FEED REQUIRED

FOR CHICKENS From time to time we recelve in-
quiries afking how much feed is re-
quired for producing chicens, says
the towa the Iowa Homestead. These people
appreciate that the feed cosit is one of
the important considerations the important considerations b rals-
ing poultry. Too often people believe
