I didn't spot her in the crowd too often and later found out why .-- She was peeping around the corner in the very back of the cafeteria. I said, "What in the world are you doing back there in the corner,---hiding?" Her answer, "No, I just remembered that I forgot to take a bath!"

People throughout the country are deeply worried about the economy and how they are going to make ends meet if the current trend keeps up. Many middle class citizens and especially small businesses are headed for trouble if the government doesn't find a solution for the burdents these people are carrying. Recently I noticed an opinion expressed in Viewpoint, published by the National Federation of Independent Business. I believe it's an opinion that many of our small businesses have today .-- "I just wanted to say for what it's worth, that it is getting harder and harder for a small business to keep going. The wage increase for employees, cost of supplies, etc. are really getting out of hand. In small towns such as ours, the farmers and people working are not getting more money to compete with the rising costs of the merchants' products. I have been in business for 21 years and the last few years, especially 1977, have been harder for me to make it than the years before that. Something will have to be done soon or the small businesses will be out of business.'

The January average wage is 10 cents an hour over December's, but the average weekly earnings are down due to the decrease in hours from \$237.87 a month ago to \$231.15 for January. Compared to a year ago, however, average weekly earnings are up \$25.09.
