**COTTON**—Acreage should not be expanded. Holdover  
fully normal. Prices last year due largely to low acre yield.  
High yield this year on same acreage will bring low prices.

**SWEET POTATOES**—Prices at digging time likely low;  
prices for storage stock dependent on size of storings.

**EGGS**—Lower prices first half of 1929 than in first half of  
1928. Second half of 1929 uncertain.

**POULTRY FOR MEAT**—Higher prices during first half of  
1929 than in first half of 1928. Second half uncertain.

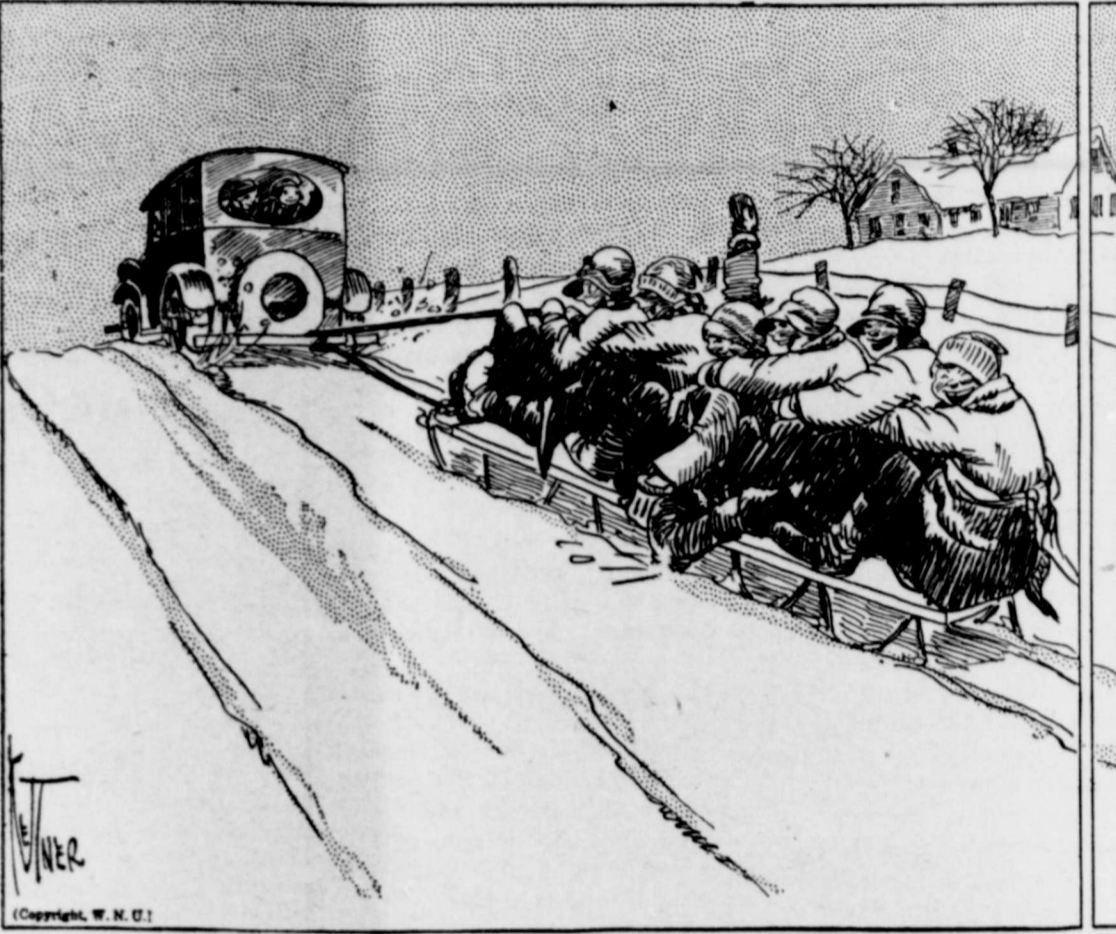
**BUTTERFAT**—Probably about the same spread between  
fat prices and feed prices as during 1928, if industrial ac-  
tivity maintains demand for butter.

**HOGS**—Smaller supplies expected to bring better prices  
than in 1928.

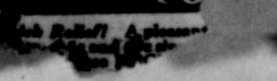

### HOW ABOUT PIE?

Pie is in season any time of the year, but in winter the pastry seems more easily digested, because of outdoor exercise in bracing air.

**Cream Pie.**—Scald one cupful of milk, pour over three tablespoonfuls of sugar which has been well mixed with one teaspoonful of cornstarch and a pinch of salt. Cook ten minutes, stir well to avoid lumping. Pour this hot mixture over one cupful of sweet cream and two well beaten eggs. Stir briskly and pour into a pastry lined pie plate, sprinkle with cinnamon and bake in a moderate oven until the custard is set. Serve very cold.

**Orange Pie.**—Cream one-fourth cupful of butter, add gradually one cupful of sugar, stirring constantly; add three-fourths cupful of orange juice, half the grated rind of an orange and the juice of half a lemon; beat until light and well blended. Add the beaten yolks of three eggs and the stiffly beaten white of one egg. Bake in one crust and when cool spread with a meringue made of the whites of two eggs beaten stiff, adding three tablespoonfuls of sugar. Spread the meringue roughly over the top of the pie and brown in a moderate oven.

**Apple Pie.**—Line a pastry pan with flaky pastry. Pare, core and cut four or five tart apples into eighths and arrange around the pan in a row, one-eighth inch from the edge, then gradually heap toward the center. Mix one-half cupful of sugar with one-eighth teaspoonful of nutmeg, the same of salt, one tablespoonful of lemon juice and a little of the grated rind. Strew over the apples. Dot with a tablespoonful of butter. Moisten the edge of the crust, place the top crust and flute the edges with the thumb and finger. Bake an hour in a moderate oven. Serve with cheese or ice cream.

A glass of orange juice for breakfast starts the day right. It may be given even the smallest babies, if strained from any pulp.

### Desserts.

A simple apple pie which will not be unsuitable for any member of the family, is:

**Hot Apple Pie.**—Bake a pastry shell on the bottom of a pan. Fill the crust nearly full with stewed well seasoned apple sauce to which a tablespoonful of butter and a few grains of salt have been added. Spread with a meringue and put into the oven to brown. Serve hot with good American cheese.

**Mock Cherry Pie.**—Mix one and one-half cupfuls of cranberries cut into halves, three-fourths of a cupful of seeded and shredded raisins, one cupful of sugar and one tablespoonful of flour. Place in a pastry lined pan and cover with a tablespoonful of butter cut into bits and two tablespoonfuls of orange juice. Cover with pastry and bake in a hot oven for half an hour.

**Prune Pie.**—Line a pie pan with pastry and fill with the following mixture: Soak over night three-fourths of a pound of well washed prunes in tart canned fruit juice to cover. Cook until tender, adding water if needed. Remove the stones, add more sugar if not already sweet enough and use for the pastry shell. Cover with strips of pastry and bake. Serve hot with cheese.

**Apricots in Jelly.**—Cover one package of lemon flavored gelatin with one-half cupful each of hot apricot juice drained from a can of apricots and pineapple juice, one-half cupful of orange juice and the juice of half a lemon. Turn some of the mixture into an oval border mold; turn the mold until the sides and bottom are well coated, chill, leaving a half inch of the mixture in the bottom of the mold. Place a blanched almond in the seed cell of each apricot and arrange them cut-side toward the outside of the mold. Pour a little of the jelly over these; when set add more and continue until the mold is full. Chill, unmold and fill the center with a ginger ice cream. Serve with apricot sauce.

**Home Made Sundaes.**—With a little ice cream in sherbet cups with a hot chocolate sauce, a caramel or maple, hot or cold, one may vary the serving of the cream which every one likes. A spoonful of orange marmalade, a bit of preserve such as figs, strawberries or pineapple will add variety. Topping any of these with a teaspoonful of chopped nuts, a most wholesome dessert is quickly ready to serve.

**Dates With Nuts.**—Prepare a pound or two of dates by stuffing them with nuts and rolling in sugar. Keep where they will be moist and serve three or four for dessert in place of pie or puddings. They are liked by them and it will

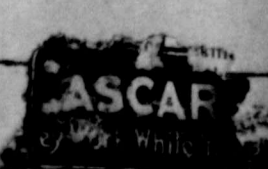
