Once the fall spraying or dusting jobs are completed, the county agent suggests these additional maintenance practices. Nozze's and strainer screens should be soaked in kerosene. A wire should be run through the spray rods to make sure they are clean. All hose on the sprew rig should be cleaned and stored where they will not crack or freeze.

Before putting the cleaned power sprayer away for the winter, Stanley suggests pouring at least a pint of new or used oil in the tank, filling it with water and starting the pump. As the water is discharged, a thin coating of oil will cover the inside of the tank, pump, valves and circulating system. The sprayer should then be drained and stored in a

Dusters, like sprayers, says the county agent, should be thoroughly cleaned to prevent caking. clogging and eventual corrosion.

All pesticides materials should All slip joints should be given be removed from the equipment a protective coating after cleaning and before storage.

For other details on cleaning and storage, the county agent recommends that the manufacturer's manual be followed.




