Cathie Trimble, Kenny Sharp United In Church Ceremony

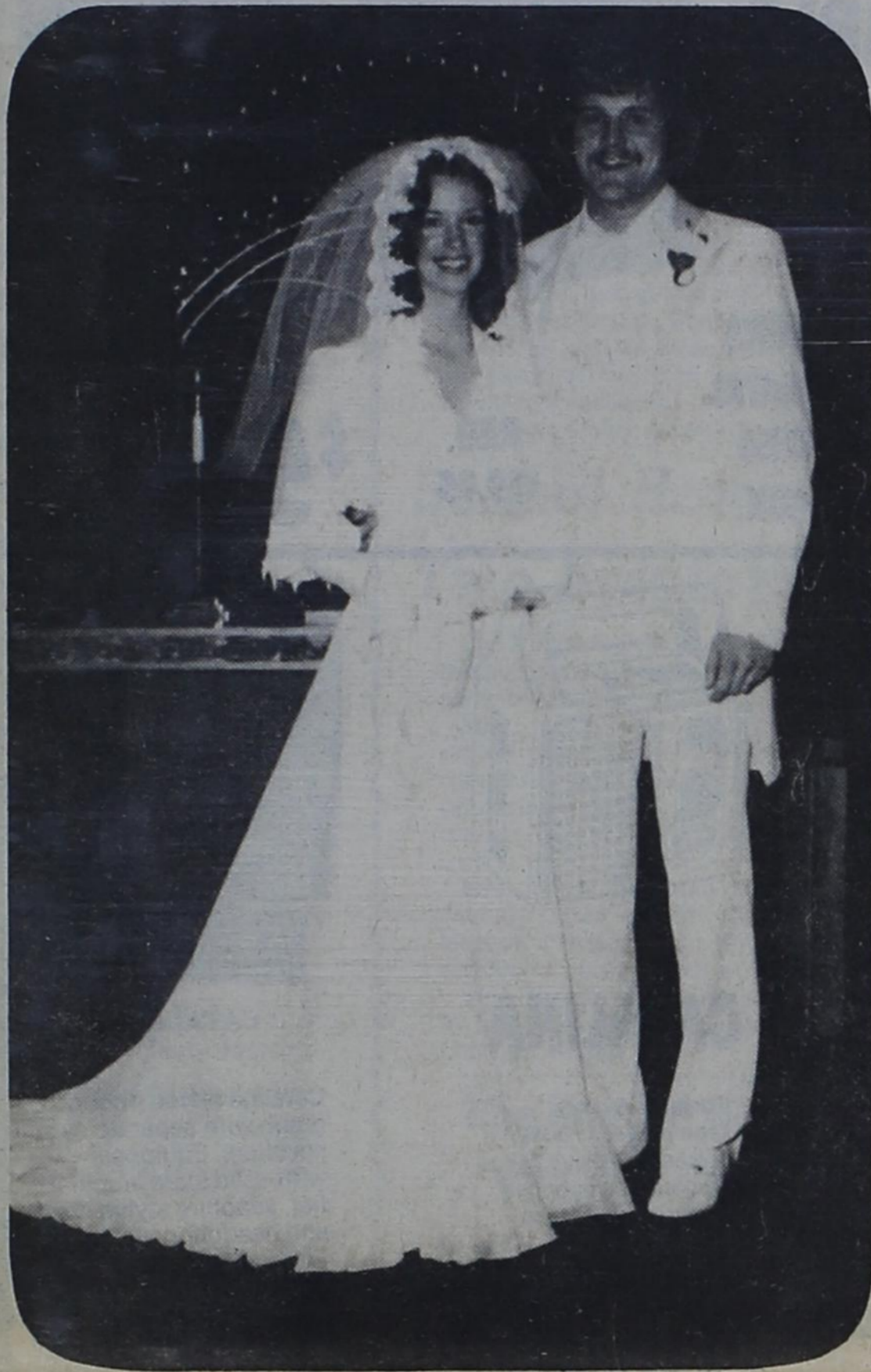

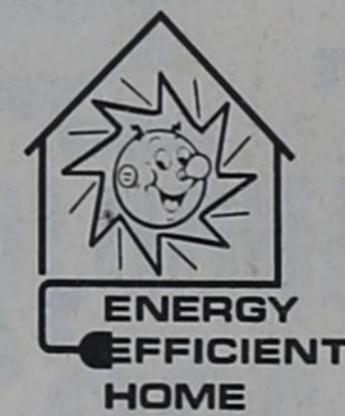
