HEDLEY NEEDS A SEWER SYSTEM

At a time like this, any proposition that calls for the expenditure of money is liable to meet with a cool reception. However it is possible that such a proposition may have merits that would make such expenditure desirable and beneficial in spite of the depression.

For instance: The Reconstruction Finance Corporation will loan money on long time at a low rate of interest for the construction of municipal improvements.

Hedley needs a sewer system. In fact, it should have had one installed at the same time our waterworks system became a reality. No argument should be needed as to its benefits in health, cleanliness, comforts, etc.

While not official, we understand the requirements to be as follows: One hundred connections signed up, at a cost of \$1.50 per month.

We are now paying 50c per month for only a small part of the benefit we would get in a sewer system, so the added cost to the signers would be only one dollar a month.

In addition to the regular benefits afforded by the system, there is the matter of furnishing work for a goodly number of men in installing same, and the fact that at this time it can be installed at a fraction of the cost that would be charged for the necessary materials and labor in normal times.

Nothing worth while was ever accomplished without cost. If this town ever has the improvements it needs, the citizens of this town will have to pay them and pay for them. Why not do this thing, which should have been done long ago, at much less cost than at any other time in our history, and provide work for people who have never needed it so greatly as they need it right now.

Let's think it over.

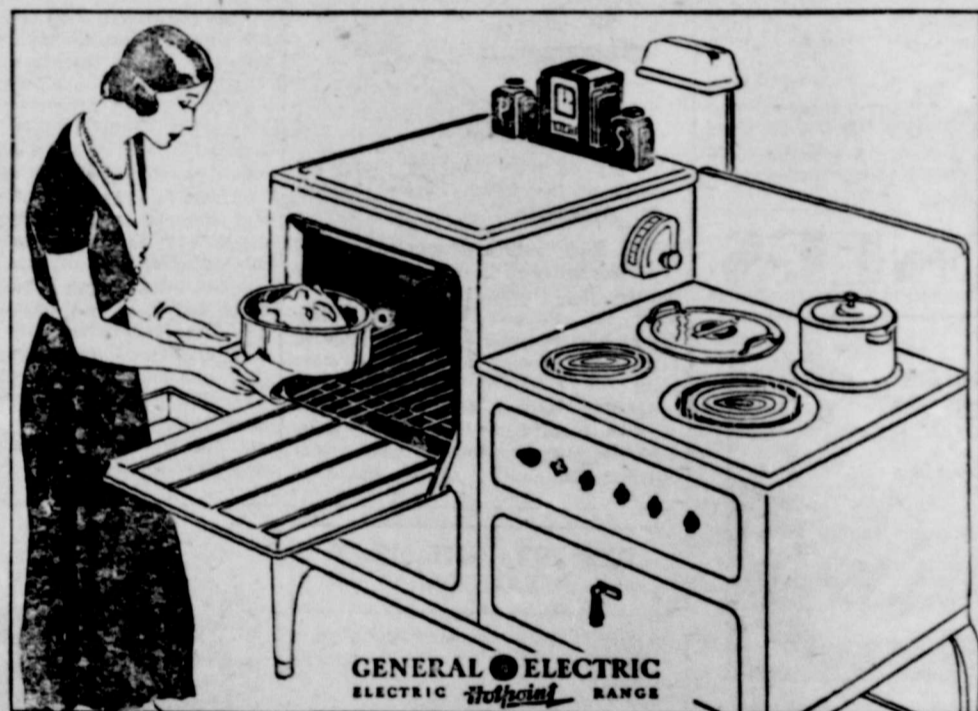

English Land Held by Lincoln Family

Antiquarian research has unearthed an interesting reminder of what is believed to be a link in the early history in England of Abraham Lincoln's family.

A record collated by J. E. Ansell of the Society of Genealogists shows that one Abraham Lincoln was a holder of land in Norfolk in the early part of the Eighteenth century. This record as published in the Times tells how in 1726 Abraham Lincoln and Sara, his wife, were joint venders with Isaac Lincoln and Edward Rush and Lydia, his wife, of nine acres of land in the parishes of Garboldisham and Aldeby, Norfolk, to one Sir Edmund Bacon.—Exchange.
