Some 254 votes were cast in Saturday's primary election here, with Walter Rogers leading slightly in the Congressional race, by a margin of 78 votes to 74 for Blake Timmons, who, however, fell down over the Panhandle as a whole. Altavene Clark was the leading candidate, as expected, with Rogers second, LeRoy LaMaster a surprisingly good third and Timmons fourth.

Only two races were contested in Donley county, Guy Wright defeating Bert Smith for sheriff and Mrs. A. G. Lane winning over Mrs. Tom Crabtree for county treasurer. Re-elected without opposition were Judge W. J. Williams, Attorney R. Y. King, Clerk Walker Lane, Commissioner F. M. Murray and Justice of Peace Frank Kendall.

Allen Harp of Chidress, the incumbent, defeated W. M. Tucker, of Wellington for district attorney and Grainger McIlhenny of Wheeler was re-elected state representative.

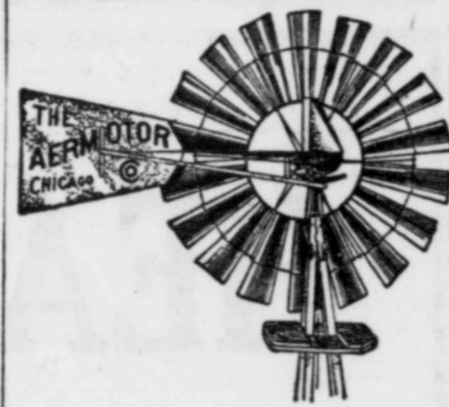

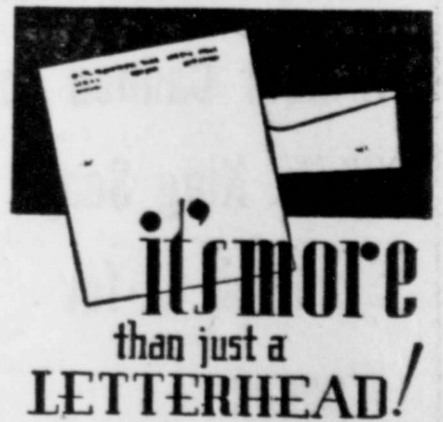
