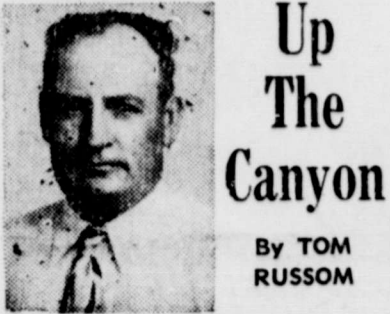

Registration of students in the Merkel School System will be held on Monday, Aug. 25, with regular classwork beginning Tuesday, Aug. 26, according to Mack Fisher, superintendent.

Freshmen and sophomores of Merkel High School will begin registering at 10 a.m. Monday and junior and senior students will register at 1:30 p.m. Students in grades 1-8 will also register at their respective buildings at 1:30 p.m.

Faculty meetings will be held Monday morning prior to student registration, said Fisher.

AUGUST 16 DEADLINE FOR FILING REFUNDS

AUSTIN, July 25 - Attorney General Crawford C. Martin today urged Texas consumers to check their records and file refund claims for broad spectrum antibiotics purchased during the years 1954 through 1966.

August 16, 1969, is the deadline

for mailing a notarized claim to the Clerk, United States District Court, P. O. Box 745, Bronx, New York 10451.

Texas consumers will receive a share of \$100 million offered by five large drug manufacturers in settlement of multiple civil antitrust actions filed against them by Martin and the Attorneys General of other states.

Forms may be picked up at the County Clerk's office in each Texas county or clipped from this newspaper.

The drugs involved are Aureomycin, Terramycin, Achromycin, Mysterlin, Panalba, Panmycin, Polycycline, Steclin, Tetracycl and Tetrex.

"Thousands of Texans are eligible to make claims and I hope they will avail themselves of the opportunity," the Attorney General said.

Cafeteria Meals Served Aug. 26

School superintendent Mack Fisher said that meals will be served in the cafeteria beginning Tuesday, Aug. 26.

Prices for meals will be 30 cents for grades 1 through 4; 35 cents for grades 5 through eight, and 40 cents for students grades 9 through 12.

Faculty members will also pay 40 cents for meals and fifty cents will be charged to other adults who eat at the cafeteria, said Fisher.

Parents are urged to purchase lunch tickets on a monthly basis, said Fisher. Charges are grades 1-4, \$6 per month; grades 5-8, \$7, and grades 9-12, \$8.00.


**Pvt. Gary Doan

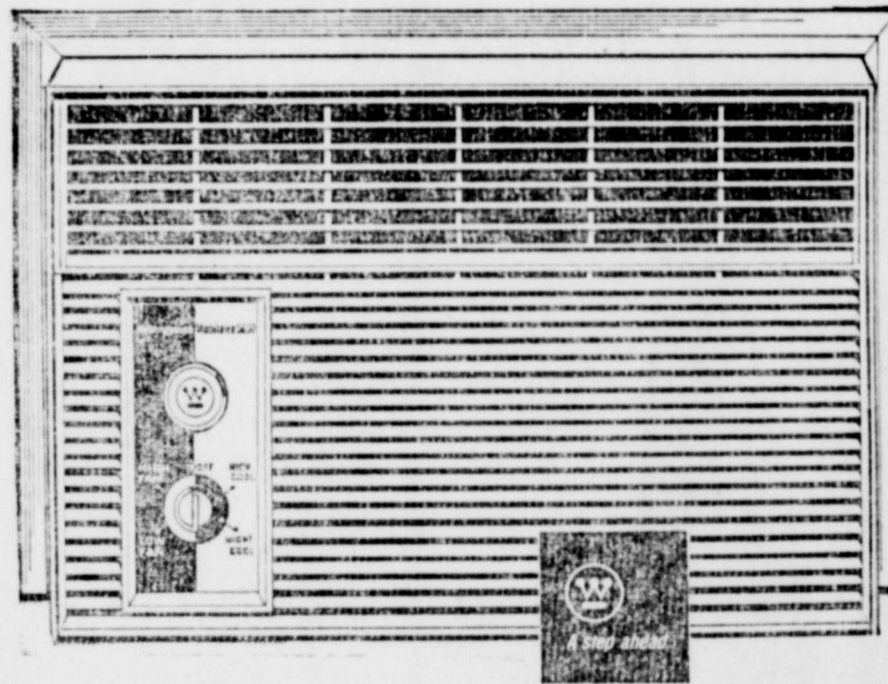

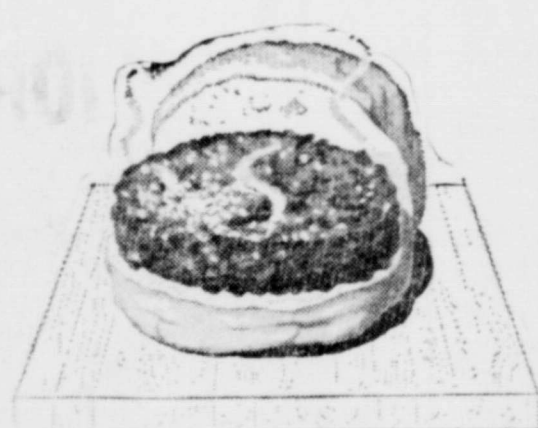
