his rule somewhat, but when in doubt it is safest to assume that all drivers crossing your path have a claim to the right of way equal to your own.

Obviously, however, in many cases one driver or the other will be legally entitled to the right of way. When it becomes necessary to determine right of way in a particular situation, the driver who reaches the intersection first, or who is going to get there first, is ordinarily favored.

But when two automobiles are an equal distance from the intersection, that one approaching from the other driver's right normally has the right of way.

Some intersections are known as "courtesy corners," having a stop sign or a flashing red signal facing each direction of approach.

At intersections involving one through street and another street having a stop sign, a driver approaching the stop sign and coming to a full stop is ordinarily said to have the right of way over vehicles approaching on the through street but not already in the intersection.

However, this last rule must be qualified by saying that you should not proceed, cross or turn onto the through street until you can do so without interfering with oncoming traffic. In other words, if an approaching car will arrive within the intersection before you are completely clear, wait just a little longer. The same rules apply to entering a highway from a side road containing a stop sign.

Many drivers violate the rules of right of way covering left-hand turns at intersections. When turning left, you should always be on the inside (or center) lane, displaying the proper hand signal. You must allow all cars coming from the opposite direction, all through traffic, to pass through before completing your turn.

Stay in the inside lane until your left-hand turn is entirely completed, and only then move gradually over to the right-hand lane if you wish. When turning right, stay in the right-hand lane at all times. Do not swing wide into the center lane, as to do so is unnecessary, unlawful and dangerous.

Many detailed rules and suggestions for safe driving are included in the official "Texas Driving Handbook" which is available to any person requesting same from the Texas Department of Public Safety, Drivers License Division, Austin, Tex.

In 1951 she came up with a winner in Yolande Betheze. "All of my girls have been sweet," Lily May says. "But I know when I have a winner. I think I have something in Gwen Harmon this year, a tawny redhead with blue green eyes. She is a lyric soprano."

"I always tell the girls they are coming in here for a little fun and that they shouldn't expect to go home with the gravy bowl. If they do that's swell but that way, if they don't they don't feel too bad."

Lily May has nothing against girls running around in swimming suits, because that is part of the contest here.

"But down our way," she adds, "they don't compete in short costumes. It would be silly. We are inland and there is no water around to jump into."

Immortal Ed Wynn Tells Newer Comedians How To Stay A Star

HOLLYWOOD, Sept. 4 (UP)—Ed Wynn, the granddaddy of comedy, decided Thursday not many modern day comics will last unless they put their double-meaning jokes in moth balls.

Wynn is one of the few comedians extant who's been a top-notch star in vaudeville, musical comedy movies, radio and television. He's been a "star" since 1916.

But he doesn't think many of the 1952 funny guys will be around 30 years from now—because their gags are a bit "blue."

"None will last unless they stay clean," Wynn reflected. "There is no such thing as a career of longevity without cleanliness of material."

Picks Three to Stay
Jerry Lewis, Red Skelton and Denny Kaye are the comics who will last if they stay clean.

"Some others indulge in innuendoes. I can think of one who tickles the middle-aged housewives with risque jokes. "Years ago I told one young

comedian he'd be a hit if he kept his jokes clean. He didn't. "He's on Broadway now, and a success, I guess, but he didn't become as big as he could have been."

Wynn lives in Brentwood with a pretty wife and rooms full of mementoes—theater programs, trophies and clippings—of his years before the applause of millions. He likes to reminisce about those days when he was just finding stardom himself.

Once, Wynn said, he was selected one of four "all-time" comedians. The others were George H. Cohan, Will Rogers and Fred Stone. All, he said firmly, used

This, after all, is the month when school begins and studies demand a sturdy breakfast to see your youngster through the day. It's also a time when business activities—and the weather—get brisker, suggesting that Father could do with a better breakfast, too!

Breakfast Menu I
Stewed Prunes and Apricots
Grape-Nuts with Milk or Light Cream
Scrambled Eggs
Buttered Toast
Coffee (milk for the children)
Breakfast Menu II
Orange Juice
Candy coated Puffed Wheat with Milk or Light Cream
Raw Apple Slices and Broiled Sausages
Fried Wheat Meal
Coffee (milk for the children)
Fried Wheat Meal
1/2 teaspoon salt
2 1/2 cups boiling water
3/4 cup wheat meal
Add salt to boiling water in saucepan. Add cereal slowly, stirring constantly. Bring again to a boil and cook 3 minutes, stirring constantly. Pour into cold wet mold. Let stand overnight, or until cold and firm.
Turn from mold. Slice in 3/4-inch slices and saute in small amount of fat, turning to brown both sides. Serve with maple-blended syrup. Makes 6 servings. Left-over cooked wheat meal may be used in this way.
