VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL TO BEGIN MONDAY, JULY 31

Vacation Bible School will be held at First Baptist Church beginning July 31 and continuing through August 4, pastor Kenneth F. Jones has announced.

The school will begin each morning at 8:30 and will dismiss daily at 11:30. Included in the activities will be worship time, Bible study, mission study, arts and crafts and recreation. Refreshments will be served daily also.

The school is intended for boys and girls ages 3 through 12, and classes will be divided according to public school grading. Classes will be available for children up through the seventh grade.

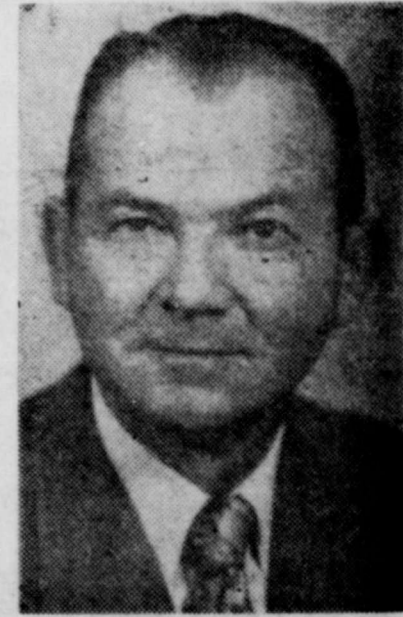
Chester Collinsworth, Vo-Ag teacher at Merkel High School, will attend the annual workshop, which plans programs for the coming year.

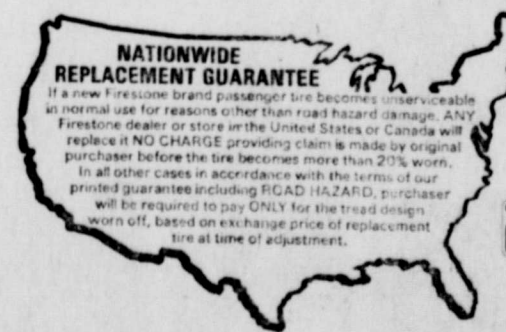

What Is Christian Love? (Part 2)

Christian love is not directed toward the world and the things in it — I John 2:12-17; 5:2-17; cf 2 Timothy 4:10. Neither does it value the praises of men more than the praises of God (I John 12:43; Gal. 1:10).

Christian love is not the mystical quest of "eros" (born of natural desire — wof loves the lamb type thing) of the Greek Philosophers in which the human spirit strives upward for the Divine. Man responds to God's love with love (I John 4:10, 11, 19). However, this love is an obedient love, not a sentimental feeling. "Love God and keep his commandments" are correlatives if not synonymous expressions (Exodus 20:6; Deut. 5:10; I Kings 3:3; Nehemiah 1:5). "To serve him, to walk in his ways, to love him" — Deuteronomy 10:12; 11:22; Isaiah 56:6 — all have the same meaning. All of the heart (Intelligence, will, emotions, and conscience), soul, strength, and mind — the whole being — is involved in this love (Matthew 22:37). To love Jehovah is to "hear the voice of Jehovah and to cleave to him." (Deut. 30:20)

One of our most extensive descriptions of the characteristics of this love is inspired by Paul's statements in I Corinthians 13. It is a love directed toward God and His Son, Jesus (I Cor. 16:22). Far from relieving a person of the need of heeding the details of the Will of God, Jesus said, "If you love me you will keep my commandments" — John 14:15, 23. The love of God is the keeping of his commandments (I John 5:2, 3; 2 John 6). The one who claims this love but does not keep his commandments is a "liar" (I John 2:3, 4, 5:2, 3). The one who loves God is known by Him, I Cor. 8:3.

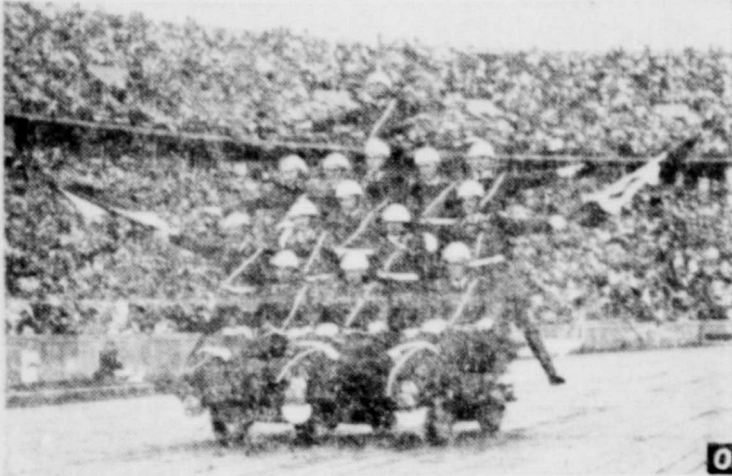

Berlin's Trick Riders Get Around



Daredevil trick riding, split-second timing, and spectacular balancing acts are specialties of the acrobatic motorcycle drill team of the West Berlin Police Department. One of their most thrilling stunts features a seventeen-man pyramid carried on only three bikes circling at close to forty miles per hour, all done with the grace and intricacy of professional figure skating. In Berlin, this act is a feature of the Police Force Tattoo that delights 100,000 residents and visitors at the city's huge Olympic Stadium.

The famous Berlin trick riders also present their program on visits to other cities in Germany, in other countries of Europe, and even on other continents. After their debut in 1952, these scores of visits have included their 1964 tour of the U.S., which started with their appearance for the Berlin Pavilion at the New York World's Fair. Since then they have performed at Expo '70 in Japan, will be in Munich for the 1972 Olympic Games in August-September, and are scheduled to pay a return visit to Osaka.
