used in cases of national emused in cases of national em rgency. There is no emergency
connected with GATT/WTO. Trade will not cease. World trade will continue based on the previous GATT rules.
We have until June, 1995 to pass or not pass on this one. The issue should not be coerced by powerhungry politicians and global corporations. There is still time to rite and call your Congressmen
