## Recommendations for Old Settlers Picnic Home Canning for 1949

### Safe Methods for Canning Black-eye Peas at Home

#### Hot Pack Method:

Wash peas. Precook by covering with boiling water and bringing to a rolling boil. Drain. Place in clean, hot glass jars or tin cans. Add fresh boiling water to  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch from top of jars and  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch from tops of tin cans. Work out bubbles with a knife blade. Wipe mouth of containers with clean damp cloth. Seal. Place in hot pressure canner containing 1 to 2 inches of boiling water. After steam appears, allow 10 minutes steaming period, then close petcock and bring pressure to 10 pounds pressure for hot pack method are:

Glass jars: pints, 35 minutes  
quarts, 40 minutes

Tin Cans: No. 2, 30 minutes  
No. 3, 35 minutes

At end of processing time turn out fire or remove canner from the fire. When jars are used, leave the petcock closed until the gauge returns to zero. Cool jars away from drafts. When tin cans are used, release pressure at end of processing time. Cool tin cans by moving about in container of cold water.

#### Cold Pack Method:

For use only with glass jars with two piece metal closures to assure adequate venting. Wash peas. Place without precooking in clean hot glass jars and continue as for hot pack. Recommended processing periods at 10 pounds pressure for the cold pack method are:

Glass jars: pints, 35 minutes  
quarts, 40 minutes

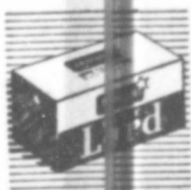

**TESTED MEAT RECIPES** Western Ranch **MEAT LOAF**

2 lb. ground beef  
1 medium onion  
1/2 cup diced celery  
1/2 cup lard  
1/2 cup diced green pepper  
1 tablespoon salt

3 eggs  
3 cups soft bread crumbs  
1/2 cup water  
1/2 cup tomato juice  
2 tablespoons melted butter or margarine

Chop onion. Brown onion and celery in lard. Combine with green pepper, salt, eggs, bread crumbs and water to make a dressing. Add half of the dressing (1 1/2 cups) to the meat, mixing well. Put out half the meat mixture in a two-quart loaf pan. Cover with remaining dressing, then top with remaining meat mixture. Bake in a moderate oven (350° F.) 1 1/2 hours. Bake with tomato juice and butter or margarine to keep loaf moist. Serves 8.
