Bob Perin, Assistant to the Director, Scouting Services, Boy Scouts of America, with his trunkload of adventure will be in Shamrock, February 16, to bring to the Scouters (Scautmasters, Troop Committeemen and Explorer Advisors) of the Southern District of the Adobe Walls Area Council, new ideas and skills in the outdoor adventures of the Scouting P.ogram. While in Shamrock, Mr. Perin will work with the Training men of the Southern District, and with the Chmmissioners as well as Troop and Explorer Leaders.

The "Trunk Load of Adventure' that Bob packs around the country with him is a result of years of outdoor experience and adventure in his own lite. His early life was spent on a ranch high in the mountains of Utah near Bryce Canyon. During his high school days, he worked as a wrangler at the Grand Canyon and Zion National Parks, guiding Dudes and visitors through the many trails of these great natural wonderlands.

After leaving the University of New Mexico, Mr. Perin went to live with the Mescalero Apache Indians during which time he had opportunity to learn the ways of the Indian in hunting and wood craft. This interest in the Indian people later led him to do some work with the University of New Mexico at the Indian ruins at Chaco Canyon and Jemez Springs where the University has two Archeological Schools.
