"Yes, every now and then we route a car over the T. \& P.," was the reply.
'Don't forget us when there is anything doing," said the Passenger Department man "Well what have you got to do with freight. I thought you were working in the Passenger De"artment," came the reply from the merchant You are right," was the rejoinder, "but I am working for the T. \& P., not especially for the Passenger Department. Every man on the payrolls of the company is urged to secure all the
basiness possible, whether that business be freight basiness possib
or passenger.'
"Well I've got a car going East today. The T. \& P. can have it," the merchant continued. The passenger man got out his notebook, made a memo of the movement, telephoned the Freight Bepartment and the routing was "cinched."
It is safe to say that the passenger official did not lase four minutes from his own department, and at the same time got some business that paid his salary for half a month. Such loyality and ajertness on the part of an employe, no matter in what department he is employed, will count in the reckoning, and will help swell the revenues find their way to betterments of service, track equipment, etc.
The business man with whom the passenger mán had a chance conversation was surprised that a man on the payroll of the Passenger Department would stop and "fool with" any freight matters.

The above is only one of many instances when an employe can work to the interest of his firm and increase their net business in that way. It never fails to increase the value of a man when he takes upon himself the interest of the people he is working for and does not content himself alone with putting in 8 or 9 hours per day as a machine does when it is forever pushed on by steam. Any man can work when there is steam behind him to drive him on, but it takes a self-bede-man to produce enough steam power within himself to make things go

It is safe to say that the passenger official did ot lose four minutes from his own department, and at the same time got some business that paid his salary for half a month. Such loyality and asertness on the part of an employe, no matter in what department he is employed, will count in the reckoning, and will help swell the revenues of the company. In due time these funds will find their way to betterments of service, track, equipment, etc,

The above is only one of many instances when an employe can work to the interest of his firm and increase their net business in that way.
