make 3-4 cup. Make in loaf, layers or cup cakes. Use boiled icing.

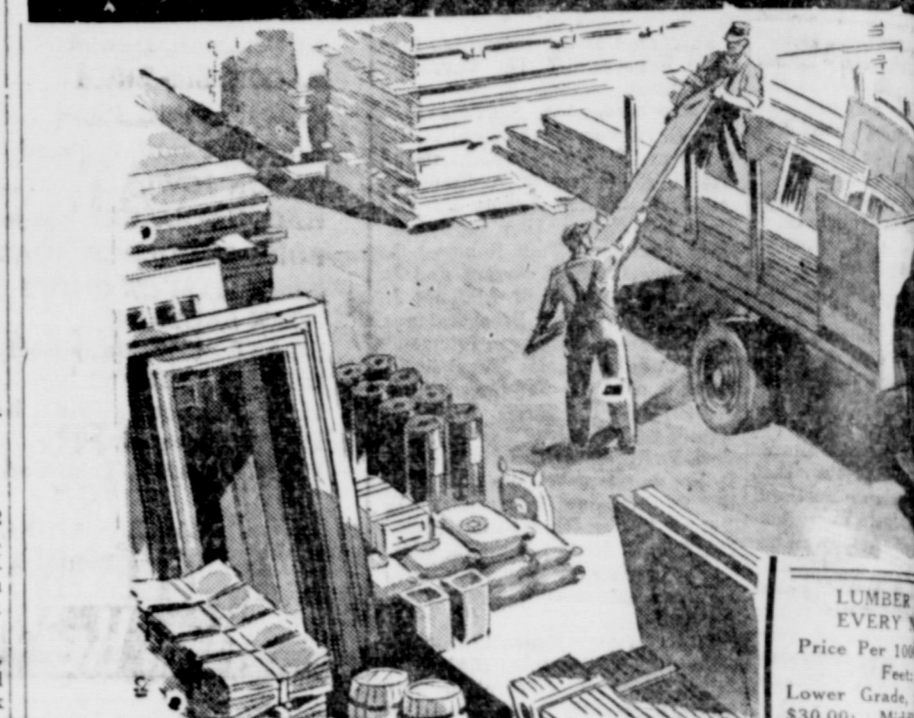
