Wheat Meeting

Mr. Holly Wood and Lee Shaller attended the organization meeting of the Wheat Producers Association of Armstrong county, Monday night in the High School Auditorium at Claude. They had a good turnout considering the weather, possibly 45, 30 of whom were qualified voters.

The president of the Armstrong County Farm Bureau expressed his anticipation of having an auditorium full of wheat farmers. He extended his apologies to Mr. Buckles and Mr. Kendrick, vice president and secretary-treasurer of The Texas Wheat Producers Association, for not having the audience he expected, before turning the meeting over to them.

Mr. Buckles did a very good job, explaining the purpose of this organization, and assuring us that no drastic steps would be taken without having had due consideration from every angle.

Mr. Kendrick explained the procedure they had in mind to collect the 1/4 cent per bushel was at the elevators, and that some of the major elevator companies were willing to contribute financially.

Contributions have been refused to date because the organization is yet incomplete. They are expecting to gain momentum after the state meeting in Amarillo, (Herring Hotel March 20th.) At this time it will be the duty of each county president to take part in the directing of the state affairs.

After having discussed some of the possibilities of the organization, the floor was returned to the chairman and officials were elected.

The President announced that he would be glad to entertain any suggestions worthy of presentation to the state board of directors. Mr. Carl Kuper, Mr. Buckles and Mr. Kenneth Kendrick will be at the Donley and Gray county wheat meeting Wednesday, March 15th, at 2:30 p. m. in the V. F. W. Hall in Groom, if possible.
