Application for War Ration Book Number One should be made for every individual on Monday, May 4, 1942. Applications will be taken in the auditorium of the Hedley High School between the hours of 8 a. m. and 5 p. m. A member of a family unit who is over 18 years of age may apply for every member of the family. Hedley School authorities are asking that all persons apply on Monday, May 4, so that only one day of school will be lost. In the event it is impossible to apply on Monday, applications will be taken between 4 and 5 p. m. on May 5, 6 and 7.

It should be remembered that every person should have War Ration Book Number One because the stamps may be used in the rationing of commodities other than sugar.

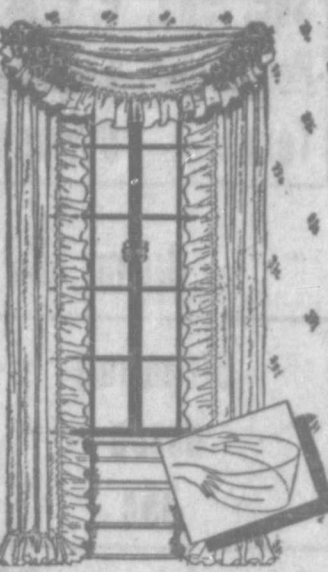

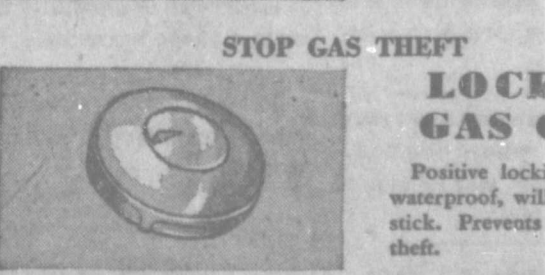
