## Three Die In Icy Road Crash

Three Bovina men died early Friday when the automobile in which they were riding hit a patch of ice and skidded in front of an oncoming 18-wheeler.

Mike Bermea, 21, Lorenzo Rocha, 22, and Raymon Rocha, 27, were pronounced dead at the scene by Parmer County Justice of the Peace Louise Hancock.

The accident occurred about a mile east of Farwell on U.S. 60 about 3:30 a.m., Parmer County Sheriff Rex Williams said.

The three men were eastbound on U.S. 60 in a two-door Toyota, Williams said. The truck was headed west.

Sheriff's deputies could not determine the speed of either vehicle because of icy conditions, Williams said.

Department of Public Safety troopers responded to about a half-dozen wrecks due to road conditions Thursday night and Friday morning, according to a DPS spokesman.

Also in Parmer County, an unloaded Friona school bus flipped onto its side about 7 a.m. Friday when the driver turned on the access road off FM 214 near Friona. No one was injured.

Driver Mary Stone was just starting out on her route and had no passengers. On the south side of the overpass, the bus slid onto its side as she was attempting the wide turn. She sustained minor injuries.

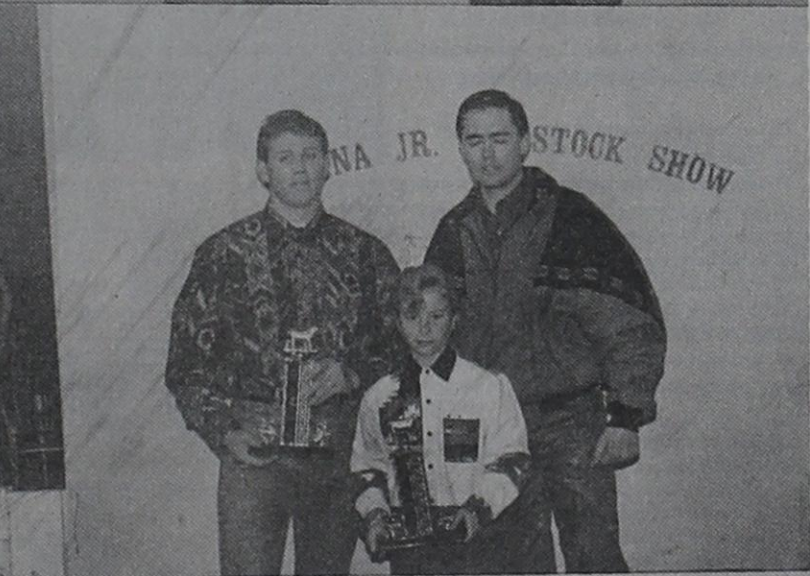






Lorenzo Lynn Rocha, 22, of Bovina, was killed in an automobile accident, January 21, 1994 near Farwell, Texas.

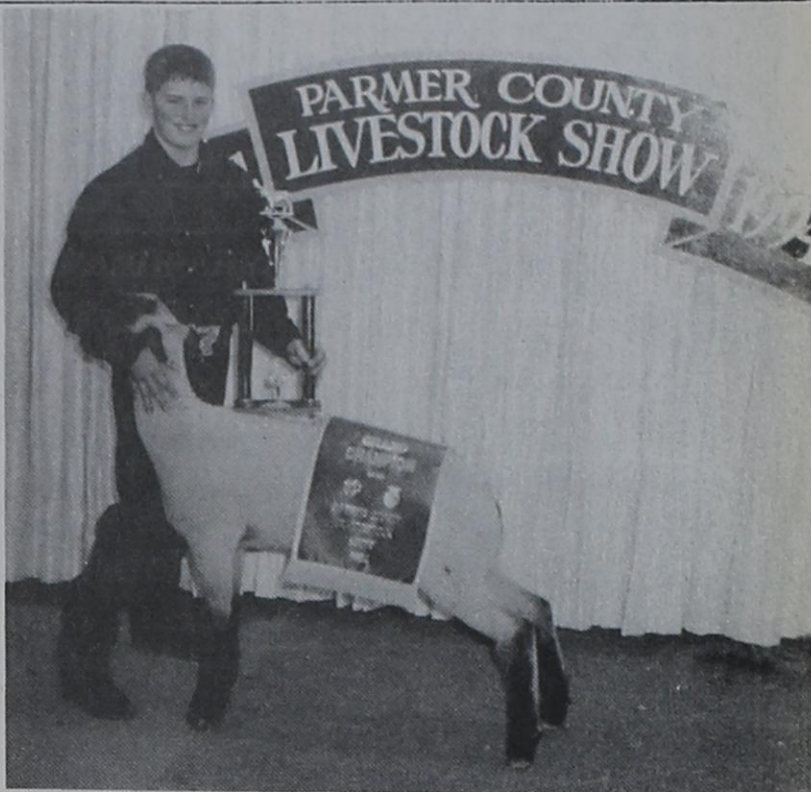

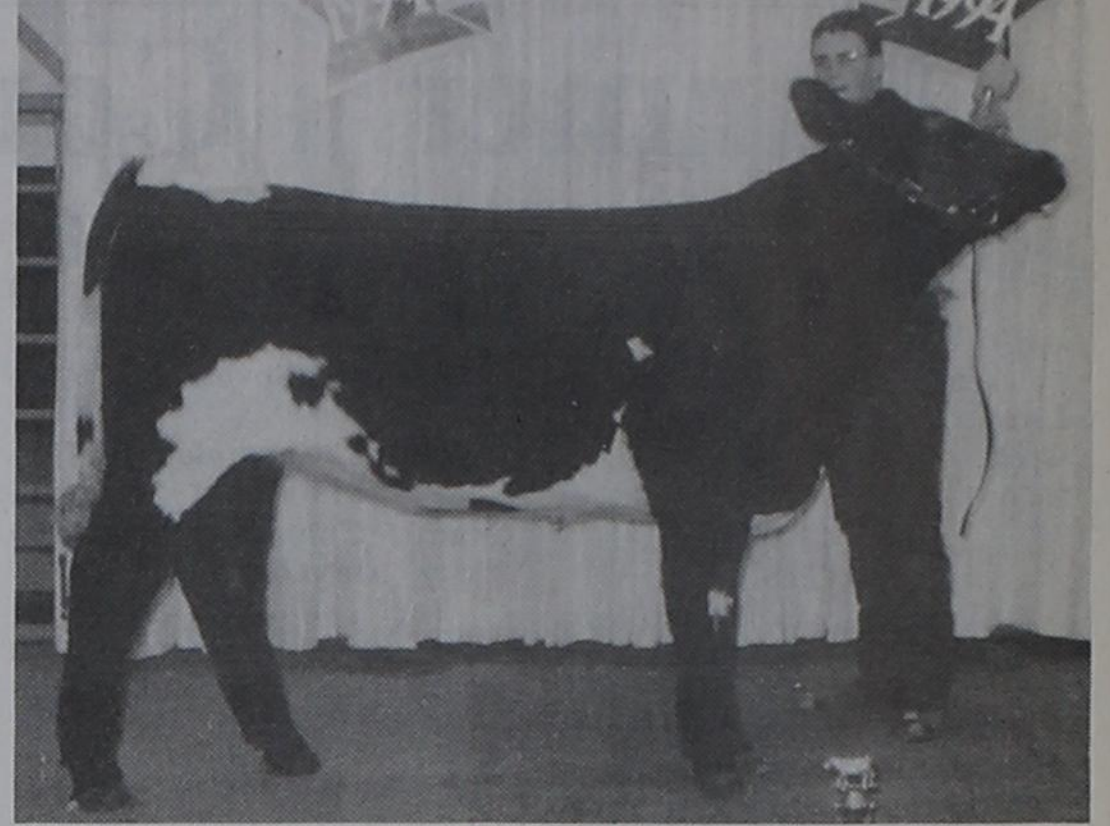

## St. Treasurer

State Comptroller John Sharp has congratulated State Treasurer Martha Whitehead for contracting with the Comptroller's Office to collect, audit and enforce the state tobacco tax.

"Critics of this plan are just blowing smoke," Sharp said. "We have consulted with the Attorney General regarding this interagency contract. It's a very routine procedure for state agencies to contract with one another to provide services, and in this instance, it's the cheapest way to get the job done."

"By providing tobacco tax collection and enforcement services for the State Treasury, we can cut the number of workers required to perform those duties in half and save Texas taxpayers more than a half million dollars during this biennium."

Sharp says his office will be able to collect the tobacco tax more efficiently than the Treasury, making the most of a revenue source which has declined steadily as tobacco sales have declined.

"I don't mind if we collect less tax because people are kicking the tobacco habit. But if anybody has a habit of not paying taxes on tobacco products, I'll cure them of it," Sharp said.

He was a farmer/rancher in the Friona area, was a past member of the Friona American Legion Post 206, was named "Man of the Year" by the Friona Chamber of Commerce in 1962, was an Army veteran of World War II, a member of Calvary Baptist Church and Friona Lions Club.

## FmHA Farm Borrowers Restructure Debts

"Farmers with loans from the U. S. Department of Agriculture's Farmers Home Administration (FmHA) may be able to put flood-damaged land under conservation easements in exchange for a reduction in their debt," George Ellis, FmHA State Director, said today.

Use of the easements is not limited to flood areas, but it may be particularly helpful in such areas.

"Eligible lands may include wetlands, marginal farmland, highly erodible land, woodland, wildlife area, and several other," Ellis said. "In certain areas, there may be instances where farmland was damaged so severely by the recent flooding that restoring it may cost more than its agricultural value."

"In those cases, a conservation easement may be a solution. Under this program, a voluntary easement can be placed on a portion of the land in return for a reduction in the

Bowie was an Amarillo resident and Palm was an amateur photographer who lived on a ranch in the vicinity of Washburn, Texas. # Happy Homemaker

By JUNE FLOYD

This week we are borrowing these recipes from Donna Mitchell of Bovina. Donna and her husband, Larry, are long time residents of Bovina and have been active in that city's Volunteer Ambulance Service for at least fifteen years.

She's the daughter of Martha and the late Wendell Garner and a 1971 graduate of Friona High School.

Some of her favorite recipes are:

### CARROT CAKE

2 cups sugar  
1-1/4 cups Crisco oil  
3 eggs  
Flat can crushed pineapple, drained well  
1 cup angel flake coconut  
2 cups finely grated carrots  
1 teaspoon vanilla

Beat the oil into sugar until it dissolves. Add the eggs, beating well after each addition. Add the remaining ingredients.

Sift together:

2 cups plus 1 tablespoon flour  
2 teaspoons soda  
1 teaspoon salt  
1 teaspoon cinnamon

Add 1 cup chopped pecans dredged in a little flour. Bake in an 8x16 or 8x8x2 loaf pan at 350 degrees. Test the cake at 30 minutes.

### ICING

8 ounce package Philadelphia cream cheese, softened  
1/4 cup lemon juice or less  
1 pound sifted confectioners sugar and a little grated lemon rind

### WHOLE WHEAT POUND CAKE

2 sticks butter, soft  
2 cups sugar  
5 eggs  
2 tablespoons vanilla  
2 tablespoons honey  
Dash salt  
1-3/4 cup whole wheat flour  
1/2 cup white flour

Beat butter well, add sugar beating at medium speed. Add

eggs, one at a time, then remaining ingredients, flour last. Beat well. Pour into a greased and floured 10" tube pan. Bake at 300 degrees for one hour and then at 325-350 degrees until brown. Cool five minutes. Turn out on rack.

**KAROB FUDGE BROWNIES**  
3/4 cup sifted whole wheat flour  
1/2 teaspoon low, sodium baking powder

1/4 teaspoon salt substitute  
4 tablespoons Karob powder  
1/3 cup melted butter  
1/2 cup honey  
2 eggs  
1/2 cup chopped nuts or sunflower seeds  
1 teaspoon vanilla

Combine flour, salt and baking powder and sift. Add Karob to melted butter, add honey to eggs, and Karob mixture to egg mixture, then add to flour mixture. Spread in oiled 9x9x2 pan. Bake 25-30 minutes at 350 degrees.

### CHEESE NUT ROLL

By Waneta Taylor

1/2 pound butter  
1 pound Velveeta cheese  
1-3 ounce package cream cheese  
2 teaspoons Worcestershire Sauce  
2 teaspoons paprika  
2 teaspoons A-1 Sauce  
2 teaspoons onion juice

Let butter and cheese soften. Mix with hands. Mix all ingredients except nuts. Put on waxed paper and shape into log or balls. Chill until firm. Press toasted nuts all over log or ball. Keep refrigerated.

### CARAMEL CORN

8 quarts popped corn  
1-1/2 cups white sugar  
1-1/2 cups brown sugar  
1 cup oleo  
1/2 cup white Karo  
1 teaspoon salt

## Screening Date Is Set At Hospital

On Tuesday, February 15, from 10 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., the Don and Sybil Harrington Cancer Center and High Plains Baptist Hospital

Mobile Mammography Unit will be in Friona, at Parmer County Community Hospital, 1307 Cleveland.

Exams are done by appointment only. For information or to schedule an appointment, call 1-800-377-HOPE, (4673) or (806) 359-4673.

The total cost of the screening is \$70.00. This includes the X-ray, physical breast exam and the radiology fee for reading the mammogram. Funding has been provided by the Texas Department of Health to allow for free breast screenings for women who qualify.

The major goal of the clinic is the early detection of breast cancer. The clinic provides low cost screening which includes a breast exam by a Registered Nurse trained in breast cancer detection, teaching of breast self-examination and a mammogram.

Currently, the most effective method known to win the battle against breast cancer is early detection. Early detection is best done by following the guidelines recommended by the American Cancer Society for breast cancer screening for women who have no signs or symptoms of breast cancer.

Breast screening guidelines recommended by the American Cancer Society are: (1) Learn and perform breast self-examination every month; (2) Have a physical examination every year; (3) Have a mammogram according to the recommendations by age: age 40, one baseline mammogram; 40-49, a mammogram every 1-2 years; 50 and over, yearly mammograms.

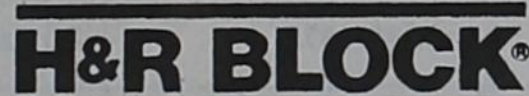

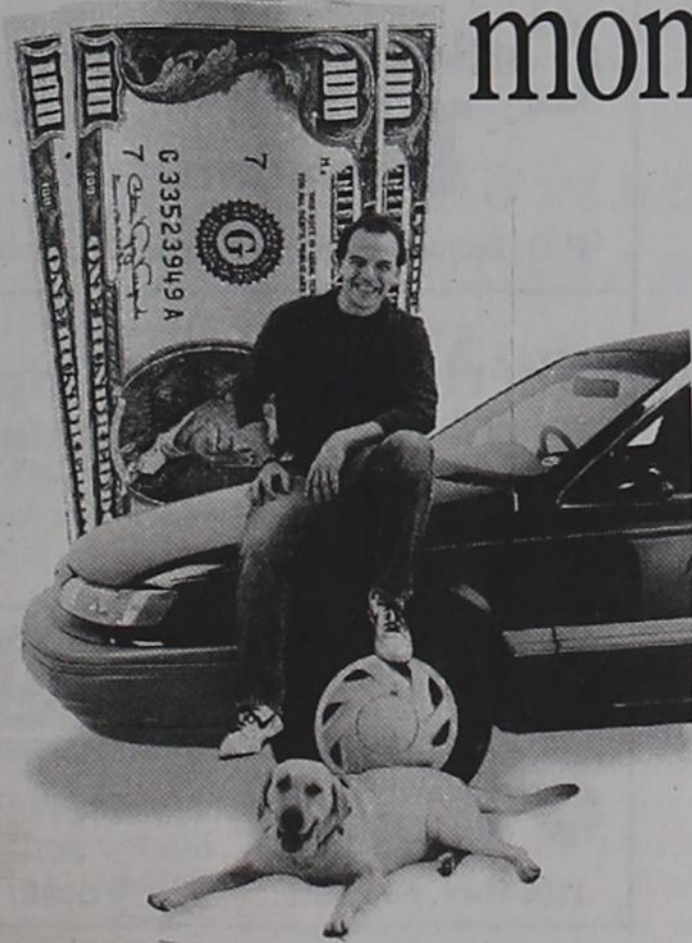

# Scooter's Scoops

If you are over sixty or have a relative who is, this may be of interest. It is a news release we received: --If you think the world grows colder as you grow older, you're right--sort of, according to the American Medical Association, the aging body becomes progressively less able to maintain an even temperature when subjected to external cold.

In addition, the body mechanism that normally detects a drop in external temperature begins to lose its sensitivity as you age. As a result, some older people don't realize they are becoming chilled and may suffer from hypothermia.

If you're over 60, or live with someone who is, doctors recommend that you look out for listlessness, drowsiness, slurred speech, and mental impairment after spending time in a cold room.

Hypothermia treatment generally requires a medical professional. While you're waiting for help, you can warm the person gradually by turning up the heat, adding warm clothes and blankets, and giving warm (but definitely not alcoholic) drinks. A warm but not hot bath may help, too.

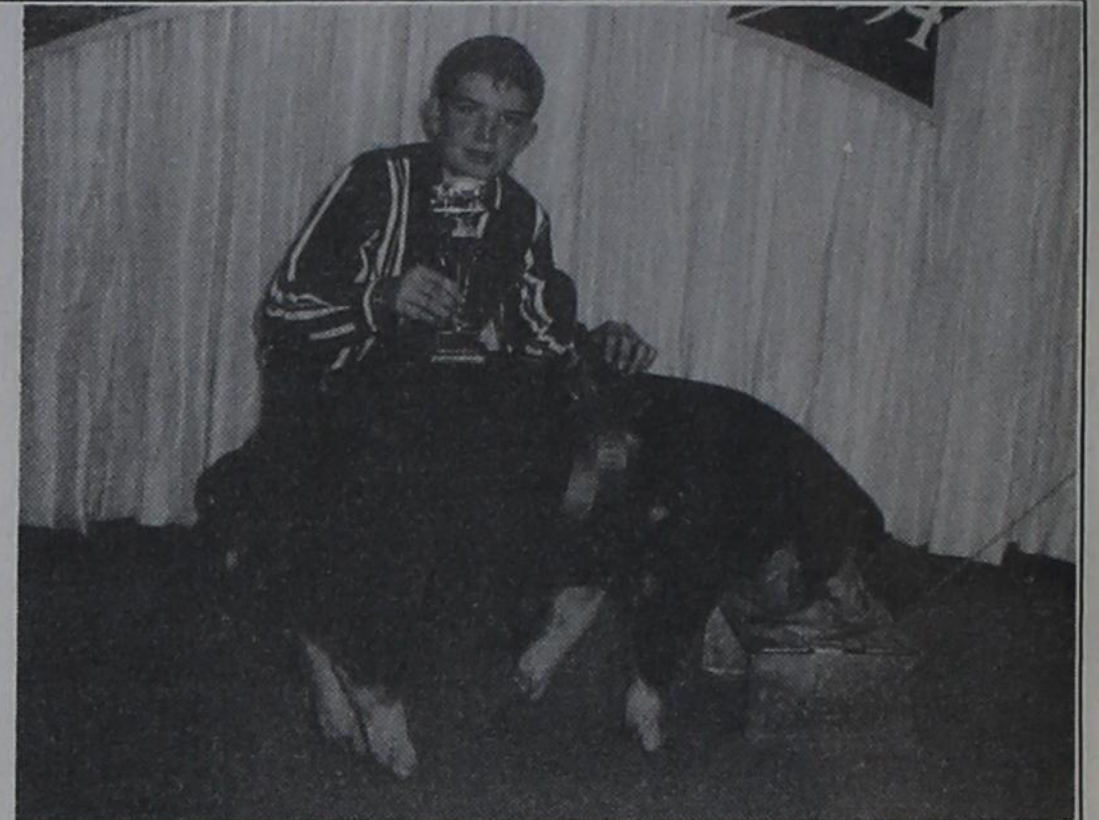

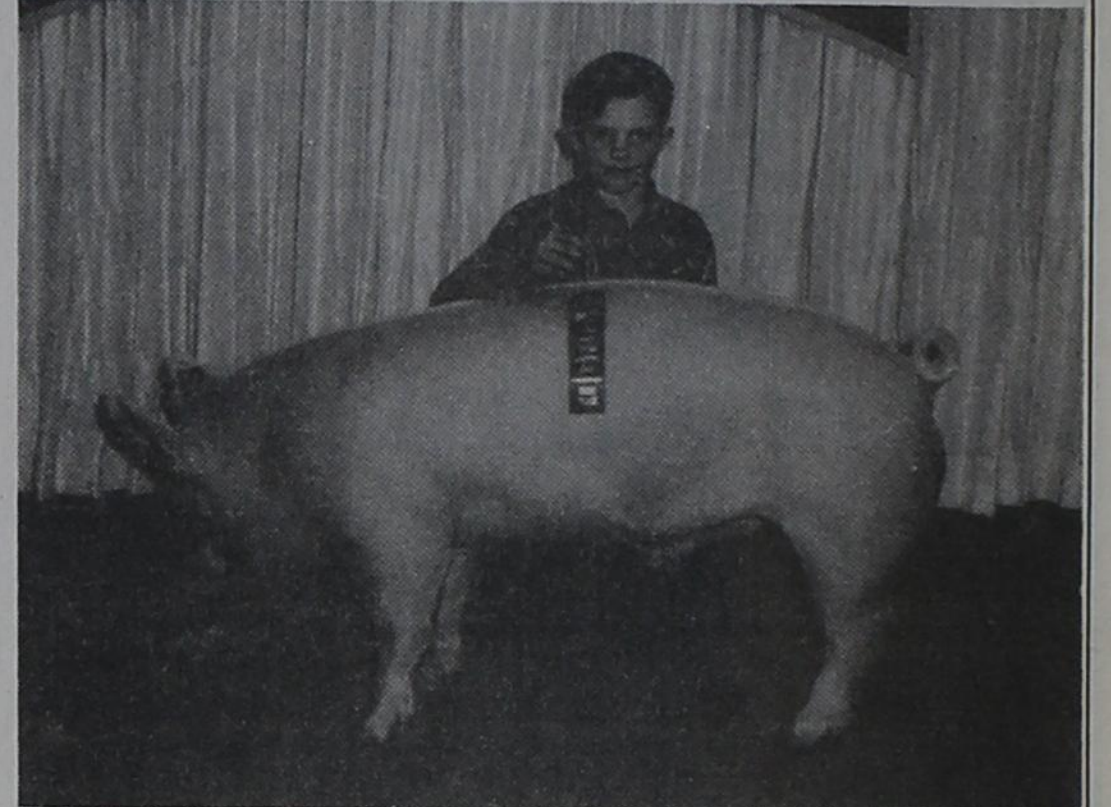

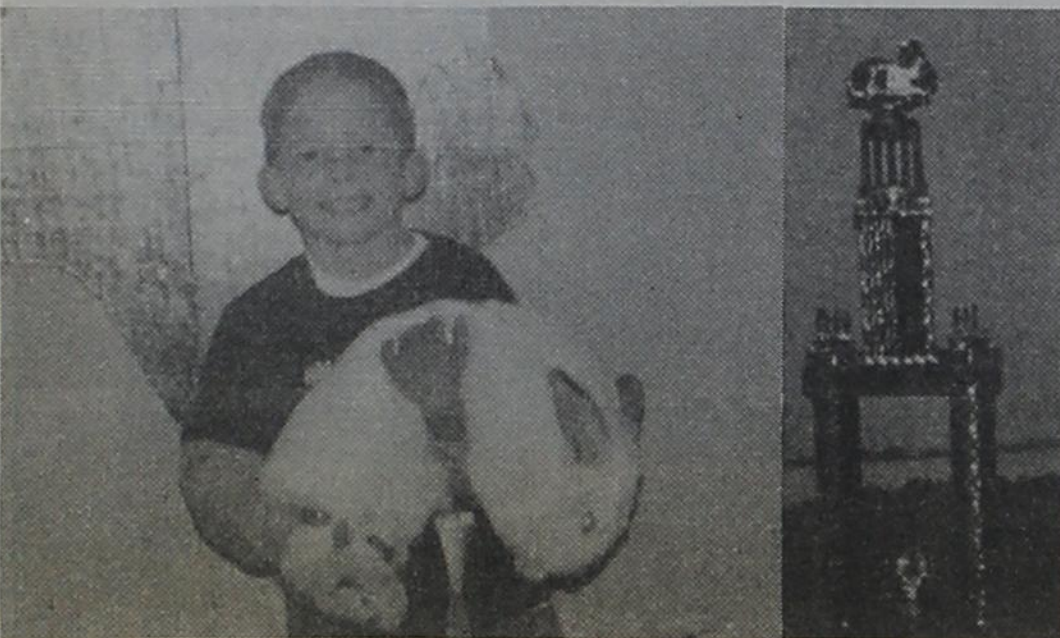
