FARMERS URGED TO FOLLOW CONSERVATION ACTIVITIES

Farmers of Eastland County who have signed up to participate in the 1953 Agricultural Conservation Program are urged by E. E. Blackwell, Chairman of the county PMA committee, to follow through on the conservation practices planned for this year. He refers not only to practices approved under ACP, but to all conservation work which Soil Conservation Service plans and farm experience reveals as being most needed.

As the chairman sees it, the nation has reached that stage in population increase where every effort must be made to protect land from washing and blowing away and to build up the soil to meet future production needs. The production to meet the increasing needs must come largely from the land now being farmed.

The assistance provided under ACP, he points out, is being directed at the most needed conservation on the individual farm. The purpose is to center attention on conservation practices over and above what the farmer would carry out on his own initiative and with his own resources. Approval of certain practices should not be taken to indicate that these are the only conservation measures which are needed on the farm.

Chairman Blackwell, also stresses the need for farmers to make arrangements in advance for the use of such equipment as may be needed to carry out conservation practices planned for the season. Attention to this before the work season starts will give added assurance that the practices can be completed and it will give owners of equipment a chance to work out effective operating schedules.

The County Committee has gone over all of the requests for assistance under the 1953 program and where assistance has been approved farmers have been notified.

use as weed destroyers. Lake Austin, like some other Texas lakes and ponds, has a heavy weed, or moss, growth. It has become so dense that navigation has been hampered.

Nutria, a brown colored animal about midway in size between muskrat and a beaver, are strictly vegetarians and have enormous appetites. They also are known as prolific breeders. The Executive Secretary said this trait seems to have been born out by reports of numerous nutria now present in Lake Austin.

The latest check on the status of the animals was made possible by lowering the lake twelve feet to permit some work on a dam and also construction of some city park improvements. One person telephoned the Commission to report about twenty of the animals in one group. Another reported ten. Another person, on a week-

end outing, saw several on a small sandbar. He caught one, took it home and was surprised to note that the animal avidly accepted and ate a leaf of lettuce.

The Executive Secretary pointed out that wild animals seldom survive removal from natural habitat to civilization. For that reason, state laws have been enacted forbidding keeping most species, at least without a permit. At present, nutria have no such protection.
