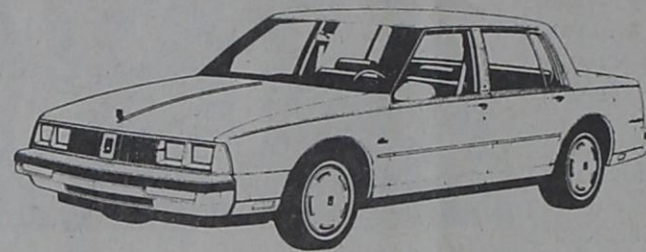

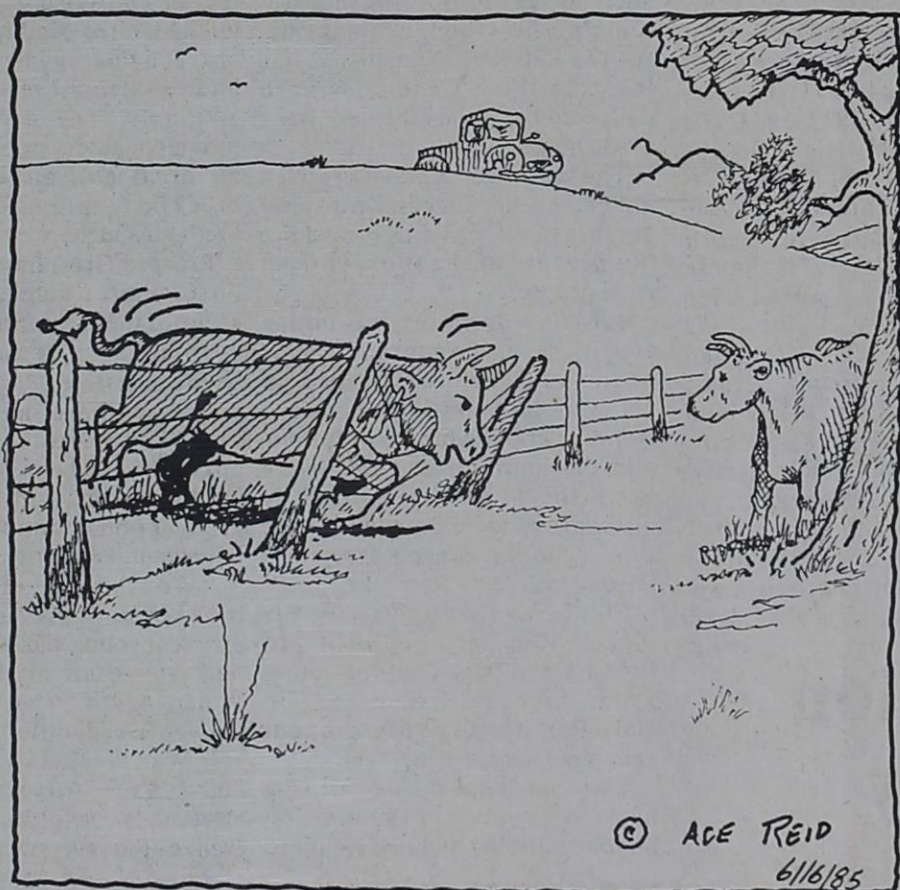

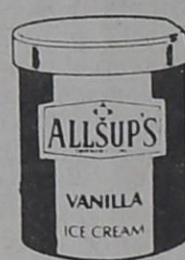

REFLECTIONS

From the files of The Bovina Blade

25 YEARS AGO--AUG. 3, 1960

A small but violent storm, packing high winds and spotted heavy hail, dumped almost an inch of rain on Bovina Friday night.

O.M. Hammonds, a Bovina businessman for the past 25 years, will move soon from the city that has been his home for the past 38 years. Ill health of a son was the reason given for the move.

F.W. Ayres, 77, died Saturday morning at 5 a.m. in Parmer County Community Hospital in Friona. He was a victim of a heart attack. Mr. Ayres moved to the Bovina area in 1916 and had lived here since that time.

Flamenco in the best club in Seville, Spain, where, for one hour and a half, they were entertained by a superb repertoire of Flamenco and regional dances.

They visited a short distance from Spain, and saw the fabled jewel of Tangier, a city of small flat-roofed houses, sprawling bazaars, prayer towers, and bearded men with their flowing robes and veiled women. All of this emersed them in Eastern culture.

They spent a day in the enchanting and fascinating city of Granada, ancient home of the Moors. They visited the famous Alhambra, a splendid example of Arab architecture, the beautiful Gardens of Generalife. The ladies said the wine in the restaurants was always free, but they had to buy their bottled water. They spent time eating at the little bars and grills and they had noticed that in many of them, there were soiled napkins crumpled and piled on the floor. They were told this was a sign that it was a good eating place, and to never eat where there weren't napkins on the floors.

They saw so many lovely castles, cathedrals and much of the countryside. They were delighted that they made the trip and thought it was well worth their time and money!

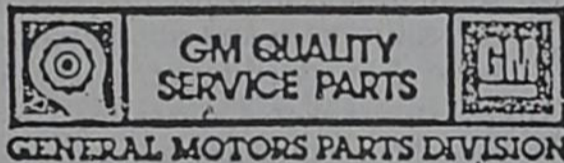
