not be done is scratching-be cause that never solves any-
thing and often ageravates condition. For discomfort due a
conales a to dry skin, many dermatolo-
gists suggest the use of a therapeutic bath oll like Alpha Keri
to restore to the skin surface many of the lost natural olls.
A capfuu of Alpha Keri added
to to the bath water coats the
skin with a thin protective fflm
that "locks in" moisture. Popular home reme-
