OIL NEWS FROM THE BUCK CREEK WELL

Good progress is reported being made on the Buck Creek well by the new operators who have taken over the drilling of the same from the Swanson Co.

A big interest in ownership was transferred from the Swanson Company to Carl S. Aune an Oklahoma operator who is representing Utah Capital. The principal owners are F. A. Sweet and associates of Salt Lake City, well known mining men of Utah and California.

The deal was made through J. M. Hines of Oklahoma City, well known oil operator of the Mid Continent Field. Mr. Hines was one of the men instrumental in getting Buck Creek started drilling this early spring and through him that the present owners were interested.

Mr. Hines is on the job and reports that the 8 inch casing is set at 2840, and that drilling will be resumed at once. Drilling was started on the first of the month, but has been delayed by a fishing job. This been overcome and no further trouble is anticipated.

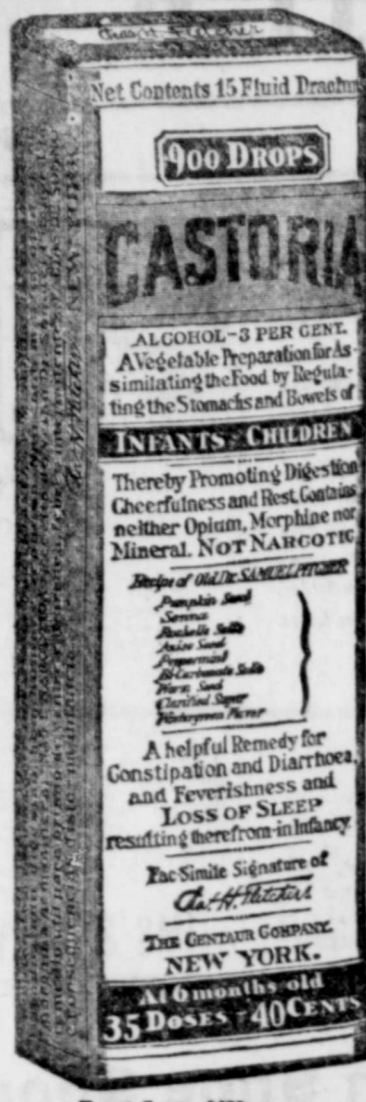

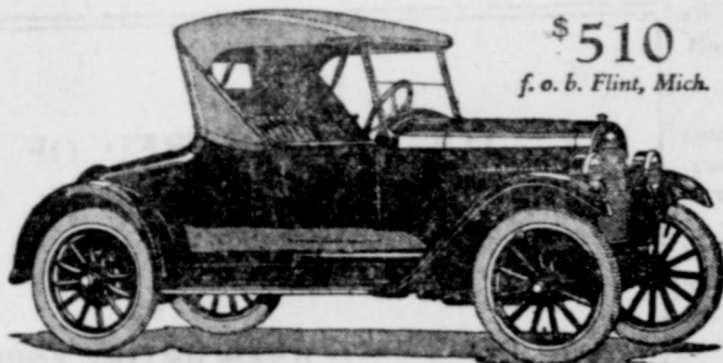

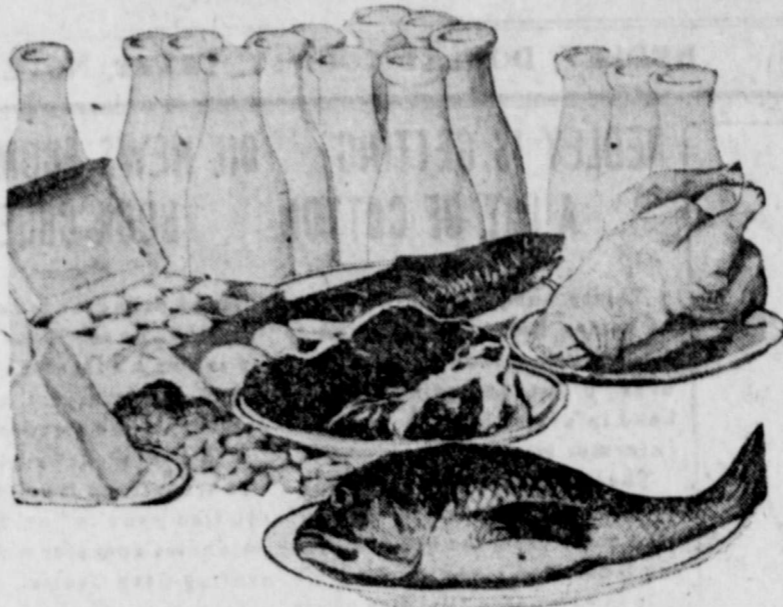

WEEK'S SUPPLY OF MILK, MEAT AND OTHER FOODS FOR FAMILY



The Total (Milk, 14 Quarts, Other Foods 10½ Pounds) Provides About 160 Hundred-Calorie Portions or One-Fifth the Needed Fuel—For Adults This Proportion May Be Raised or Lowered by Half—For Children the Milk Should Not Be Lessened.

(Prepared by the United States Department of Agriculture.)
If your family consists of two adults, and three children whose combined ages total not less than twenty and not more than twenty-four years, the following list of foods will give them everything they need for a week, according to Farmers' Bulletin No. 1228, A Week's Supply of Food for an Average Family, which has recently been published by the United States Department of Agriculture.

First of all, the housekeeper who consults this list of foods will probably wish to know why these foods were selected and what their significance is. Everyone knows that food contains fuel for the human machine. The fuel need for the average family described above has been estimated as 800 hundred-calorie portions per week.

In order that the diet should provide what is needed to maintain health, one-fifth of this needed fuel should come from vegetables and fruits, one-fifth from milk, meat, eggs, and other efficient-protein foods, three-tenths from cereals, one-tenth from sweets, and one-fifth from fats. This proportion has been maintained in the above lists, for 160 hundred-calorie portions are supplied by fruits and vegetables; 160 hundred-calorie portions by the efficient-protein foods; 240 hundred-calorie portions by the cereal foods; 80 hundred-calorie portions by the sweets; and 160 hundred-calorie portions by the fats.

If a housekeeper does not wish to use just these foods in just these amounts, and wonders how the lists can be altered without interfering with the good proportions, she can consult a table at the back of the bulletin which gives practically all the common food materials divided into the five classes mentioned and which shows the number of hundred-calorie portions per peck, per pound, or per quart as the case may demand. It should, therefore, be an easy matter to make up other lists having the same proportions as the one given above.

Many families will be different from the average family here described, but reference to a table given in the bulletin will make it possible to estimate the number of hundred-calorie portions needed by any group of persons. Copies of Farmers' Bulletin 1228 may be had upon request to the Department of Agriculture, Washington, D. C.

RECIPE FOR SIMPLE UNUSUAL CONFECTION

Recommended by the Office of Home Economics.

Nut Coated Marshmallows Can Easily Be Prepared at Home—Chocolate or Cocoa May Be Added to Sirup if Desired.

(Prepared by the United States Department of Agriculture.)

The following recipe for a simple and unusual confection that can easily be made at home is recommended by the office of home economics of the United States Department of Agriculture:

Nut Coated Marshmallows.
1 cupful (4 ounces) walnuts, chopped, shelled almonds, 2 cupfuls medium chopped.
1 cupful (4 ounces) 2-3 cupful of water, shelled pecans, 120 fresh soft chopped marshmallows (4 1 cupful (4 ounces) six-ounce boxes, shelled English 2½ in a box).

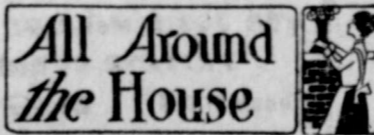
Blanch the almonds and dry thoroughly. Chop all the nuts very fine, and shake through a sieve for uniformity. Salt to taste, using about one-half to two-thirds teaspoonful for each pound of nuts. Stir well.

Make a sirup of the brown sugar and water, boiling it to 108 degrees C. or 226 degrees F. If no thermometer is available, the sirup should be boiled till it "threads" from the spoon; but this method of determining the right moment to take it off the fire is not as accurate or satisfactory. Remove the saucepan from the flame when the temperature of 108 degrees C. or 226 degrees F. is reached, but do not allow the sirup to cool. Drop the marshmallows one by one into the hot sirup, using forks to handle them. Remove promptly, and roll at once in chopped nuts. Place on oiled paper to dry. If

the sirup cools, place it over the flame to reheat, but do not allow it to come to a boil.

If there is a coating of loose starch or powdered sugar on the marshmallows, brush it off with a soft brush or cotton batting before dipping them into the sirup.

Two ounces of chocolate or cocoa may be added to the sirup if a chocolate coating is desired.



Bread that is too light when put into the oven will be coarse grained.

An excellent way to cook prunes is to cover with water in a covered jar and cook in oven.

Some of the new silk lamp shades have narrow bands of fur or marabou on them as trimming.

If the ribbon ends of a blanket are worn, finish with a double crochet edge with a bone hook.

When the children lose the tips off their shoestrings dip the ends in mucklage and let them dry.

Never burn old shoes. Bury them near the roots of some tree, shrub or in the garden to enrich the soil.

Popcorn will be more flaky if a little cold water is thrown over it before it is popped.

The best frying pan has a very sloping shallow side. Then an omelet can be rolled off it when cooked, instead of being lifted and broken.

The Hedley Protective Association, or Mutual, was organized in February, 1918. Our officers are:

- J. G. McDougal, President
- W. T. Youree, Vice President
- E. H. Watt, Director
- J. S. Beach, Director
- A. N. Wood, Director
- L. Spalding, Treasurer
- D. C. Moore, Secretary

We now have about 800 members, and new ones coming in nearly every day.

You ask: Why should I join the Hedley Protective Association?

Our answer is this: First, because it was organized by home people. Second, because it is owned and controlled by home people, and was not organized in order for some one to graft and rob the people out of their money and give nothing in return, but to give home people—neighbors and friends—One Thousand Dollars of insurance at the very least cost that we can. Third, because it is the cheapest and best insurance that we can get, and, besides, our money all stays at home.

In order that you may know something about the cost, will

say the annual dues is \$1.00 for each member, due Dec 1st each year. 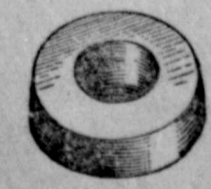

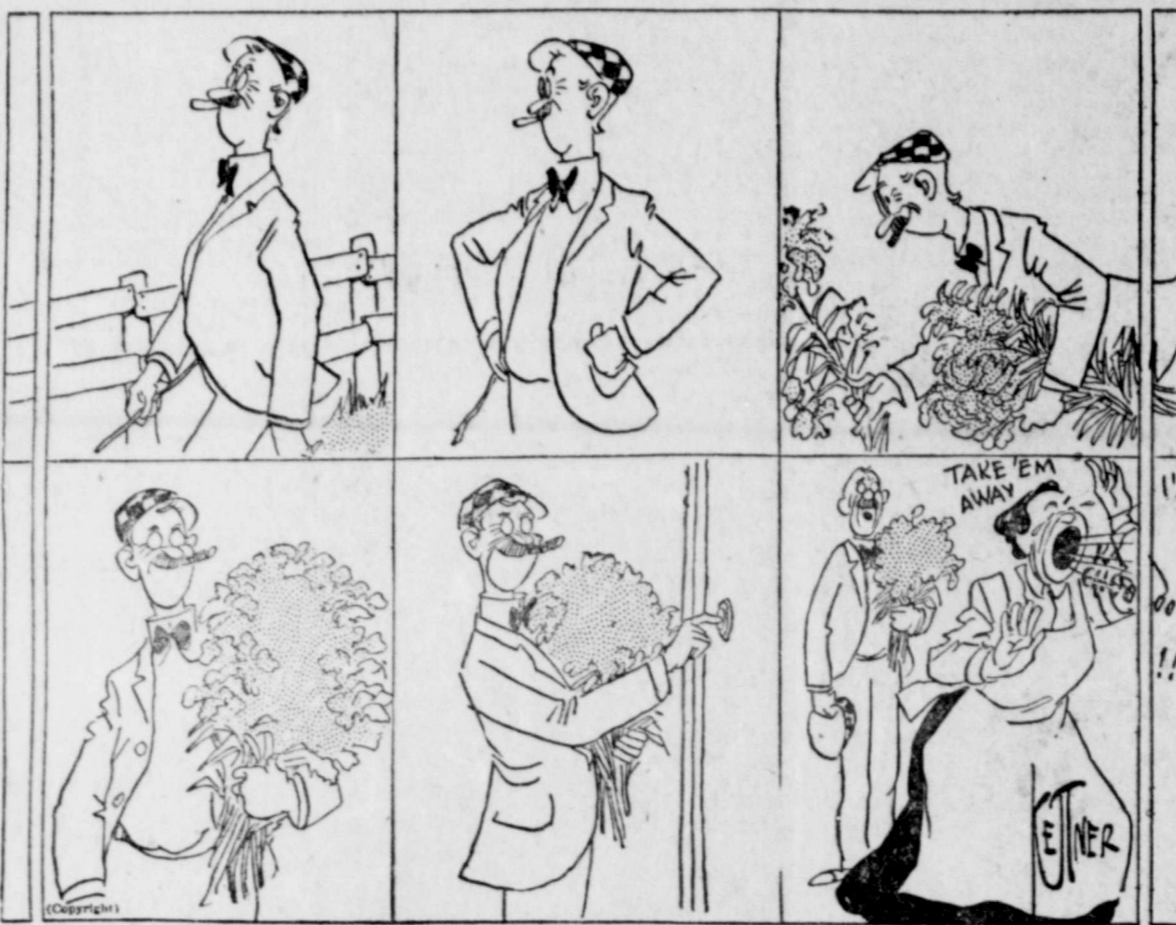

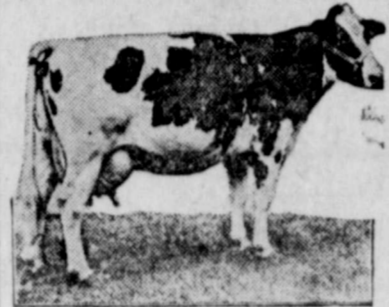
IMPROVEMENT OF DAIRY COW

Department of Agriculture Has Six
High-Producing Animals on its
Farm at Beltsville.

(Prepared by the United States Department of Agriculture.)

The improvement of dairy cows means a great deal more than increased profits to the dairymen. It means cheaper food and more milk, the best bone and muscle maker for children. What this improvement means is brought out forcefully by a poster prepared by the United States Department of Agriculture and sent free to interested persons.

An ordinary cow or scrub produces only enough milk to feed five chil-

dren a quart a day, while a good cow yields enough to give 20 children a quart a day. The supercow, and there are more and more of them in this class each year, gives enough milk so that a small herd of them might supply this quantity to all the small children in a small town.

On its farm at Beltsville, Md., the department has six cows, the result of its breeding work, that have produced an average of more than 22,000 pounds of milk in 365 days. This little herd of six big producers yields enough milk to provide 170 children a quart a day. One of them could supply nearly 20 children, or six times as many as the ordinary cow could take care of.

Good breeding, first, and good feeding, second, have made the difference.

MAKE COW RATION TEMPTING

Animal Will Not Do Well on Food
That Is Not Palatable—Avoid
Any Sudden Change.

The good dairy ration must be attractive. A cow is a self-respecting sort of animal and she likes palatable food. In fact, a cow will not do well on food that isn't palatable, and it should be remembered that the condition of the food has the most to do with its palatability. Moldy grains or roughages do not appeal to the appetite of the cow, and consequently are unsatisfactory. Thus the unsatisfactory feed, no matter if it does contain the proper elements, may cause a reduction in the milk supply due to the cow's unwillingness to eat a plenty to keep up a good flow of milk.

At the same time it must be recognized that it is not a wise idea to change a ration suddenly in order to make it better. A cow is a pretty delicate sort of a milk-producing machine and, especially if she is a large producer, sudden changes in the food are quite likely to upset her in one way or another, and the result will be a loss of milk.

KEEP FEED UTENSILS CLEAN

Average Farmer Is Liable to Grow
Little Careless About Pails
in Summer.

Wide-awake dairymen realize the importance of keeping calf feeding utensils scrupulously clean at all seasons of the year. The average farmer, however, may grow a little careless about the calf pail, especially during the warm summer months. These pails should be of tin or galvanized iron, never of wood, and should not be allowed to get rusty or battered. They should be thoroughly washed, rinsed and sterilized after use, and kept in a clean place. Never use calf pails for feeding hogs, or live stock other than calves.

ESSENTIALS FOR DAIRY HERD

Cows and Young Animals Should Be
Provided With Plenty of Pure
Water and Shade.

Provide plenty of shade and cool, pure water for the cows and young animals. Spray cows at milking time to keep off flies. Look out for sour milk and cream. Bacteria and warmth cause milk to sour. The modern way to spell bacteria is d-d-r-t. Keep it out of the milk, thoroughly wash and scald all milk utensils. Keep the milk or cream cool, 50 degrees or lower if possible, and it will stay sweet for several days.

Wisconsin in Lead.
Wisconsin now leads in the number of accredited tuberculin-free cattle with 36,183 head. Minnesota is second with nearly 34,000 head.

Metal Milk Utensils.
Milk utensils for farm use should be made of metal and have all joints smoothly soldered. Never allow them to become rusty or rough inside.

Never Mix Milk.
Never mix fresh, warm milk with that which has been cooled.

CONSIDER USE OF AIRSHIPS

Possibility of Their Successful Employment in Making Aerial Observations of the Himalayas.

Consideration has been given to the possibility of aerial observations in the Himalayas. The range, it appears, has only six peaks above 27,000 feet high, and an aviator flying at about 23,000 or 24,000 feet should have no difficulty in crossing if the highest peaks were avoided, while, if he chose certain of the gorges, an altitude of some 19,000 feet would suffice. The greatest of the many obstacles to be encountered is the mountain sickness, which occurs in the highest altitudes through deficiency of oxygen. The gradual climber, going aloft, is less handicapped in this respect than the aviator rising suddenly from sea level in his machine; on the other hand, the pedestrian has more fatigue to undergo, and this practically equalizes matters. The chief consideration in any case is an adequate supply of oxygen, with a proper inhaler.
