MRS. H. COOK DIES AT BAYLOR HOSPITAL

Last Sunday afternoon at 2:10 o'clock, Mrs. Harvey Cook passed from this life to her home above. She had gone to Dallas about four weeks ago for treatment. OIL NEWS FROM THE BUCK CREEK WELL

The latest news from the Buck Creek test, being drilled north east of Hedley, is that the well is drilling around 2600 feet in a lime formation. The operators look for this limestone to be 250 to 300 feet in thickness, judging from logs of other wells drilled in this part of the Panhandle. The drillers have not had a break for over 100 feet, and are looking for another 200 feet of the same formation before expecting a change.

Drilling has been delayed several days by fishing jobs since the well changed hands. Monday the old cable was replaced by a new 4000 ft line, and it is hoped that this trouble has been overcome for all time. Judging from this, the present operators are looking for deep stuff near Hedley. It is said that this test is located on one of the oldest known structures in the Panhandle, and a very large one, and this will be the first test to prove whether or not it is going to be productive.

FACTS

GET OUT TUBERCULOSIS

Best Shown in Eradication Case—Prevalent in Many Eastern States.

(By the United States Department of Agriculture.)

Region that includes the New States, New York and Penn. and New Jersey, there is interest in the eradication of tuberculosis. At the Eastern Conference on the subject, read, much information of value to dairy cattle breeders was given by state and federal sanitarians. Their estimates, based on results of actual tests of a number of herds, show that in this area nearly 30 per cent of the dairy cattle have the disease. It seems to be most prevalent in the thickly populated states of Massachusetts, and Rhode Island. Infection is extensive in New Hampshire, and Vermont, Pennsylvania and New Jersey about 9 per cent of the dairy cattle, while Maine has only 2.7 per cent.

In states, as well as many herds, tuberculosis is a serious economic problem, but since the disease is unprofitable or greatly reduces efficiency, it pays to get rid of it. Keeping up a herd of diseased cattle is just as hopeless as it is in a factory or other business from year to year. Many herds in this area have been ruined without knowing the cause. A plan for getting rid of the disease in definite areas has been worked out with such success in

A FEW DESSERTS

A SIMPLE sweet for a finish to the dinner is missed if omitted. A few stuffed dates, a plate of cookies with a bit of fruit, or fresh fruit itself, is easy to prepare and usually available. For desserts which are more

elaborate and take time to concoct the following will be suggestive:

Chocolate Crumb Pudding.

Take one cupful of cake and bread crumbs mixed, add one and one-half cupfuls of milk, one and one-half squares of unsweetened chocolate and three-fourths of a cupful of sugar. Cook in a double boiler until a smooth paste is formed. To three well-beaten egg yolks add one-half cupful of milk, two tablespoonfuls of butter, one-fourth teaspoonful of salt; stir and cook until it thickens. Add vanilla and put into a greased pudding dish. Bake in a moderate oven 25 minutes. When slightly cool, spread with a meringue made with the three egg whites and one-half cupful of powdered sugar; replace in the oven until the meringue is a light brown. Chill before serving.

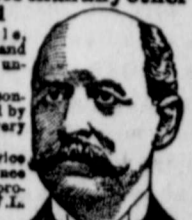

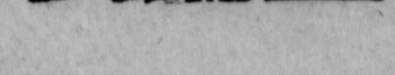

DAIRY FACTS

CLEANING OUT TUBERCULOSIS

Much Interest Shown in Eradication of Disease—Prevalent in Many Eastern States.

(Prepared by the United States Department of Agriculture.)

In the region that includes the New England states, New York and Pennsylvania, and New Jersey, there is extensive interest in the eradication of bovine tuberculosis. At the Eastern states conference on the subject, recently held, much information of value to dairymen and cattle breeders was presented by state and federal sanitary officials. Their estimates, based upon the results of actual tests of a large number of herds, show that in some parts of this area nearly 90 per cent of the dairy cattle have the disease. It seems to be most prevalent in the thickly populated states of Connecticut, Massachusetts, and Rhode Island, but infection is extensive in New York, New Hampshire, and Vermont. Pennsylvania and New Jersey herds have about 9 per cent of diseased cattle, while Maine has only 2.7 per cent.

To these states, as well as many others, tuberculosis is a serious economic problem, but since the disease makes herds unprofitable or greatly reduces their efficiency, it pays to get rid of it. Keeping up a herd of diseased cows is just as hopeless as it is to maintain a factory or other business at a loss from year to year. Many a dairyman in this area has been financially ruined without knowing the real cause.

Since the plan for getting rid of the disease in definite areas has been carried out with such success in so

many counties, there is reason to believe that even in the badly infected localities it is possible to eradicate the plague and keep it out.

Value of Purebreds

The value of purebred live stock is most noticeable in those cases in which the capability of the animals is measured most directly. Among farm animals the best illustration can be found in dairy cattle, though careful yearly tests of milk and butterfat production are relatively recent affairs. The enormous differences among dairy cows when given the same opportunity have been brought out clearly in a great number of cases, and these differences are strongly inherited through sire and dam. The average production of purebred and grades is much above the average of all milk cows, which is about 4,000 pounds of milk and 160 pounds of butterfat per year.

SECOND GRADE CREAM CAUSE

Lack of Careful Attention to Separator and Improper Cooling Are Held Responsible.

Does your cream grade number one? If not, it should. Lack of careful attention to the separator and not cooling properly usually causes most second grade cream. Raise the quality of butter by keeping your cream out of the grades below.

Second grade cream consists of cream that is too sour to pass as first, that contains undesirable flavors or odors in a moderate degree; that is foamy, slightly yeasty or slightly stale, or that is too old to pass as first grade cream. All sour cream containing less than 25 per cent of butterfat shall be graded as second grade.

Clean Milking Practices. Cleanliness in milking should be exercised at all times. Before milking begins the cow's udder and flanks should be wiped off, preferably with a damp cloth, in order to prevent particles of straw or loose hair getting into the pail.

Future of Young Stock. A great deal depends upon the way the young animal goes through its first winter, as to its future size and value.

Average Dairy Cow Feed. The average dairy cow should receive 15 pounds of alfalfa hay and some other roughage, along with 20 or 30 pounds of silage if available.

Keep the Dairy Cows. Prospects are bright for the man who holds on to his milk cows. Prices are good and promise to remain good.

Sample Each Cow's Milk. Take a sample of each cow's milk about three times a month and test it for butterfat with a Babcock tester.

PLAN TO CONTROL WEATHER

Scheme Has Been the Dream of Many Scientists, but Nothing Practical Has Been Evolved.

Three or four years ago a Sheffield (Eng.) workman claimed to be putting the finishing touches to an instrument to enable him "to focus beams of other oscillation" and so control the weather. Unfortunately, the instrument could not have been so perfect as he thought, for nothing further has been heard of it. Before that a Leeds scientist had come to the conclusion that it was "within the scope of human possibility to prevent disastrous cyclones, hurricanes and storms, and even to improve permanently the weather of the British Isles." The idea was the production of an instrument enabling the operator to collect or disassemble the molecules which form the atmosphere, securing the degree of density desired and so arranging the best weather required for any district or seasonal occupation. More than twelve years ago Sir Oliver Lodge demonstrated that fog could be dispelled by electricity, though the process was too costly for adoption generally.

COAL OF VEGETABLE ORIGIN

Abundant Proof That Huge Forests, in Former Epochs of the Earth, Became Petrified.

Although in most instances there are comparatively few traces of its vegetable origin left, coal owes its existence to the vast masses of vegetable matter deposited through the luxuriant growth of plants in former epochs of the earth's history, and since slowly converted into a petrified state.

Coal fields today present abundant indications of the existence of huge ancient forests, usually in the form of coal formed from the roots of trees. Several such forests have been uncovered, one of which in Nova Scotia is a good example. Remains of trees have been found there, six to eight feet in height and four feet in diameter. In a colliery in England, in a space of about one-quarter of an acre, there have been found the fossilized stumps of 73 trees, with roots attached, and broken-off trunks lying about, one of them 30 feet long, and all of them turned into coal.

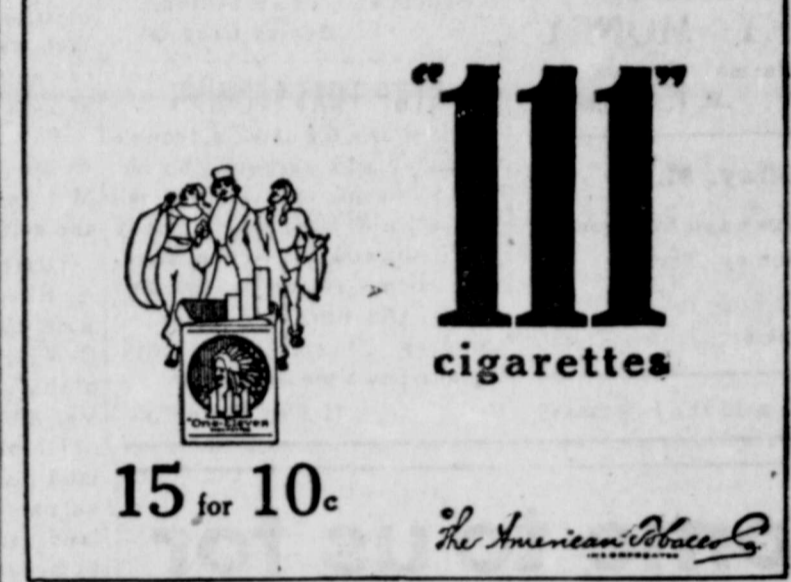

California Roadrunner Famous for its Custom of Sprinting in Front of Trotting Horses.

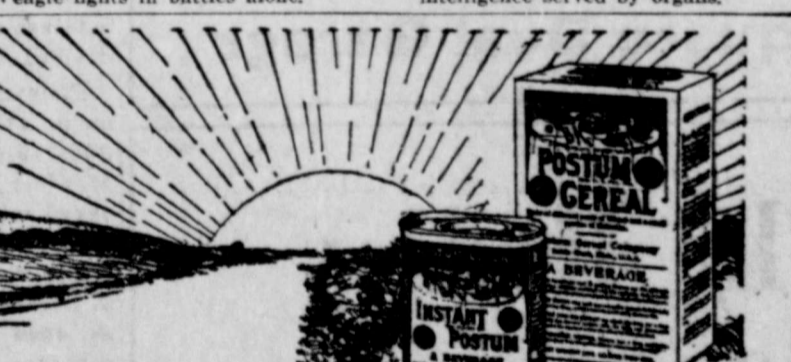
