## Lions Club to Sponsor Signs

Members of the Lions club completed arrangements Wednesday to sponsor two huge "Scotch lite" welcome signs to be erected on Highway 287 on each approach to Hedley, according to C. L. Johnson, president of the club.

The organization completed details of the sponsorship of the project and work will begin at once of securing locations, advertising and art work.

The center one third of the boards, which are 36 feet long, will carry a warm welcome to the motorists and tourists to Hedley from the Lions Club. Lettering will be in "Scotch lite" which is colorful and radiant both day and night, reflecting in its natural color at night by car light.

In the background there will be a pictorial showing of the resources of the area; a picture will be painted showing cotton and cattle.

Individual panels, size 5 1/2 feet by 3 1/2 feet, checkerboarded in colors on each side of the center, will be sold to local merchants on a four year contract, giving them an option for an additional two years renewal sponsorship of the project. Firm names can be had in "Scotch lite" by special arrangement. Rates are to be in line with plain painted or poster board advertising. The entire face of the boards will be in metal and heavy durable timber will be used to construct these boards.

## Burk for Congress

Amarillo, March 14—E. T. Burk, widely-known businessman is the surprise candidate in the 10th district congressional race. Since the time of his announcement as a candidate in the special election for the unexpired term of Congressman Gene Worley and in the July Democratic primary for the full two-year term, Burk has been flooded with letters from all over the Panhandle.

These letters, coming from business friends and customers, pledge all out support for the businessman in the congressional race.

Until he sold out to his children last December, Burk operated the Amarillo Furniture Company for years. He has been a Panhandle businessman for 23 years.

Publication of Burk's Platform (see advertisement in this issue) has brought such a tremendous response that he is considered the leading contender in the congressional race.

"This is one time the citizens can vote for someone who isn't in politics, who seeks no political career and who doesn't want a public office for the paycheck," Burk said, after a busy day of answering letters. "I want no political career. I've had my career in business-competitive business. I do not need the government paycheck for a living. Through years of hard work in business, I have saved my money -- not a great deal, but enough to make a congressional race and to live. My only desire is to serve the people of this district. 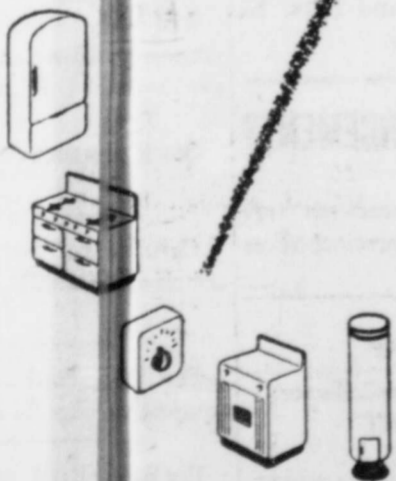

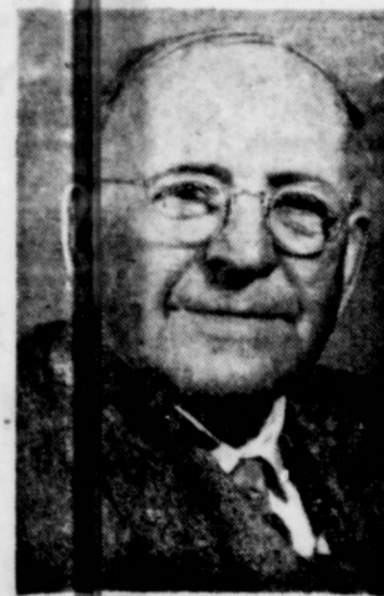

**BOWLEGS**—All the bowed legs in Texas are not on cowboys. A good many arched shanks are on persons who straddle political fences.

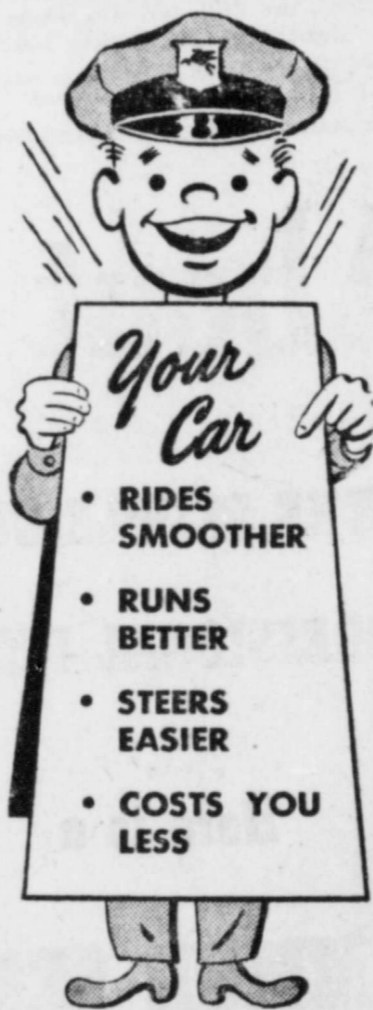
