## From The Chief's Desk

This week's topic is automobiles operated upon Texas Highways with out-of-state license plates. We have a number of residents in Bovina who are operating motor vehicles which are registered in New Mexico. The laws state in Vernon's Civil Statutes Article 6675a-2 REGISTRATION:

(a) Every owner of a motor vehicle, trailer or semi-trailer, other than an all-terrain vehicle, used or to be used upon the public highways of this state, shall apply each year to the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation through the County Tax Collector of the county in which he resides for the registration of each such vehicle owned or controlled by him for the ensuing or current calendar year or unexpired portion thereof; provided that where a public highway separates lands under the dominion or control of the owner, the operation of such motor vehicle by such owner, his agent or employees, across such highway shall not constitute a use of such motor vehicle upon a public highway of this state.

A person who resides and works or has been gainfully employed in the state of Texas has 30 days to register all of his vehicles in this state. The laws state that the vehicle must be registered in the state in which the owner lives, regardless of Post Office Boxes in other states.

The registration laws will be strictly enforced in the future and your co-operation in compliance to these laws will be appreciated.

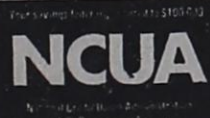

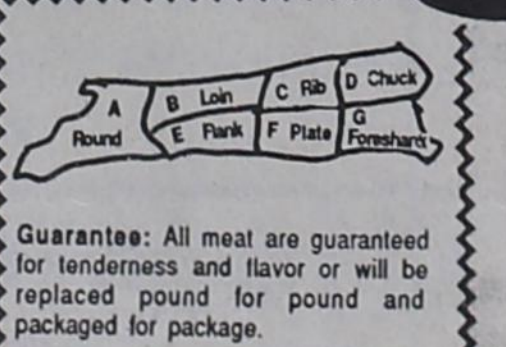
