1943 Record Breaking Tax Measure Clears Final Congressional Hurdle; United Nations Hunt Subs Off Africa; U. S. Objective: a 'Young Man's Army'

TAXES: Set a Record

Everybody agreed that it was coming but when the record breaking 1943 tax bill cleared the final congressional hurdle...

The treasury estimated that federal revenues would be increased by just under seven billion dollars—\$6,881,830,000, to be exact.

Normal income tax rates were stepped up from 4 to 6 per cent.

Surtaxes which formerly ranged from 6 to 77 per cent have now been set at from 13 to 82 per cent.

A new tax—called the 'Victory tax'—was imposed on all income larger than \$624 per year.

Personal income tax exemptions were reduced from \$1,500 to \$1,200 for married persons and from \$750 to \$500 for single persons.

There are many other provisions to the bill but these were the ones which John Q. Citizen was going to feel most directly.

Financial experts reasoned that direct taxes would not be raised any higher even though the U. S. war needs become more urgent.

PROMPT ACTION: On 18-19 Draft Bill

Prompt senate and house action keyed legislative moves to draft 18 and 19-year-old men...

Principal difference in the house and senate bill evolved around the "draft priority" system.

Maj. Gen. Lewis B. Hershey, selective service director, opposed the measure. He stated that it would upset schedules until December 1...

A second difference in the bills involved the deferment of youths to complete educational courses.

The two measures agreed in making liable for the draft men formerly deferred in class 4-F because of convictions for "dry law" violations...

RUSSIA: Desperate Nazis

Hitler seemed to have forgotten his pre-winter policy of consolidation and defense as he continued his smashing drive along the banks of the Volga.

The Soviet army announced that 6,000 German troops had been killed in one day's action on the Stalingrad front.

Battles of local significance were reported northwest of Stalingrad, where a Soviet relief army was moving toward the city.

Major battles also continued in the Black sea area southeast of Novorossisk, where the enemy broke through to a highway.

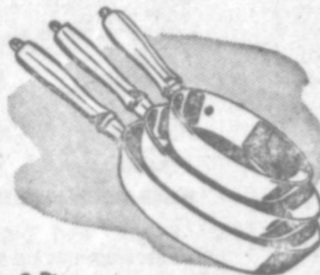

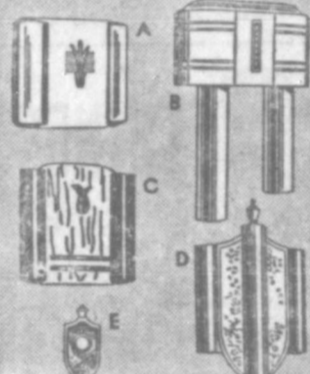

AFTER all these years something new bobs up in the way of what Hollywood calls a "world premier." On October 10, RKO theaters throughout the country will present "Here We Go Again," the new Fibber McGee and Molly picture, the cast of which includes Edgar Bergen and Charlie McCarthy, Ginny Simms and the Great Gildersleeve. The hour is 9:30 a. m. The admission prices everywhere will be 35 cents for adults, 25 cents for children. The novel feature is that adults will be admitted only if accompanied by children!

Metro did all right with its most recent opening. "The War Against Mrs. Hadley" made its bow in Washington, D. C., and admission was by war bond only—the prices being scaled from \$25 to \$25,000 per seat, and all seats being reserved.

The film reveals the way in which Axis espionage activity was apparently permitted to go unchecked for a time, in order to amass as complete a file of evidence as possible against the day when the guilty ones were to be rounded up.

Few radio programs have attracted the attention and praise that have come to the Norman Corwin series "An American in England," broadcast over CBS from London. Corwin has been hailed as "the greatest American morale builder because he has pointed out the best in two great peoples."

## PREPAREDNESS

by the AMERICAN RED CROSS

ASSISTANCE to members of the nation's fighting forces and their dependents is the primary duty of the Red Cross.

This obligation is set forth in the charter granted the American Red Cross by congress in 1905, and in the army and navy regulations. It is also stated in the present selective service regulations, which require all draft boards to refer questions concerning the welfare of selectees and their dependents after induction to the Red Cross.

Red Cross help to service men and their dependents takes two forms: In every army camp and with every American fighting unit anywhere a Red Cross field director is on the job. His duty is to help the service man with his problems and relieve him of worry over them.

In nearly every county in the United States is a local Red Cross chapter, with a home service worker. Its job is to help the service man's dependents, and relieve them, too, of worry and need.

Assistance to members of the armed forces may take the form of advising them or their dependents on government life insurance, allotments or pensions, and of helping them in filling out the necessary application forms.

The Red Cross may even help members of the service man's family in getting employment, emergency medical treatment, or it may grant them money to tide the family over until an allotment is actually received from the government.

The Red Cross is also the "Mr. Fixit" for the service man whenever he may be, whether on duty or on leave. It assists in getting extension of furloughs when necessary, and in making loans or other arrangements for visits home in cases of serious illness or death in the family.

More than 2,500 field directors with the armed forces, and 3,735 Red Cross chapters throughout the nation stand ready to help and advise service men and their dependents.

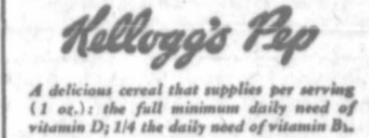

## PREPAREDNESS

by the AMERICAN RED CROSS

SO THAT America will be well prepared on the home front, the American Red Cross has set a goal of one person in every home to be trained in home nursing.

Red Cross home nursing courses teach simple methods of keeping the family well, and how to care for its members in sickness. The students—mostly women, many men and large numbers of young people—are also taught to recognize symptoms in the early stages.

So far in this war, more than 90 per cent of the civilian casualties have not been hospitalized. Instead they have been given first aid and whatever emergency treatment was necessary and then sent home.

A large portion of such civilian war casualties have required home nursing care which, due to the shortage of nurses, had to be provided by members of the family. To enable every family to provide home care for the sick, whether due to enemy action or natural causes, immediately after the attack on Pearl Harbor, the Red Cross started a plan to teach home nursing to every family.

Since our entry into the war, more than 500,000 men and women in nearly every county in the United States have completed their home nursing course. Another quarter of a million are now taking the course in more than 3,000 Red Cross chapters.

Any group of 20 or more can form a home nursing class by agreeing on a time and place of meeting. After being notified, the county Red Cross chapter will then appoint a graduate nurse instructor.

## AROUND THE HOUSE

The best way to get even distribution of heat in a room is to run a small fan.
