SCHOOL LAW IN EFFECI MOMOAY

## WILL BULLD FWE

 HOME IN ABBLEEEFor thechildren living within the Merkel Independent school District, the compulsory school and after Monday Novemer and 1923. After that date all
children who are eight years of age and are under fourteen years of age must attend schoo for one-hundred consecutive $-\begin{aligned} & \text { school days or for five school } \\ & \text { months of twenty days each }\end{aligned}$ It does not matter if the child has already attended schoo
some or not, he must attend th full five months beginning on November 19. No one will be ex-
empt from the provisions of the above law because of distance,
chronic illness, etc., UNLESS first an exemption is secured
from the County SuperintendA child may be excused by he teacher for temporary ab sence due to sickness of the pup ily, quarantine, ily, quarantine, severe storm or eacher, PROVIDED the excuse is in writing and is signed by
the parent or guardian.
All children who are eight and under fourteen years of age must be in school on November 19th, and for five month comply with the law are sub ject to a heavy fine, each day of child's absence constituting a separate offense
Any person employing during school hours any child coming nder the provisions of thecom lect a fine of ten dollars a day for each such child employed each day constituting a separate offense.
It is expected the law will compliance as it has in Merkel in former years. To any parent
