Diphtheria Report

Below is the Texas State weekly report concerning diphtheria for the week ending Jan 21, 1950 as reported by Dr. Geo. Cox, State Health Officer.

During the past two weeks 64 cases of Diphtheria have been reported. Ten of these cases were reported from one county in West Texas where there was a focal epidemic of this disease in one community.

Although Diphtheria can be prevented by early immunization of the infant, approximately one thousand cases of this disease are reported annually in Texas.

It is the responsibility of the public health officials and physicians to recommend and insist upon immunization of all babies against Diphtheria during the early months of life. Follow-up Schick tests should be done and reimmunization if indicated during the pre-school years. A program of this type would do much toward eliminating Diphtheria in the State.
