

The proposal, as put forth by Representatives Jim Nugent of Kerrville and Lynn Nabers of Brownwood would dedicate one fourth of the revenue from the State's general sales and use tax to reduce school ad valorem taxes throughout

"The Legislature currently is meeting in a special session to consider legislation and proposed constitutional amendments which would return a portion of the current and projected state surplus to the people of Texas," Governor Briscoe said. "I am extremely interested in any proposal which could result in a lowering of property taxes and particularly those levied by our

How To Avoid Shipping Fever IN Cattel Explained

studied this complex respiratory disease for many years but do not have all the answers Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth even today. In general, a combination of three conditions lead to the development of shipping fever. These are stress plus viral and bacterial

infections. 'The livestock owner can control the stress factor," explained Dr. David Smokler, a bovine practitioner in Lancaster. "Work the cattle only in the early morning hours on hot days. I think the 'best' cowboy is one who works the cattle the easiest; that is without a lot of the cattle with his horse."

"Weaning is a very upsetting time to the calf," he continued. "Weaning comes much

Getting the calves settled down from the weaning process prior to moving them long distances may help prevent shipping fever.

To avoid shipping fever in purchased animals, Dr. Smokler suggests buying calves. from a neighbor who handles his animals gently. Do not purchase calves where large numbers of animals from many farms are penned together.

Calves which develop shipping fever usually stand away from other calves, their stomachs look empty and their nose may be dry and shouting and running crusty or have mucus dripping out. Usually, rapid breathing and a slight cough are present

The chute for treating calves should be no more than 28 inches wide and three or four calf-lengths long so treatment can be performed without exciting the calf. Roping a very sick calf may inflict

permanent injuries.

Prevention of shipping fever is much easier and more successful than treatment after the illness has developed. Some vaccinations before weaning will help prevent developmment of the disease. Early recognition of the symptoms and prompt treatment are essential when shipping fever is indicated.

Long Life For Cut Flowers Challenge

Making cut flowers look good for the longest possible time is a chal-lenge faced by many home gardeners.

Dr. William C. Welch, landscape horticulturist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, offers the following ps to help give longer life to cut flowers, whether homegrown or from your local florist:

1. Make Certain the container is washed clean with soap and water before using.

2. Cut stems at a slant, using a sharp knife or shears. 3. Before cutting, se-

lect flowers that are not fully open; avoid cutting old flowers.

4. Remove foliage from the lower third of the stem; also remove all broken and bruised parts of the stem. 5. Cut flowers in early

morning or late afternoon. 6. Wash flowers and

foliage to remove dirt, sprays or dusts if possi-7. Store cut flowers in

a cool area or refrigerate until arranged. 8. On receiving bulk flowers from the florist,
