Tuesday tragedy touches Americans

I was in MISD superintendent Bill Everett's office Tuesday morning when his secretary told us the Space Shuttle had just blown up.

The first thing I thought of was an interview I saw this weekend with the daughter of Concord High School Social Studies teacher Christa McAuliffe.

The cute, wide eyed girl told CBS News "I think it's great that my mom gets to go to space."

Her mom was the teacher selected from thousands of entries to be the first "civillian" in space. Challenger blew up Tuesday just as the ship was being shifted into top speed for clearing gravity's pull and heading into space.

This kind of tragedy brings all the dangers of space travel home.

It's a very sad day for many reasons. Mostly, I keep thinking about that little girl I saw on tv.

Board extends superintendent's contract, ok's asst. principal

The Merkel school board extended the superintendent's contract and approved the job description for an assistant high school principal at their regular meeting, held last Tuesday night at the Merkel High Library.

MISD superintendent Bill Everett was ill and did not attend the meeting. His contract with the school now runs through June, 1989.

MISD superintendent Bill Everett told *The Mail* Tuesday The High school had 8 percent of its student body fail at least one course at the end of the third six weeks. A total of 28 students failed 54 courses at Merkel High and only 2.6 of all grades given in all courses for the third six weeks, were failing grades.

Everett also said the Freshman Addition at Merkel High was really going well. MISD maintenance crews are constructing the building and it should be completed by July.

Two city incumbents will run

The Merkel City Council met Monday night and approved election judges for the April 5th city elections.

Two council members also filed for reelection after Monday's meeting. Councilman James McKee and

mayor pro-tem Ted Smith both filed.

Councilmen heard the city may be looking around for a new loader at the city landfill. Estimates on repairs for the current loader is twice as much as the machine is

valued but council wanted the machine inspected in Abilene for repair estimates.

Councilmen also heard reports from City Manager J. A. Sadler on the housing rehabilitation program and an alley cleaning program here.

The girls played the Abilene High Eagles last Monday in Abilene and were beaten 40-18.

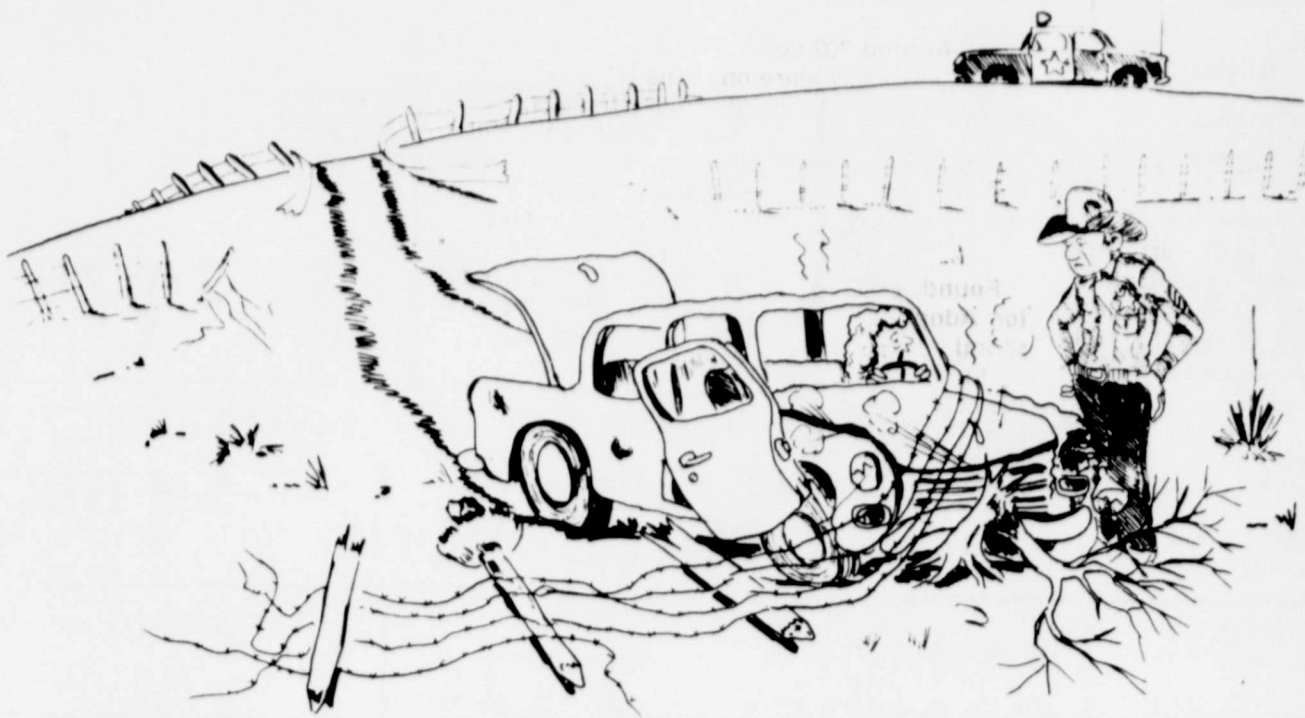

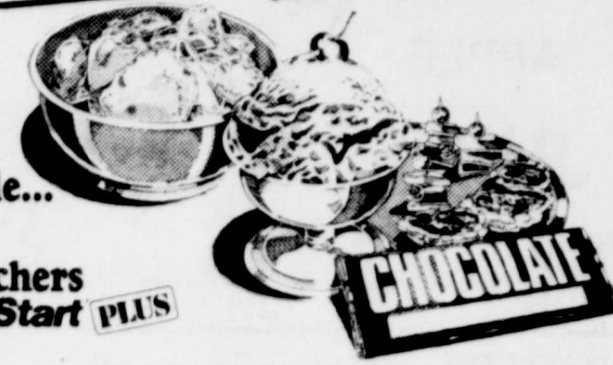

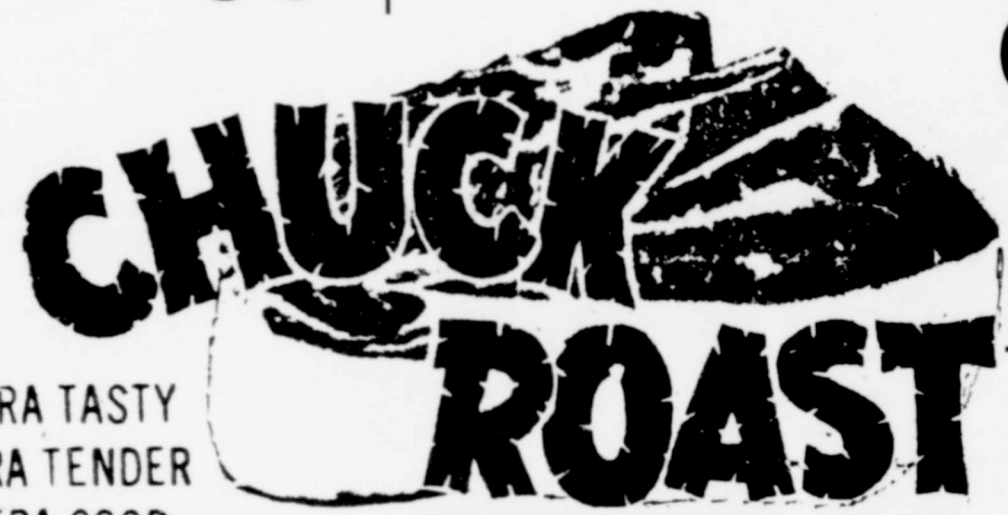
