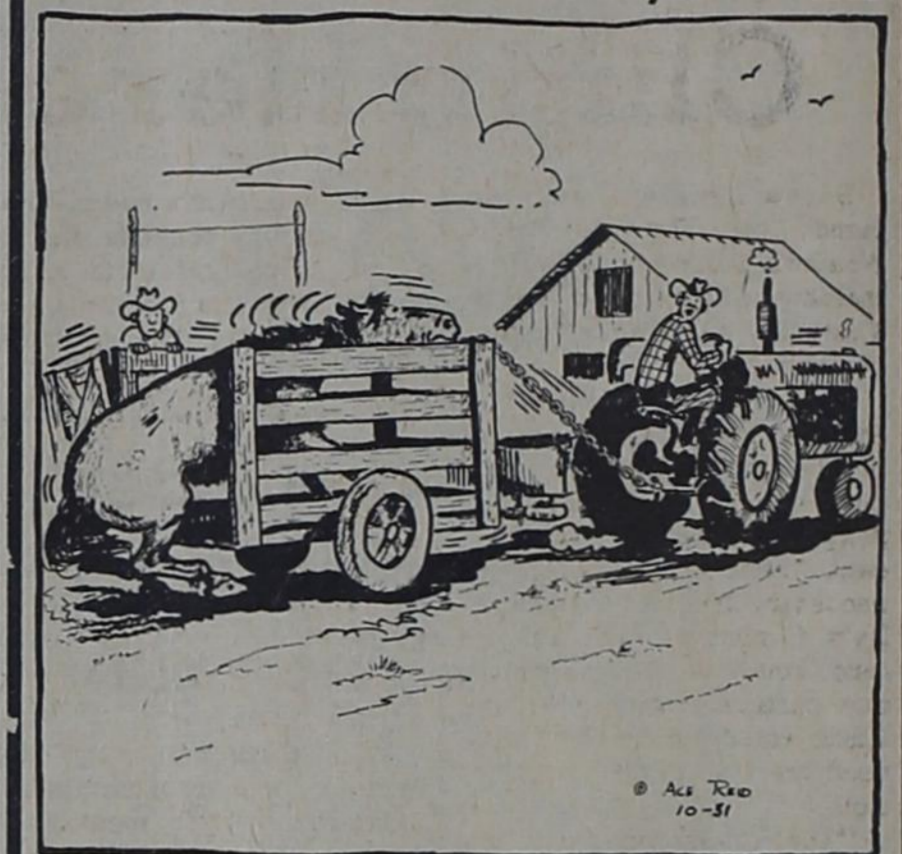

## Deposits Show Slight Increase

Deposits in First State Bank of Bovina as of October 13 showed a slight increase over comparable time a year ago. Total deposits this year on that date were \$1,657,782.39 as compared with the figure of 12 months earlier, \$1,620,354.44. Loans at the third quarter call this year totaled \$1,129,410.98. They were down considerably from the total of the same period in 1964, \$1,407,565.09.

Deposits at the bank have increased at a fast clip during the past three weeks -- since the call, according to Alfred Moody, cashier. Total deposits this week were near the \$2,000,000 mark, he said.

The bank's official quarterly statement of condition appears in this issue of The Blade.

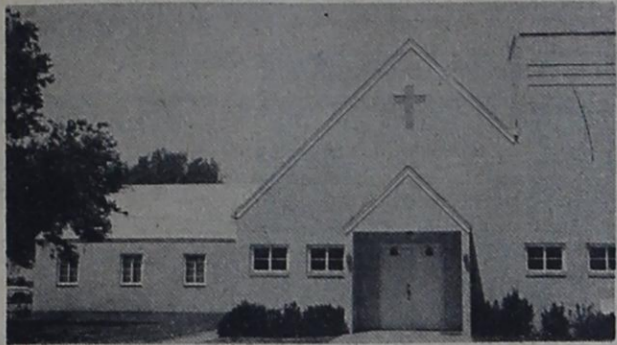

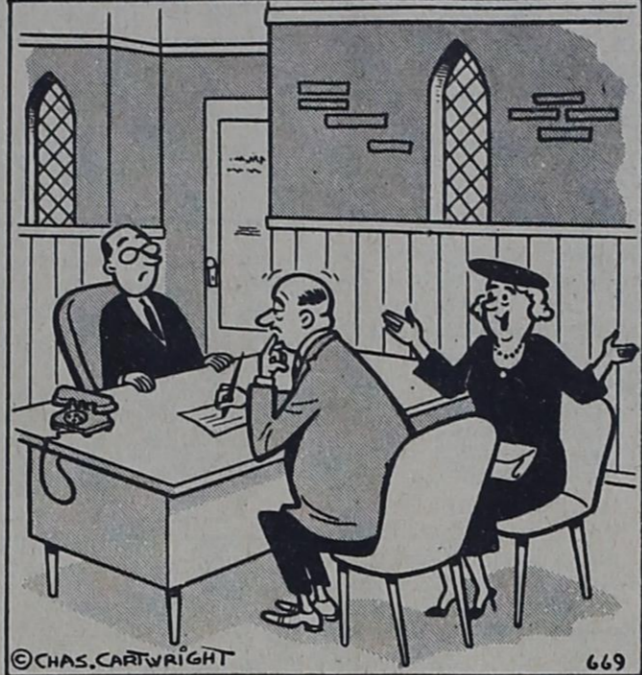

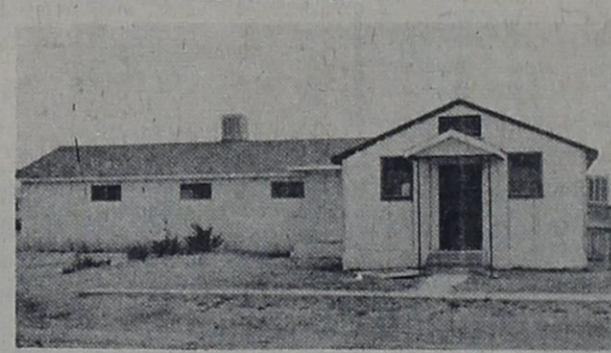

Mustangs First 1-B Loss --

# Scrappy Swifts Slam District Door, 13-8

Bovina Mustangs' hopes of repeating as District 1-B champions were given a severe jolt Friday night at Nazareth. The underdog Swifts scrapped to a 13-8 win to delight of their homecoming crowd.

The loss was the Mustangs first in a district game this year and the first ever under Coach Roy Stone who is now in his second season here. His team was undefeated in district action last year.

Led by their spectacular quarterback and field general,

Marvin Hoelting, who should be called Marvelous Marv, the Swifts carried the fight to the Mustangs and shoved across two touchdowns, all of their scoring, before the Mustangs were able to rally for one of their own.

Hoelting made both the touchdowns for the Castro County boys and also kicked their one extra point. The TDs were on runs of six and 32 yards.

He circled right end for the first one early in the second period after the Mustangs had

lost the ball deep in their own territory as the first period ended.

The ball changed hands on Bovina 21. Hoelting made one to the 20. From there, a Nazareth pass was intercepted but pass interference was ruled against the Mustang defender instead and the host team had a first down on Bovina's 10. Hoelting scooted around right end three plays later. Then, without even taking time out to catch his breath, he booted the extra point through the goal posts to make the score 7-0 in favor of Hoelting & Co.

The Swifts moved the ball into Mustang territory originally on an 80-yard pass play from Hoelting to Gerald Brockman which carried from the Nazareth 18 to the Bovina two. Three plays later the ball was fumbled into the endzone and recovered by Bovina for a touchdown.

The third quarter was especially ill-fated for the Ponies. The score remained 7-0 during the second period and was that way at the halftime intermission. The third stanza, however, saw Nazareth pick up its second TD, the margin of victory, on a dazzling run by Hoelting after he dropped back to pass and found his receivers covered by the Bovina defensive secondary. His 32-yard scamper climaxed a drive that covered 69 yards for the Swifts following the second half kickoff. The attempted kick for the extra point was blocked.

The scoring drive ate up much of the time in the third period. It plus another eight-play drive by the Swifts during the period allowed the Mustangs time for only three offensive plays, which netted seven yards, and a punt.

Bovina's touchdown came midway of the final period. The 83-yard drive featured a brilliant passing attack by Quarterback Jerry Roach. He completed four aerials during the pay-off

march for 61 yards. The TD was registered on a 12 yarder to End Lynn Murphy. Roach bootlegged the extra points around right end to boost the score to 13-8. While the excited fans didn't know it at the time, the scoring was over right there.

Nazareth's second drive during the second half bogged down on the Bovina 20. A Hoelting field goal attempt fell short from there.

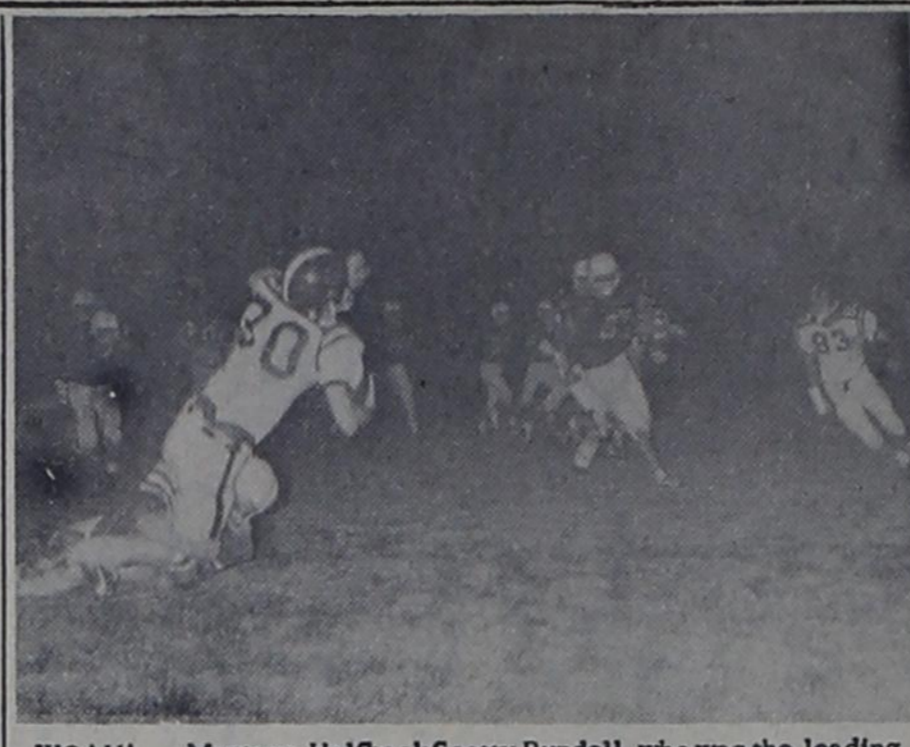
An onside kickoff by the Mustangs failed to work and the Swifts put the ball in play on their own 39. They made one first down before having to punt. Putting it in play on their own 16, the Mustangs roared back upfield in a desperation effort to shove across the winning points. They made it to the Nazareth 40 before they lost possession on downs after a fourth down and five pass was incomplete.

Nazareth had time for only one play before time ran out on the game.

The Mustangs missed a scoring opportunity early in the game. They received the opening kickoff and marched from their own 30 to the Nazareth 15 before losing the ball on downs. Highlight of the drive for Bovina fans was a 26-yard pass from Roach to Halfback Scotty Rundell which put the ball on Nazareth's 13. A trade out on penalties put the pigskin on the 11, but a foul-up on signals in the Bovina backfield lost four to the 15 and that's where the ball went over after two incomplete passes.

The loss made Bovina's district mark 3-1 and the record for the season is now 4-4. Roach had his best night of the season in the airways against Nazareth. He completed 11 of 22 for a total of 171 yards.

The tough Swift defense kept the Bovina rushing attack pretty well bottled up during the game. The Mustangs made a total of
