

# Local cotton gins close to

# 10,000 bales...more coming

The local cotton gins are scurrying to catch up in ginning as rains last week stopped cotton stripping in the area.

Planters Gin in Trent is leading the way in bales ginned with 4,764 bales as of Monday. According to manager Red Scheaffer, they had about 500 bales on the yard in modules and trailers and the gin is operating on two, 10 hour shifts a day.

Scheaffer said he expects Planters Gin to process about 8,000 bales which would be a pretty fair year according to Red. He added "If we just had a good cotton price to go along with it, everything would be all right, with the target price added to cotton, most farmers are getting about 64 to 65 cents per pound and they can live

At the Merkel Co-Op Gin, they have processed 3,625 bales and said they should be able to catch up pretty quick as they only had about 100 bales

They said they had operated on a round the clock schedule for a couple of weeks but after the rain, moved to a 10 to 12 hour schedule. They expected to see more cotton coming in the last part of the week, providing the weather holds.

At Stith Gin, they have ginned 1,500 bales so far and said they had nine modules and 75 bales on the yard waiting. They added "We haven't quite run out of things to do yet and said they expected more cotton in the last part of the week.

The three local gins were just 111 bales short of 10,000 Monday morning.

The city paving program, street by street is

The city tried to complete as many blocks of paving as possible. In other words, on blocks where half of the streets were paved, the other half will now be paved to complete the block.

The second factor was a traffic count, prepared by consultants. If the street had sufficient vehicle traffic to warrant paving, it is designated for

There are many streets that will be left unpaved by the federal program. If the citizens would like for all of the streets to be paved, that would take a bond package.

# City releases list on streets marked for paving soon

The Merkel City Council met last Monday night and heard reports on bridge repairs, the paving program and the housing rehabilitation program at their regular session at City Hall.

Council also approved advertisement for five more homes on the Community Development Block Grant Funds. Of ten houses that have already been contracted, eight have been

City Manager J. A. Sadler said the city had recently repaired a bridge on the east end of North 2nd street. The city spent about \$1,500 on repairing the bridge and the work is completed except for installation of guard rails.

The city received some good news from the Department of Housing and Urban Development concerning the paving plan.

The city has been granted permission to advertise not only the first plan's paving, but also additional paving if the bids for the total project come in under \$365,000.

North side streets that will be paved under the original application include Taylor Street; from 2nd to 6th, Runnels Street; from 5th to I 20, El Paso Street; from 3rd to 120, Marion Street; from 1st to I20, Thornton Street; from 2nd to I20, West; from 1st to 2nd, 6th; from Thornton to Edwards,

5th; from Thornton to Marion, 5th; from Lamar to Taylor, 3rd; from 1/4 block of Marion to El Paso, and 2nd; 1/4 Block West to Thornton

South Side street that will be paved are Orange; from 1st to 7th, Rose; 4th to 7th, 2nd; from Cherry to Orange, 3rd; from Cherry to Orange, 4th; from Cherry to Orange, 5th; from Rose to Orange, 6th; from Cherry to Orange, 7th; from 11/4 blocks Rose to Orange.

The following streets will be paved if the bids come in under a total cost of \$365,000. North 6th; from Thornton to Edwards, North 5th; from Marion to Lamar, North 4th; from Thornton to Taylor, North 3rd; from Thornton to Marion and North 3rd; from Edwards to Taylor

South side 1st Street; Cherry to Orange, 5th Street; from Oak to Rose, 6th; Rose to Cherry, Rose; from 7th to 8th, and Orange; from 7th to

Council also approved a water line extension north of Merkel along FM 1235. The line is being payed for by developer Jack Chamberlin who is planning to sell lots in the area. The city will oversee the laying of that line.

City Manager J. A. Sadler also told the Mail Monday the city would have the One Way streets in front of Merkel Elementary effective December 15th. The signs will be installed by

These were among the results of a recent study of "Public Perceptions of the Police in Texas." conducted by the Survey Research Program of the Criminal Justice Center at Sam Houston State

Responses came from 1,345 individuals from 181 Texas counties, selected at random and questioned earlier this year on their experiences during 1981.

The DPS was rated professional or very professional by 82 percent of those surveyed. Local police and sheiff's departments got 65 percent positive ratings in those categories.



How times have changed. In the days of the Old West, those kinds of tactics won many an outlaw the unquestionable sentence of "being hung by the neck until honest.
