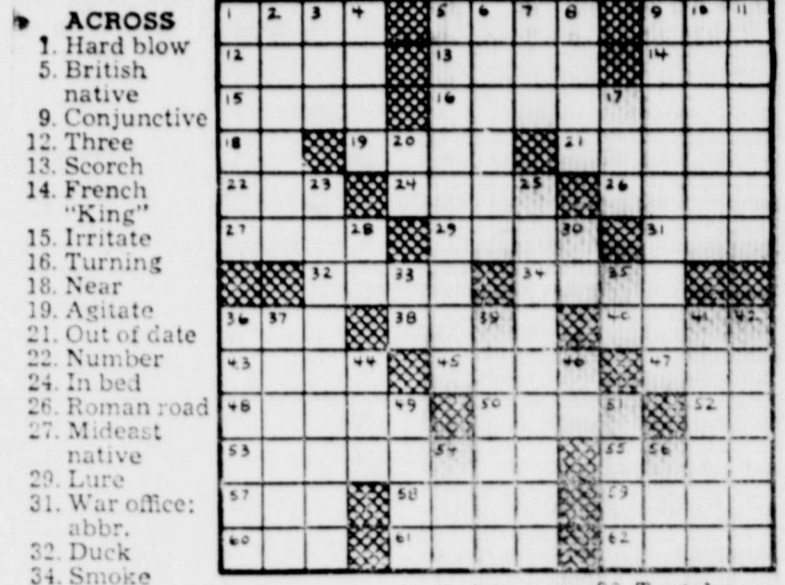

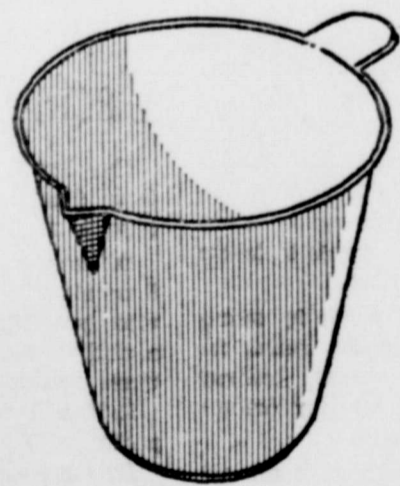

to be husband and wife, (2) living together as husband and wife, and (3) holding themselves out to the public as husband and wife," said Malone. "Such marriage has always been valid, whether registered or not."

Calhoun explained, "There is one other provision in the new Family Code which I, as a lawyer, find particularly significant. Section 2-41 provides that the parents, or a friend, which in this case could be the court, has the right to have a common law marriage annulled as long as the boy is under 18 years of age and the girl is under 18 years of age. Under the law that is in existence at this time, an annulment proceeding can not be brought by a parent on behalf of his or her child, but must be brought by one of the parties to the marriage. We now are giving parents a great deal more control in giving them the right to petition the court to annul a marriage of an underage child. This, in my opinion, is a great step forward and will insure against any abuse of the declaration of marriage provision in the new law."

**VIET WAR WIDOWS ELIGIBLE FOR BENEFITS**

Widows of Vietnam veterans are eligible for death indemnity compensation, pensions, and all other benefits to which widows of veterans of all wars are entitled, as a result of Public Law 95-77 enacted in 1977, the Veterans Administration reports.

And in answer to one Merkel mother's letter of concern, he says, "The public has let its emotions carry it too far off base about common law marriage provisions for teeny boppers in the new marriage and divorce code which goes into effect Jan. 1. The new laws don't change a thing about either teenagers or common law marriages. The new code will make it somewhat possible for the state to keep track of common law marriages by setting up a registration system."

In a release from Austin, Orba Lee Malone of El Paso says: "Some parents and others have the idea that the Legislature threw the door wide open to common law marriage for minors. This just isn't true."

"The only change in the new law is a provision for recording such marriages when they meet three requirements that have long been established for common law marriages of minors or anyone else."

Malone pointed out that youngsters of this age have always been able to form common law marriages without parental consent if they meet the three requirements of common law marriage. "The requirements are (1) agree

**The Most Historic Call**



WASHINGTON, D.C.—An original drawing (above) depicting "the most historic telephone call ever made" has been revealed in behalf of President Nixon by Michael Farrell, Staff Assistant to the President.

The presentation was made by the artist, Paul Calle, at the annual luncheon of the Independent Telephone Pioneers Association, held in conjunction with the United States Independent Telephone Association convention in Washington, D.C. Mr. Calle is the designer of the Apollo moon stamp issued September 9. "The most historic telephone call ever made," were words used by President Nixon during his epic conversation with lunar astronauts Armstrong and Aldrin. The drawing, commissioned by the Elgin Electronics subsidiary of Basic Incorporated is the interpretation of this call as conceived by Mr. Calle. Elgin is a supplier of equipment to the telephone industry. Mr. Calle has been a participant in NASA's Fine Art Program since 1963 and has rendered both drawings and paintings of Mercury, Gemini and Apollo flights. He is presently under a NASA commission to document, artistically, the lunar landing and return processes. As part of this effort, Mr. Calle was present for the July 16 luncheon breakfast and sitting up procedures for the Apollo 11 crew at Cape Kennedy.

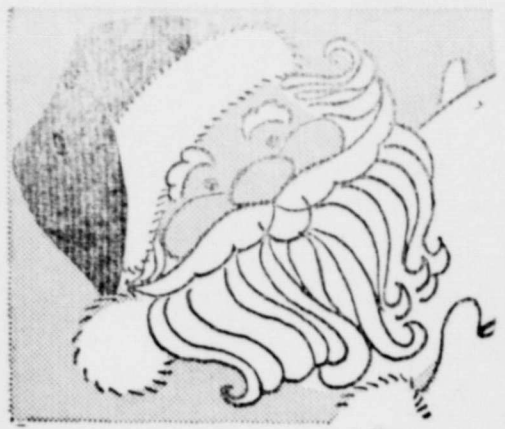

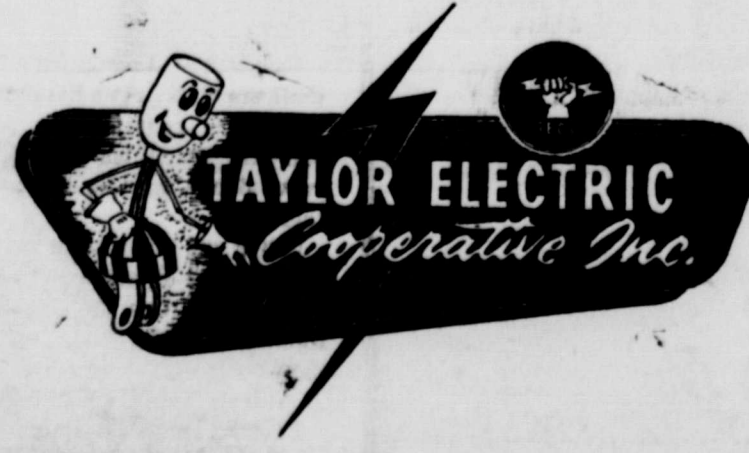

**THE SEASON OF THANKSGIVING**

"Mother was the first one up," is the way a friend of mine put it as he described his childhood memories of Thanksgiving Day.

"She simply couldn't sleep even a little late — holiday or not — with everything she had on her mind," he continued.

"The turkey had to be stuffed, sewn up, and dressed off with strips of salt pork. It would be hours in the oven, emitting glorious odors that increased as the dinner hour drew nearer.

**A Real Feast**

"Turnips and potatoes would be put to boil, for later mashing. Other vegetables, salad, appetizers, gravy, pumpkin pie, beverages such as milk and coffee — all these were prepared. And the family table would groan under it all, along with our best glassware, china, and silver.

"As a boy, I found it so exciting I was glad to participate by polishing apples and oranges and arranging them in bowls with walnuts and other goodies.

"The morning of Thanksgiving, in other words, was one busy time for all of us. But the beauty of it was we all were zoned in on one the same main event. We were operating as a team.

"I think we learned something from this. And similarly at Christmas, we really operated as a

family and now that I'm grown up I look back on those particular holidays as the times when I was most family conscious."

Well, I think my friend says it very well — that Thanksgiving is something more than just a day of plentiful eating. Truly we celebrate not only our good fortune in having enough food but in sharing our humanness as well.

The earliest harvest Thanksgiving in America, of course, was held by the Pilgrim Fathers at Plymouth in 1621 and history books tell us it was repeated often during that century. During the American Revolution and after, Thanksgiving was the last Thursday in November. In 1941, Congress made it official that the fourth Thursday in November would be Thanksgiving Day.

**The Hungry Americans**

And let's not forget that there are Americans who are hungry — all year 'round. Leaders in our country are trying to assess the full extent of malnutrition and its relationship to disease in the United States. It isn't to be tolerated that in the midst of our affluence some citizens are poorly nourished, either from lack of food or lack of knowledge on how to eat.
