



Two-Vehicle Accident Here

A two vehicle accident occurred on Third and Highway 60, Monday just before noon.

George Spohn of Bovina was driving a 1983 Oldsmobile Custom Cruiser southbound and ran a stop sign. He collided with a pickup truck pulling a trailer driven by Don White of Portales, who was traveling north on Highway 60.

The Spohn vehicle struck the trailer and the impact ruined all four axels, wheels, tires and possibly sprung the whole trailer, according to White. He said, "I looked in the rear view mirror and my trailer was up on its side. If I had not had a strong fifth-wheel hitch, it would have turned over."

Spohn said that he received a citation for failing to stop at a stop sign.



Funeral services were held in Friona's Union Congregational Church, Thursday, December 22 at 10:30 a.m. for Dutch Dean, 84, of Friona.

The Rev. Herman Krauel, pastor, officiated at the services, which were conducted by Ellis-Blackwell Funeral Home.

Born June 25, 1910 in Wellington, Texas, he married Sarah Schlenker on September 9, 1933 in Clovis, New Mexico. He died Tuesday, December 20, 1994 at Parmer County Community Hospital.

In spite of all the hard times, there have been many good years and she is still a very attractive, radiant, strong individual who thinks Bovina is a fine place to live.

Joe was born December 23, 1906 in Odell, near Vernon, Texas in Wilbarger County. Her parents were D.C. (Doctor Kraton) and Lucy Mae Howard.

Mr. Vassey had five children by his first wife, then she died and he married Joe's mother and the couple had one little girl, Myrtle, and later Joe was born. When she was nine days old, her mother died with Typhoid Fever. Joe spent most of her first year with her Grandmother Vassey. Then her father traveled by train back to South Carolina and brought home another wife who was thirty years younger than he was. The girl was nineteen years old and in the years they were married they had six children. She said her father was always a farmer and a wonderful farmer. He came to this country and bought a place that is located just down the road from where Joe lives now.

As a child, Joe remembers her dad having the first automobile in the county. It was a Ford and she said when he was at work, the children would have lots of fun pushing each other in the Ford around the place.

The car had butane lights on it which had to be lit with a match. There were big globes around the lights. People in the country were a little jealous and resentful of the automobile and wouldn't move over and let him by. One day, he met a man on a horse who wouldn't

move, but her dad eased up by the horse and honked the horn, then the man and horse moved over.

She said she was a honery child when she was little and would run off and hide. Sometimes she would even get a mile or more from home before they would find her. Her birth name is Lucille but she said her brothers thought she was so rough and tough she needed the name of "Joe" and she's been called that name ever since.

When she and Reagan were courting, one day her father sent her to the pasture to pick up cowchips. She saw Reagan and was so embarrassed that he caught her doing this particular chore.

The couple was married in the Bovina Methodist Church by Brother Walker and they were only the second couple that he had married.

Mr. and Mrs. Willie Williams stood up with them. On their wedding night, they spent the night with his parents and the next night with his sister Evelyn Macon.

Joe spoke of how people named their children. Reagan had one brother named Colonel and one named Squire. Her father was named Doctor. Joe's oldest half-sister was named Maggie Lee Georgie Myrtle Parther Rene Emily.

Joe said she never knew what a bedbug was until she came to West Texas and she told about the problems of getting rid of them. All they had to kill them was coal oil (kerosene).

They would set the legs of the bed in cans of coal oil but the bugs would even drop from the ceilings. She said every morning they would pick the bugs off the beds before making them. Everyone had them. Joe said new lumber was brought in from the north to build new houses and barns and the bedbugs were in the lumber.

She also told how Johnson

Grass got its start here. The XIT Ranch brought big loads of hay bales into this country and they had Johnson Grass in them, so that was how the Johnson Grass got its start here.

Joe always loved to work outside on the farm and said she even loved to pick cotton. At one time, she could pull 950 pounds of cotton in a day and only one young man could beat her and he was nineteen years old.

At one time, her father hired her as one of the hired hands because she could do as much work as a man and he paid her a man's wages.

The first day she went to the field with Reagan shortly after they were married, she said when they came in at noon Reagan got a pillow and laid in the floor. She said she got a pillow and laid down to rest, too.

She said he said, "Aren't you going to cook us some dinner?" She said, "When you get up and help me, we will." She said from that day on, whenever she helped in the fields, he was good to help in the kitchen.

They ate lots of ho-cakes, which were fried cornbread and they ate that a lot when they were working because there wasn't any time to bake. The ho-cakes were good with bacon, which they had most of the time.

The first year they were married, they didn't make a crop so Reagan worked on the highway paving project between Bovina and Dimmitt. They had to live with his folks four years until they could get their own place.

At one time they milked thirty cows, fed the milk to the hogs, sold the cream and raised all kinds of chickens. They'd go down in the sand hills and gather wild plums for jelly.

They purchased 1,600 acres of land and have only sold six acres for the airport north of their place. She said Jimmie and Wes Cockerham leased and farmed her land and were very good farmers.

The couple had three children: Howard, who lives in Clovis; June Gay McMeans, who lives in Bovina; and a son, D.C., who was killed in a plane crash in 1960. Joe's husband, Reagan, died in 1992.

When they first came to Bovina, there was a big mercantile store that supplied their needs and Bovina's first restaurant was run by Dellie Horton's husband, Tommy. They would ride horses to town every day for the mail.

The Looneys were instrumental in providing much of the finances for the new First Baptist Church, which was built in 1960. Joe is a charter member and is now the oldest member of the church. She taught Sunday School nine years.

She was also a charter member of the Eastern Star until it disbanded. She helped to start the Study Club and it continued up until about four years ago and then disbanded.

She is a member of the Senior Citizens organization that began about twenty-five years ago. They first met at the Methodist Church, then the "Spot," which was the Baptist activity building and then they built the Senior Citizens Building on Main Street.

Joe still enjoys playing games

at the center and also does beautiful hand work. She is now piecing a bedspread for a king-sized bed.

She said she remembered they always had a Christmas tree at school, church and in their homes. They had apples and oranges and one time, she remembered getting a pretty doll.

She said she would always rather be outside working but when she cooked, these were some of her favorites and they came from an old, old cookbook and the words were different than ours today.





Unusual Customs Observed By Richard Villarreal Family

One of Bovina's finest couples are Zeferino and Rita Villarreal and they have lived in Parmer County since 1956.

Both came from the Rio Grande Valley and Zeferino's parents were Didaco and Rafaela Villarreal. He had two brothers and seven sisters. At birth, he was given to an aunt and lived with them until he was twelve years old and then given back to his parents. He said this was not an unusual custom.

Rita's parents were Dolores and Eusebio Rodriguez. Her mother is in bad health but living with them for the time being. Rita had two brothers and two sisters. She said her mother had fifteen children and ten were stillborn.

They had a nephew that grew up at their home and she said her mother was always partial to him. He is now 47 and she said recently he said when Rita's mom died, he hoped to go at the same time because he didn't want to live without her.

Zeferino's and Rita's parents farmed. Rita said her father was a farm laborer, and later worked for a rancher. He then was able to rent his own fields and began farming on his own, according to Rita.

The couple lived within ten miles of each other while they were growing up but never knew one another until they both went on trucks to Michigan as migrant workers and worked in fields of sugar beets there.

They said both had very strict parents and were not allowed to talk to one another but would slip words to each other as they passed in the rows of the field. When they returned to their home, they wrote each other letters for four years. Both Zeferino and Rita said they didn't fall in love as much as they "grew in love" over the years.

They said back in those days things were different. His dad sent two respectable men to talk with her parents and then if they thought the family was "allright," they would ask for the girl's hand in marriage.

A girl's parents would always tell them that they would think about it and they were to come back for an answer in three weeks. In their case, when they came back in three weeks, the answer was "yes," so the couple was married without ever having had a real date.

The couple went to the Sacred Heart Church in Edinburg and later in the day, a judge married them. They said they had a huge wedding with over three hundred people present.

They both told of the large amounts of food, meat, chocolate and all kinds of breads and salads.

They said it was the custom for relatives to help you and many brought pigs and goats and all types of food. The food was served all day long. They began serving at 8 a.m. and served until 1 a.m. the next day.

They also had music and dancing all day with a live band. The days were so warm that they served food on tables set up in the yard. Their wedding day was February 26, 1951.

The first year they were married, they lived in an apartment with one room and a kitchen in Edinburg.

They had three children there and they were Zeferino, Jr., Norma and Dora.

Then the couple moved to Hub where he was working for T.I. Bureson and later for Gilbert Wenner. They were there five years and this is where George, Lisa, Eddie and Richard were born.

From Hub, they moved to Farwell and worked there ten years on a farm for Joe Schilling. This is where David, Johnny and Anna were born.

In 1971 the couple moved to Bovina. They said in between their moves, they once went to California for six months and worked in the orchards, but didn't like California and said it was great to get back to West Texas.

The couple had ten children and now have eighteen grandchildren.

Their children are Zeferino, Jr. and his wife, Mary. They have twins and two other children. Zef is employed at Charles Oil & Gas Company and Mary works at Texas TPMHA in Hereford.

A daughter, Norma, teaches school in Bovina. A daughter, Dora, and her husband, Joe Shipp, live in Amarillo and Joe teaches music there.

A son, George, and his wife, Nicki, and their two children live in Bovina and George works at the Highway Department.

Daughter Lisa, and her husband, Ramiro Navarro, live in Bovina and he works at the gin. A son, Eddie, and wife, Dollie, live in Farwell and they have two children. Eddie works at the Big O Tire Company and Dollie is secretary at the school in Farwell.

Richard is a sergeant in the U.S. Army and is presently stationed in Korea. He has another year there, they said. His wife, Elida, works at the school in Fort Hood and the couple has two children. Richard will be in the states on leave in August.

A son, David, is in the Army and has been for eight years. They said David would decide in July if he wants to stay in the service.

Another son, Johnny, lives in Clovis and works at Bovina Pump Company most of the time but is now working at the gin during cotton harvest. His girlfriend, Emma, lives in Clovis and the couple plans to marry in February.

Their daughter, Anna, and her husband, Tim, have one daughter and Tim works at the gin. They recently moved here from Corpus Christi.

The Villarreals had three sons in the service and two in Desert Storm at one time. They shared what a scary time that was and told how people were so concerned and good to them.

They said it meant so much to them one day for Durward Bell to come by the house and tell them he was praying for them. One day they said, "We got a card from Brother Richard Grisham with beautiful words and it meant so very much!"

When asked about Christmas when they were youngsters, they said they didn't have much but Rita said she remembered some neighbors that had some cedar trees and she asked if she could have a branch.

Then her uncle gave her ten cents and she bought some little roses and put on the branch. She then put Baby Jesus and Mother Mary's picture beneath it. This was the altar where she prayed.

She said her dad had an aunt that had a statue of Baby Jesus and she would put him under her altar and the family would say rosary, then sing for a long time. Later they would celebrate with lots of tamales and good food.

They said a man and woman would be asked to share Baby Jesus and they would lay him in a crib and a group would gather around him, have the rosary over the baby and then eat candy and peanuts to celebrate. Then Baby Jesus was taken to other homes and the celebration would continue.

Both were raised in a Catholic Church and Rita said she would walk five miles to church with her grandfather. Zeferino said he always was a Catholic but they lived too far from church to attend. He said if they went anywhere it was with horses hitched to a wagon.

They both became serious in their church work when they moved to Bovina. Zeferino was ordained as deacon in 1977. He said he had to study four years and during that time go to Lubbock and Amarillo at least once a week for study and then go one full week during each year and study.

Rita worked at the school cafeteria for three years back in the 1970s and is now working as substitute when needed. She also is a member of the Guadalupanas and the ladies clean the rectory, prepare meals of special food for the community and the donations go to help the needy.

She also helps her husband with baptismal instructions to their people, counsels with parents when their babies are to be christened, and also counsels with couples who are having problems.

Zeferino explained that if his wife were to die before he did, that he could later enter the priesthood with more study and could not marry again or he would lose his vow.

The couple took an exciting trip in May, 1992 when they flew to Mexico City on a Pilgrimage with eighteen people in the group. Their priest, Timothy Dran, went with the group.

They saw the Palace of Fine Arts with dancing of all kinds, including Mexican and Indian dances from throughout the states of Old Mexico.

They attended the bull fights and saw the huge pyramids. They visited homes of famous actors. For a whole week, they said, they would leave the hotel at 8 a.m. and return at 6 p.m.

They shared the story of Father Dran, whose goal was to say Mass

Cancer Center Sets Breast Screening

The Women's Center of the Don and Sybil Harrington Cancer Center and High Plains Baptist Hospital will again conduct a Breast Cancer Screening Clinic in Friona at Parmer County Hospital, 1307 Cleveland on January 18 from 10 a.m.-2:30 p.m.

Breast cancer affects one in eight women. The key to boosting your chances of winning the battle against cancer are early detection by having an annual breast exam, mammogram and performing breast self-exam each month.

City Hall To Close

Doris Strawn, Bovina city administrator, announced that the office at City Hall will be closed for business on Friday, December 23 and also Monday, December 26 for the holidays.

Business will resume on Tuesday, December 27.

Each participant at our screening will receive a breast exam and one-to-one instruction in breast self-examination by a Registered Nurse specially trained in breast cancer detection, and a mammogram by a mammography technician. Our program is certified by the FDA, American College of Radiology and the State Health Departments of Texas, Oklahoma and New Mexico.

The American Cancer Society urges all women to have their first mammogram by age 40. Those who have a close relative with breast cancer or other risk factors may be asked by their doctor to have a mammogram at an earlier age.

The total cost of the screening is \$70.00. Ask about funding that is available for free breast screenings and mammograms.

The Varsity Mustangs game ended with a final score of 90-63 in favor of Anton.



The Varsity Fillies also lost to Anton, the final score being 69-34.




BRUCE AND GRACE PARR

Parmer County Pioneer Couple Return To Days Of The Old West

Most people don't start an entirely new career when they are in their mid-sixties, but then most people aren't Friona's own home-grown, sassy Santa Claus known as Bruce Parr.

Bruce has been a farmer all his life but he has been collecting old wagons, buggies, antique farm implements, old blacksmithing tools, etc. for many years. Plus, he has always enjoyed working with large animals such as mules, horses, oxen and the like.

Then in the early 1980s, people started asking him to put some of his antique vehicles into area parades, so Bruce formed a small company known as the "Tejas KIID Express" and went into this as a business. He now considers himself to be a wagoner, a mule-skinner and a blacksmith.

By the way, the KIID in the firm's name is the initials of the Parrs' four children, Kim, Ira, Iva and Donna.

Bruce's wagons and other outfits always win trophies and prizes when they are entered in parades, but he usually gives the trophies to his grandkids. He made a fair living at working with people on entertainment events and promotions of various sorts with his wagon business but Bruce says after the oil business went "bust" he hasn't done very well with it.

He worked with the Texas Sesquicentennial Committee in 1985 and took his rigs to a lot of big places to publicize that event. He was in the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade in '85 when it rained four inches and the temperature was 34 degrees, so the parade wasn't a big success that year and the photos taken at the parade were not especially good.

Following the Macy's parade, Bruce and crew loaded up the animals and the stagecoach and drove all night in a blizzard to make it to Chicago the next day for an appearance in the McDonald's Charity Parade there.

He has customized a 40 foot long trailer which will hold the stagecoach and mules. He pulls this with a pickup as he travels across country to various events. He has appeared in just about every major parade in the state of Texas, Wyoming and Colorado.

Most of Parr's old vehicles are true antiques, but a few have been repaired and some have had to be modernized for travel on paved roads and the like.

But the bright red stagecoach which is his trademark was specially built by hand to authentic specifications. It took the builder ten months to make it. The entire coach is made of wood, just like in the early days, except the wheel bearings are modern and it has hydraulic brakes on front and back wheels. The outer skin of the coach is not painted red. It is red fiberglass so it won't ever wear out or get scared up.

His real pride and joy is an antique conestoga wagon built around 1850 or earlier. This piece is in mint condition, never repaired, and can be hooked up and pulled just like in the early days.

"The few conestogas that are still around are just a pile of splinters," Parr noted. He says most people are not as interested in seeing this one, because it is not as "showy" as some of his other pieces.

Also in his current inventory are several types of buggies and surreys.

He has a spring freight wagon which came from Minnesota, plus a lot of old blacksmith tools and farm equipment like bull-wheel binders and an old horse-powered mill for grinding grain or making molasses.

He still has the wagon that his daddy drove when he came to the plains and the anvil that he brought with it, plus the wagon that his wife's family came in from Oklahoma.

Parr has driven his vehicles in some pretty fancy weddings in Amarillo and other places. He drove singer-actress Carol Lawrence in the

Cotton Bowl Parade in Dallas one year and nearly every summer he does rides for tourists who stop at the Big Texan in Amarillo.

He grows a beautiful white beard, totally natural, every year around Christmas time so he will look more like Santa Claus as he takes various groups on hay rides, Christmas Caroling, Santa rides and the like.

Diane Dick in Amarillo has used him in her modeling agency as a Santa Claus for several years and he has done Santa rides for Wolflin Village in Amarillo.

He drove Gerald McCathern all around through his district when he was running for congress a few years back. Then Bruce took a lot of his equipment to the Town and Country Days at Tom Christian's ranch on the rim of Palo Duro Canyon, plus he has worked quite a bit with the museum in Canyon.

Working with the animals must be in his blood because Bruce is a natural at it. He understands that animals, especially mules, have to be handled properly. He says there is always a lot of noise connected with being in parades and this can spook an animal which does not have the proper handler. There were a lot of fireworks during the Cotton Bowl Parade but he didn't have any trouble with the animals at all.

He currently has about 20 mules and six horses. His eight matched palomino mules are quite a sight and are very rare animals.

At one time he had a team of ten oxen which was really impressive. He took this team to Cotton Bowl parade, too.

Bruce notes that the oxen were pretty old when he got them. They came from the lumber business in the swamps of Mississippi. Bruce says he learned a lot about working with oxen from old Tom Jasper who ran a freight hauling business in Friona until 1948 and he used oxen to pull the freight.

Bruce's oxen began to get too heavy and old for their joints to hold them up. Out of kindness to the animals he had to have them

slaughtered but he had their hides tanned and has kept a few of them. Some of the hides were as big as a king-size bedspread.

Bruce took some of his vehicles to Albuquerque one summer where son Ira and family live. Then Bruce, Grace, Ira and family all appeared as extras in a made-for-TV movie, "Sparks," which was being filmed there.

Victoria Principal was the major star of the film in which she played a lady mayor of Albuquerque. It was shot just north of the town on a river where there are some lovely old mansions. The movie was a pilot to introduce a new TV series which the backers hoped would take off and be as popular as the "Dallas" series, but Bruce says it never did get that far.

The "Lonesome Dove" people have contacted Parr and asked him to bring his equipment out to the Big Bend Country where they will soon be filming another sequel to that popular TV movie, but he is still in negotiation and has not finalized the deal.

There will be another statewide wagon train next year and Bruce is planning to participate. 1995 will be the 150th anniversary of Texas USA Statehood and this wagon train will be for celebrating and publicizing this historical event.

Bruce and Grace Parr are both pioneers of Parmer County. His parents, J. W. and Josephine Parr, came to Friona in 1919 with their six children, of which Bruce was

Jerry Ware Makes Her Holiday Preparations

It took several moves and a number of years for this lovely, dark-eyed lady to be living in her pretty duplex in Bovina. Jerry Ware began life May 13, 1905 only three hours from Bovina in Hansford, Texas.

This is the old town of Spearman that was first called Hansford and when the railroad moved across country the town moved about three miles in another location and changed its name to Spearman. The only thing at the old townsite is the cemetery.

Jerry's parents were Tom Been Windom and Frances Tennessee Douglas. Her mom came from Tennessee and her dad came from Farmersville, Oklahoma.

Jerry had four brothers and one sister. They were: E.J., Clell, Clyde, Cloyd and Imogene. While living in Spearman, Imogene, E.J., Jerry and Clyde were born in a dugout.

Her father was a rancher and farmed some land but mostly raised cattle. He raised broomcorn and milo. She said during the depression years they ate lots of combread because flour was rationed along with several other items during World War I.

Jerry graduated from high school in Springfield, Colorado and went to business college in Wichita, Kansas for three months before her mother suffered a stroke and she had to quit school, return to their hometown and help her father care for her mother.

Jerry said her mother lived six more years before she died. She was paralyzed on one side so her dad had to have help with her.

Jerry said she and her husband, Earl, had to go together for three years because of her mother's illness and she felt she had to wait. They were married March 27, 1931 at Estancia, New Mexico by a Presbyterian preacher in a barber

shop. The witness was the preacher's wife.

The couple had three sons, Jimmie, who lives at Maude, Texas; Leon and Tom, who both live in Bovina. They are all dark-eyed like their mother and she said when they were little, someone was always calling them her little "black-eyed peas."

Dr. Lancaster of Clovis delivered all the boys at the clinic except Jimmie, and he was born at home. Jerry said she just decided she wanted to have that one at home but before he came she thought that might not be a good idea.

She and Earl joined the Methodist Church and were both baptized at N.L. Tharp's tank. It was located near the Bob Wilson place. She said it was a beautiful day and there was group singing.

Earl farmed and the couple lived at McLean the first year they were married. Then they moved to a place between Clovis and Farwell. This was Gus Ware's place and Gus was Earl's brother.

Then the couple moved to a farm on the Grady Highway and lived for a time. She said this was the only time their home was broken into and the only thing taken was a brick-pattern quilt.

After they moved from the Grady Highway farm, they moved to a rented place at Pleasant Hill and farmed for Mr. Jarrel, located six miles west. While living there, they had a school teacher who lived with them for two years but they haven't stayed in touch with her.

They then bought the Herman Lucas place located four miles west of Bovina. It was just half a section to begin with and they added more land until they had two sections in all.

She said back then, they bought the land for \$15 an acre. They moved to Enids, Colorado, for a year ranching on the plains

country, but kept their place here and moved back a year later.

They built a new home and it is now where Grandson Pat and his wife, Donna Ware, live. Later they swapped houses with son, Tom and Sandy, and moved to town.

Earl became ill one day and she took him to the hospital in Friona. She said Earl reached up and pulled her to him, kissed her and told her he was going to go.

She said she told him that he wasn't going anywhere but he laid back and died. She said it was such a shock but now she realized what a blessing it was to die so easy without too much suffering.

After Earl passed away, she moved to the Bill Thornton place for a couple of years and loved the country. Then moved back to town and built the duplex where she has lived since 1965.

Jerry is the mother of three sons, grandmother of ten and great-grandmother of seventeen. She said she had attended all the grandchildren's high school graduations and been to all their weddings.

She has quilted all her grandchildren a quilt and has one for Grandson Todd's wedding shower. She said she worked on it while he was little and he helped her with the stitches and she left the part that he had sewn.

When she was a small girl, she remembers her father would always get a big box of apples and oranges at Christmas, and sometimes they would get a little toy.

They would have a Christmas tree decorated with strands of popcorn or cranberries. They usually had something special at church and received a little sack of candy. She said this was a real treat because they seldom got candy.

Jerry has been in several organizations. She is a member of the United Methodist Women's group, a quilting club and the Thrifty Club at one time. She is president of the Senior Citizens organization for the second time.

Jerry loves to travel and has been many miles. She went to Europe twice, Hawaii twice, Guam, Mexico City, Washington state, Salt Lake City, Alaska, Canada and the Bahamas.

Jerry has many friends and loves visiting, crocheting and is now knitting.

She is looking forward to spending Christmas with both her

sons in Bovina. She will have a meal with Leon and Shirley and family before Christmas and on Christmas Day, she will be with Tom and Sandy.

She still loves to cook and said she would cook as long as she could because she enjoys it so much, especially making homemade bread.

During the holidays, she always makes the "Overnight Salad" for special times. Mix:

- 2 eggs
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon flour
- 1 teaspoon butter
- 1 cup pineapple

Cook until thick, stirring constantly. Set aside to cool. Add:

- 1 cup pineapple, cut up
- 1 cup nut, chopped
- 2-1/2 cups marshmallows
- 1 can No. 2 white Royal Ann cherries, cut up

- 1 pint whipped cream
- Mix together and let set overnight. Will serve twenty.

WHITE FRUIT CAKE

- 2 cups sugar
- 1 cup butter
- 4 cups flour

- 1 cup blanched almonds
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- Whites of 8 eggs
- 1 cup candied pineapple
- 1 cup candied cherries
- 3 cups coconut

Cook slow about 1-1/2 hours at 275 degrees.

Bruce Parr's Family Members Are Pioneers Of Our Area

(Continued from Page 1-A) the baby, having been born that same year over in Castro County.

The Parr family started out in Montague County and moved to the Amarillo area around the turn of the century. J. W. Parr drove a horse-drawn Watkins wagon route from the Pecos River on up into Oklahoma.

When they arrived in Parmer County the family lived in a sod house for awhile. Bruce says there were only about ten houses in Friona and no streets had yet been cut out. The Parrs bought and farmed a section of land north of Friona and later J. W. Parr went into business with O. G. Turner.

These two enterprising businessmen started several firms in Friona including a farm implement house, automobile dealership, movie house, hardware store, real estate and insurance.

Grace's parents, Ira and Grace Miller, came to the Parmer County area about seven or eight years after the Parr family came. Grace was the youngest of a family of eight children.

Bruce says he first met Grace when she was five years old and her father brought her with him over to the Parr place to buy some milk pen calves. Bruce thought she was the prettiest little thing he ever laid eyes on and "I set my cap for her right then," he says.

Grace says she doesn't remember that, but the two of them dated all through high school in Friona. He worked at the movie theater then, where all the teens like to hang out on Saturday.

Bruce graduated from Friona High School in 1937 and Grace in 1939. These two childhood sweethearts have been married for 55 years.

Grace was also the youngest of her family of eight youngsters. The Millers came from the area of Woodward County Oklahoma where most the older children remained when the family brought the three youngest, Claude, Maesie and Grace, to Parmer County.

These three attended school at Lakeview where their dad served on the school board for many years.

Later they went to high school in Friona.

Johnny Miller, Grace's nephew, still farms the land where the Miller family first settled in Parmer County. Maisie Flynn, Grace's sister, is a long-time resident of Bovina.

Descendants of the older Miller children who stayed in Oklahoma are still farming the land in Woodward County which has been in the family since the Cherokee Land Run of 1893.

Grace says she doesn't go in for the old west routine like Bruce does. But she has gone along with him on many of his trips.

A few years ago when they traveled in a motor home, Grace took up the hobby of needlepoint. She has put many hours into a beautiful three foot by five foot rug which adorns the living room at the Parr home east of Black.

Bruce says Grace is also just about the best cook in these parts or anywhere else.

Bruce and Grace are members of Friona's First Baptist Church and were quite active in civic things during the time their children were growing up. Grace was a member of the Black Study Club, Lakeview Home Demonstration Club and Modern Study Club, president of PTA and involved in sponsoring all sorts of school activities.

Bruce has been connected with many of the agricultural organizations of the area and served on the school board at Black for many years until the school was consolidated with Friona. He is past president of the local Lions Club and past president of the Friona Chamber of Commerce.

The Parrs have four children, 16 grandchildren and four little great-grandsons.

Ira Bruce Parr is the oldest of their brood. He started to school at Black, finished school at Friona and then attended college at Texas Tech and LCC. He married Wynette Beaton and they now live in Albuquerque where he has a chain of western stores there.

Iva Ben Parr came along five and a half years later. She went

through school in Friona, got her degree at Tech and taught school for awhile in Bovina. She also taught college English at Tarleton College in Stephenville.

Then she married John Foster and they moved to the Ft. Worth area where she now works for a publishing house that publishes college text books.

Donna Jo Parr went to college at Southwestern State University at San Marcos and got her masters degree at the University of Texas. She taught English at the University at Edinburg. She is married to Trev Sparks and they have an auto dealership in McAllen.

Kim Parr went to college at Utah University at Logan, Utah. He married Cece Lewis and they moved to Landrum, South Carolina to be near her parents, former Friona residents Nelson and Lucille Lewis.

Kim finished his degree at the University of South Carolina at Spartanburg. He is a certified intensive care nurse.

Grace says her greatest joy is in getting to visit the kids and the grandkids in all these various places. They usually go to Albuquerque to see the Fall colors in New Mexico every year and they are planning to spend Christmas with Ira and family there this year.

She says the colors of the red maples are beautiful in South Carolina where Kim and family live at the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains.

Donna Jo and group live right on a river in the middle of bluebonnet country, so it is great to visit there in the springtime, plus they have a place on the beach at Port Isabell.

When they go to visit Iva Ben and her family, Grace enjoys going to sporting events, plays, shows and musicals in the Dallas/Ft. Worth area.

Bruce says his main goal now is to spend the rest of his days showing his old vehicles and animals as a teaching tool for both children and adults, because this sort of thing is a part of our heritage but it is dying out. In a





Have more to drink than alcohol, such as soft drinks and fruit drinks. Above all, don't let a person drive away from your party after he has had too much to drink.




