



A small group of astronomers within the International Astronomical Union has been considering reclassing Pluto as either a "Trans-Neptune Object," or simply as a "minor planet."

It was exactly 69 years ago the date of this writing, February 18, 1930, that 24-year-old Clyde W. Tombaugh, discovered the Pluto, the planet farthest from the sun. It was hailed as "the greatest astronomical achievement since the can accomplish much." discovery of Neptune in 1846.






