

When taken to the farms, they are given an amazing amount of grazing from improved varieties of oats and clovers for winter grazing and sudan grass for summer and early fall. Two and even three animal units per acre are reported grazing on these temporary pastures for months at a time. By cross fencing with electric fences, closer grazing of a field can be accomplished while another part of the field is coming back into production.
