MISD learns of asbestos problem

The Merkel school board met in regular session Monday night and heard a report on asbestos contents of MISD

MISD maintenance director Hayden Reeves reported to the board on asbesos contents of MISD facilities. Reeves told board members "We do have an asbestos problem and it will get very expensive down the road. We found it in places we didn't expect and what bothers me is that it will cost a lot of money to get rid of."

All public schools are under a federal mandate to completely remove all building materials containing asbestos. MISD collected 348 samples of materials to check for asbestos content. MISD will be forwarding data collected to the Texas Association of School Boards, who will in turn create a plan for the removal of the asbes-

Board members also renewed a contract for searches on school property by dogs trained to find drugs and alcohol.

Merkel High principal Robert Damron told the board "I have mixed emotions on this. Their visits won't cure the drug an alcohol problem here but I feel it serves as a deterrent." The board approved the contract on a 6-1

In other action, board members decided:

* Paid bills

* Amended the budget

* Heard a report that 83% of current property taxes have been collected.

* Approved the purchase of a new computer system for the high school principal's office

* Approved the lease of five Minolta

copy machines

* Selected liability insurance for school board members, administrators and volunteers acting on behalf of the school from the Texas Association of School Boards... the policy will cost \$2,899 a year and that is a \$1,000 savings over the current policy cost

* Heard a report from athletic director Joe Longley on use of the weight room... he told board members that about 25 students were using the room between 6 and 9 p.m. Monday-Thursday and the facility is open to the public during those hours. He also presented a report on student insurance and said he would like to obtain more information before making a recommendation

* Superintendent James Logan told board members the school was applying for a \$18,000 program funded by the West Central Texas Council of Governments that will help identify students who may drop out of school and fund counseling and tutoring to keep the kids in school... He also said the district was applying for a program funded by the Texas Education Agency to begin a computer science program

* Hired Bill Roark as a high school teacher/coach, Darlene Williams as an aide at Tye Elementary, Lannie Templeton as a high school teacher, Rose Yarko as a high school teacher, Brenda Bland as a Tye Elementary teacher, Norma Frazier as a high school teacher/ junior high coach and Tommy Waters as a high school teacher/ coach. They accepted the resignations of Dick and Karla Lepard. Lepard has accepted the position of assistant football coach at Andrews


