Roger W. Babson, the noted American statistician and economist, said in a recent address that one of the things greatly needed in modern business was religion. He advocated a return to the spirit of the Pilgrims. 'thrift, intelligence and judgment." Moreover, he declared that the most proffitable investment an employer can make is his interest shown in his employes. This would be his plan of procedure: "Pick out two or three employes and invest your time and money in them. Some one of them will become a gold mine for you. Don't follow the crowd." He said the biggest bank biggest store or biggest factory meant nothing if the employes of such institutions were not giving their full heart interest to their work. The solution of the industrial problem, he said, was to be found in educating the workers regarding their work, in making them feel the spirit of the thing produced. "The country has gone crazy on extravagance and over materials," he said, " and a period of depressoin is sure to follow. I believe the limit in consolidation and expansion has been reached and that we must now devote our time and thought to the education of the laborer."-Ft.




