HORO-MESSAGES FOR THE MOON from 74 heads

of state plus four U.S. documents are contained on this 1 inch diameter silicon wafer in a Time Capsule left on the moon by the Apollo 11 astronauts.

The messages were reduced to 1/200th of their original size by a new information technology process developed by the Sprague Electric Company Semiconductor Division. Worcester, Mass.

By etching the micro-messages in an ultra-thin, 4millionths of an inch, quartz (sificon dioxide) coating on the silicon wafer, a record able to withstand the extreme conditions of space will remain permanently on the moon to signify the historic event.

The Sprague process allows the pin-head sized messages to withstand temperatures over 1800°F indefinitely, something far beyond the abilities of microfilm and other previous micro-reproduction techniques.
