# Whisenhunt issue remains unresolved for School Board

Dink Whisenhunt didn't miss Monday's School Board meeting.

Whisenhunt was not present for the swearing in ceremonies of the new board members at the April 13 meeting and his seat on the board was declared vacant on a technicality.

When Whisenhunt discovered what had happened, naturally he was upset. So were some of the 277 people who voted him to a 3 year term.

So, when the Board got around to reading and approving the minutes of the previous five meetings, Whisenhunt had his say Monday night.

Whisenhunt pointed out he had attended the April 6 meeting for the purpose of being sworn in. However, at that meeting no action was taken by the former board on canvassing and accepting the vote count until legal advice could be secured on Whisenhunt's eligibility.

At that time it was discovered that Whisenhunt had failed to register to vote 30 days prior to the April 3 School Board election.

He registered March 26. He will be an eligible voter April 26.

"I was called at 1 p.m. April 6 and told to bring my voter registration slip to the meeting that night," Dink said. "I spent the rest of the afternoon in County Tax Assessor Burl King's office in Abilene calling Austin and

getting a notarized letter stating that I had registered to vote."

However, he admitted not registering to vote in time but said he voted in the election.

"I also was told April 6 that the meeting was for swearing in but there was no swearing in," he said.

The April 6 minutes reflect that the procedure was postponed until after the legal advice of school attorney Bryan Bradbury could be secured.

Before the April 13 meeting, Dink received a letter from School Superintendent Mack Fisher stating that he would be ineligible

to be sworn in as a member of the Merkel School Board. The letter was dated April 9.

In the last paragraph of the letter Fisher invited Dink to attend the board meeting "Tuesday evening, 7:30 o'clock."

"After receiving a letter like that you can see how I felt and you can understand why I didn't attend the Meet-

ing," Dink said.

He also said he did not receive an official notice of the agenda of the April 13

meeting which announced canvassing of the vote and swearing in of candidates.

"Had I received such a notice I would have been present," he stated.

He added, "There were 277 voting for me and I do

want to serve."

Fisher admitted that there was no official notice mailed to Whisenhunt, just the invitation in the letter notifying him of the ineligibility.

The letter:

"According to a legal opinion based on Article 23.19 of the Texas Education Codes and on Art. 5.02, and 5.13 (a) of the Texas Election Codes, it appears that you would be ineligible to be sworn in as a member of the Merkel School Board.

"Dink, I hope that this incident will not discourage you in future participations in community affairs.

"If you care to read the legal opinion as given to me you can read it in my office. Also, if you care to attend the board meeting Tuesday evening, 7:30 o'clock, you would be welcome. Best wishes."

Then, Monday night before the minutes could be approved, Dink arose and had his say.

"Why didn't I receive an agenda from the School on

City Council meets

The Merkel City Council will hold its regularly scheduled meeting Monday. The meeting at City Hall will start at 5:30 p.m.

There is not anybody trying to make any reflections on you," Jacobs told Whisenhunt.

Dink replied, "I didn't know they were going to administer the oath the 13th, I was here for that purpose the 6th."

Board member Jerry Gibson then said, "I think the main thing is you couldn't take the oath because you were ineligible."

"If I had received an agenda April 13 I would have been here," Dink said again. Other

new board members admitted receiving an agenda of the meeting.

"Other members received an agenda, Dink Whisenhunt did not receive an agenda," Whisenhunt said, maintaining his composure.

He then said he wanted "everyone on the board to accept my apologies for getting in this mess."

After another assurance that the Board's action was no reflection on Whisenhunt, Dink sought an answer to "If I'd been here could I have been sworn in?"

There was no firm answer. Dink then said "There were 277 people voting for me and I have received several calls asking why I was not there."

Instead of naming a replacement for Whisenhunt's seat at the April 13 meeting the board elected to determine if Whisenhunt would be eligible to serve if they wait until after April 26 and vote him in.

The Secretary of State has not replied to the question yet.

Whisenhunt's term was for three years but the Board can only appoint a replacement for a year, until the next election.

The Board is the final authority on naming a replacement.

The minutes were then approved.

Dink was present for the entire three hours of the open meeting.

# Lions Club survey supports Center

Mrs. Chera Hohertz of Lambda Beta Chapter of Beta Phi was guest speaker at the Merkel Lions Club meeting Tuesday.

She explained the purpose of the Chapter and announced the beauty pageant is set for the High School auditorium Saturday at 7 p.m.

She was introduced by Max Murrell.

Mrs. Hohertz said Lambda Beta was founded in Merkel in 1950 and since that time they have worked with the Little League teams, the Rehab Center, visiting rest homes, sponsoring state projects and that there are presently 18 active members in the Merkel group.

"The pageant will have a Fantasyland theme, she said and will 'even have a real pink tree on stage Saturday night.'

The contest will include five age groups and she thanked the merchants for making the annual money raising project possible through their active support.

Mrs. Hohertz and her husband operate a dairy west of Merkel.

Murrell then took up the rest of the allotted time on the program, explaining how government intervention has

grown and is getting out of control.

He gave various examples of how government hampers private enterprise. For instance he pointed out that in 1974 General Motors spent \$1.3 billion to comply with federal regulations which was much more than it cost the federal government to operate for the first 75 years of its existence.

He pointed out that on this 200th anniversary it is time to start limiting government intervention and controls of private enterprise. Murrell also pointed out that with the continued intervention of government in auto manufacturing, the cost of cars will soar so high an individual will no longer be able to afford one.

In other business the proposed pancake supper for April 30 was postponed until this fall after chairman Mike Couch resigned.

The light bulb, mop and broom sale is set for May 18.

Committee Chairman Fred Starbuck reported on the feasibility of promoting a new civic center for Merkel.

He reported on a survey his committee conducted.

They contacted 23 organizations and received 12 replies, representing 264 members and one club with 16 members who voted said no to all four questions on the survey.

The survey said a committee has been formed by the Lions Club to try to determine whether or not it is feasible to try to promote a Civic Center building in Merkel that will belong to the Community.

Question No. 1: Does your organization feel that there is a need? The vote was 11-1 for.

No. 2: If a center is built, would your organization have a need for it's facilities?

It carried 10-2. Also it was asked how many times a month the facilities would be used and the total was 76 times.

No. 3: Would your organization be willing to support the construction financially, by holding periodic money raising events? Voting was 8-3 yes.

No. 4: Would your organization be willing to support it financially after construction, by paying a fair rental fee, based upon each time you use it? Yes votes were 10-1.

Starbuck then recommended the Lions Club turn the findings over to the Merkel Chamber of Commerce.

It also was recommended that should a Civic Center be built the Lions Club property be sold and that the Lions Club use the new facilities.

# Absentee balloting

Absentee balloting is under way in Taylor County and will continue through April 27 for the May 1 Democratic and Republican primaries.

Voting may be conducted at the Taylor County courthouse in Abilene during courthouse office hours, 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

There is no place to get absentee ballots in Merkel.

However, the ballots may be requested by mail and the ballots must be returned to the Taylor County Clerk's office by 1 p.m. on election day, May 1, in order to be counted.

The Republican ballots for absentee voters are smaller than those for the Democratic Primary.

There are 11 separate GOP ballots, compared to 56 separate Democratic Party ballots.

Only difference in the GOP ballots is the precinct chairman's race. There are 48 separate ballots for Democratic chairman's races.

Republicans will mark only one ballot, while Democrats will mark at least two and as
