## March of Dimes

One attack of polio may not mean immunity for life, it was revealed today by Mr. Keith Bain, Chairman of the 1950 Donley County March of Dimes.

The Chairman of the March of Dimes organization stated that a recent research report from national headquarters indicates there are at least three kinds of polio virus capable of producing the human disease and that infection with one does not result in resistance to either of the other two.

Prior to the knowledge that three kinds of polio virus exist, Mr. Bain said, physicians had been puzzled by the numerous instances of polio occurring more than once in certain individuals.

"More of these cases," Mr. Bain declared, "are being reported by physicians. Recognition of the three different polio viruses now offers a sound scientific explanation for these tragic multiple attacks."

## Allen Harp Announces Candidacy for Office of District Attorney

Allen Harp, recently appointed district attorney by Allan Shivers, governor, to serve the unexpired term of Leonard King who resigned for reasons of health, today authorized the Informer to announce his candidacy for the office subject to the action of the Democratic primaries this summer.

At the time of receiving his appointment as District Attorney, Harp had served Childress County as County Attorney for more than two years and is actively engaged in the private practice of law.

Harp served this district as official court reporter for a period of six years, having been appointed to the job by Judge A. S. Moss in August, 1941, and later served under Judge Luther Gribble. Harp spent two years of the six on leave of absence for military duty.

During the recent war, he served both as a private in the army and a junior officer in the navy, including overseas duty as a gunnery officer.

Harp served the 121st legislative district, Childress, Hall, Cottle and Motley counties, as State Representative during 1939 and 1941. Previous to this service, he taught school in our rural schools for several years.

Born in the Kirkland community of Childress County, Harp maintained his residence in the area all of his life. He graduated from Abilene Christian College in 1937, receiving a bachelor of science degree.

"I shall work ardently to perform the duties of District Attorney and would appreciate very much the privilege of being elected to this office by the people of this district," Harp stated.

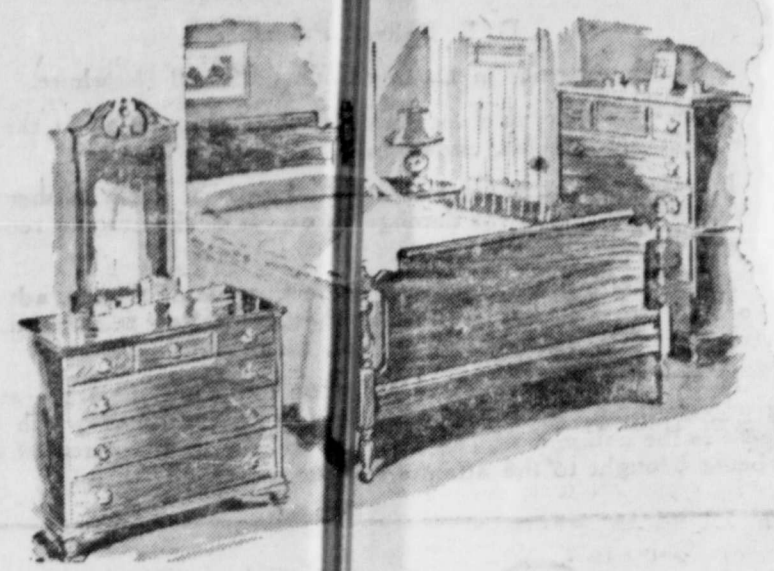

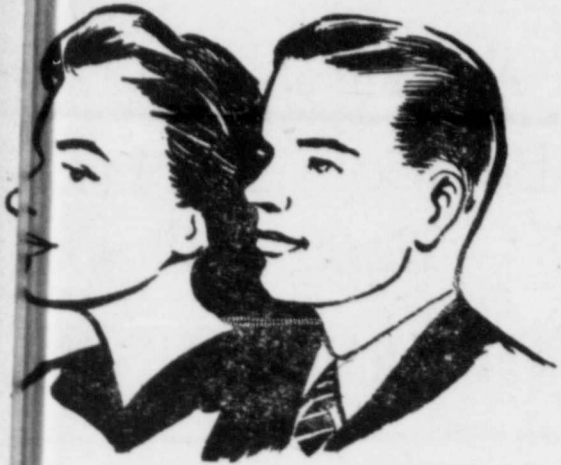
